The school is the first in South India to offer Doctoral Degree, Master's Degree, Bachelor's degree and Diploma in Social Work. India Today - MDRA and OUTLOOK-ICARE Survey of Best Social Work Colleges 2022 ranking rated the Social Work Programme of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences as second best in Pan India.











