

Q& A- REGARDING FYUGP IN RCSS

1. What is Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP)?

FYUGP means an undergraduate programme in a higher education scenario incorporating the reforms suggested by the UGC- National Education Policy- 2020. The bachelor's degree is now an honours program with 4 years of study.

2. How does FYUGP differ from a three-year degree programme?

In a three-year degree programme, the student has to specialize in one discipline. The four-year undergraduate programme offers specialization in multiple fields not related to the degree's concentration.

3. What are the benefits of FYUGP?

The main benefit of FYUGP is the redesigned UG curriculum which ensures multidisciplinary and holistic education that is relevant, effective, and responsive to the evolving needs of students, employers and society at large.

4. What is the course structure of the new FYUGP curriculum?

A multi-disciplinary programme of 4 years duration with exit in the third year with a graduate degree and exit in the 4th year with an honours degree/honours degree with research.

5. What is the speciality of the 4th year in the four-year UG programme?

A student chooses a 3-year bachelor's degree offered honours (if the student acquired the required number of credits and a capstone project with 8 credits) or honours with research(Required number of credits plus research projects/ dissertation of 12 credits).

6. What are the components of FYUGP?

In the broad-based FYUGP curriculum, the core component consisting of the major discipline and a minor/allied discipline/vocational discipline

contributes to 70% credits. The multidisciplinary component accounts for the remaining 30% of the credits.

7. How a student is evaluated in FYUGP?

Student assessment in FYUGP is a combination of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) 30% and End Semester Evaluation(ese) 70%.

8. What is an academic bank of credit and its merits?

It is a system that allows students in higher education to accumulate, store and transfer academic credits earned from various courses and institutions in one account. Each student will get an ABC ID.

9. Can a student get a PG in one year after he/ she completes FYUGP?

Students with a four-year undergraduate honours with research can embark on one- year master’s degree. Those students can complete his/ her master's in one year.

10. What will be the eligibility criteria for getting admission for FYUGP in RCSS?

Successful completion of the examination conducted by the board/ university at the +2 level of schooling or its equivalent is the mandatory requirement. For the student intake, the RCSS is following the eligibility criteria specified by the parent university(MG University).

12. How does a student get admission to RCSS for FYUGP?

All programmes under FYUGP in RCSS are self-financing. The student shall be admitted and enrolled in respective programmes based on the availability of the allotted seats. The candidates seeking admission to Rajagiri can submit their application online with all required documents, once the admission portal is open. For any clarification, you can contact the admission cell over the phone or through the email that is given on the college website.

13. Do Rajagiri collaborate with other agencies for admission?

No, Rajagiri does the admission entirely through the Rajagiri admission cell. Kindly refrain from approaching other agents to secure admission to Rajagiri.

14. How do the students pay their fees?

Students who get admission to a programme in RCSS should pay Year-wise course payment (2 semesters together) and it is compulsory. Students are strictly prohibited from using mobile phones during class hours inside the college building, however, they can use mobile phones during the lunch break. A fine of Rs 500 will be charged for the infringement of rules.

21. What is the normal college timing of RCSS students? The working day for the college starts at 9.00 am and closes at 4.00 pm. Lunch break is from 12.40 pm to 1.30 pm. Working days are from Monday to Saturday except the second Saturday.
