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

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) is one among the few colleges in the state of Kerala which has been granted autonomous status by University Grants Commission, with effect from June 1, 2014. The autonomous status helps the college to prescribe its own relevant programmes, courses of study and syllabi, design student focused wide choices of courses, to update syllabus periodically and conduct examinations and notify results in a timely manner. The college was given the status of "College with Potential for Excellence" by University Grants Commission in 2016.

The motto of the College is "Relentlessly Towards Excellence" and this is achieved by strict measures of quality management in pedagogy, learning resources, training and infrastructural support.

The college is located in two sprawling campuses in Kochi- the Hill Campus at Kalamassery and the Valley Campus at Kakkanad. The Hill Campus houses the Department of Social Work, Department of Computer Science, Department of Library and Information Science, Department of Commerce, Department of Business Administration and Department of Psychology. The Department of Social Work offers Master of Social Work (MSW), Bachelor of Social Work (BSW), Post Graduate Diploma in Clinical Social Work and Counselling Practice (PGDCSW) and PhD in Social Work. The Department of Computer Science offers Master of Computer Application (MCA) and MSc Computer Science (Data Analytics). The Department of Commerce offers Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) Model 1 Computer Application, Model 1-Finance & Taxation and Model 2 - Finance & Taxation. The Department of Business Administration offers Bachelor of Psychology (B.Sc. Psy.) and Master of Psychology (MSc. Psy).

The Valley Campus houses the School of Management. The School of Management offers Ph.D in Management, the two year full time Master of Business Administration (MBA) and Master in Human Resource Management (MHRM) programmes.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) has been accredited with the highest score A++ with CGPA 3.83/4.00 in March 2021

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), has its position set high for all the four cycles of NAAC accreditations. In the year 2000, RCSS was accredited with FIVE STAR status by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Govt.of India for the first time. The college was re-accredited during 2007with' A+' status and during 2013 with 'A' grade with CGPA of 3.70 on a 4-point scale for the third period. Taking note of the consecutive high achievement, NAAC has extended the period of validity of the present status for two or more years up to March, 2020. Finally *the fourth cycle of NAAC re-accreditation, the Rajagiri College of Social Science (Autonomous) has accredited with A++ grade and 3.83 grade-point average on a 4-point scale on 16th March 2021 valid up to 13th March 2028.*

The process of fourth cycle reaccreditation started with IIQA submission on 18th January 2020. The IIQA was accepted on 19th February 2020. Following that the SSR report submitted on 11th June 2020. The NAAC Peer team visited the College on 4th and 5th March 2021.

Rajagiri Finance Museum



The Museum includes a fabulous collection of coins, from the time of Magadha when Chanakya spoke about Arthashasthra, coins associated with the era of Christ, ancient Grece, ancient Chera, Chola and Pandya Dynasties, Cochin State, Travancore State and coins of British India, which were in common circulation during the past in the Deccan. The museum includes artefacts and documents related to finance, measurements, slavery, trade and commerce. There are Writing Instruments and Ink Wells (Pots) too.

RAJAGIRI RESPONSE TO COVID-19

(1st April 2020 to 31st March 2021)

During this pandemic situation, the role of Social Work Academic Institutions and NGOs were very important in providing psycho-social support, tele-counselling and distribution of health and provision of kits etc. The Rajagiri College Management, Rajagiri outREACH Staff, Faculty, Non-teaching Staff, Alumni, Students, NSS Volunteers of College had jointly taken initiatives to serve the needy people and the community as a whole during the COVID-19 pandemic situation.

During the COVID-19 lockdown period, from March 23, 2020 to May 2020, Rajagiri college and Rajagiri outreach, under the leadership team, Dr. Fr. Jose Kuriedath CMI, Provincial, Rev. Dr. Mathew Vattathara CMI - Director, Rev. Dr. Saju M D CMI - Associate Director & Vice Principal, Dr. Binoy Joseph - Principal, Rev. Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI - Assistant Director, Rev. Fr. Rintle MathewCMI - Administrator, Mrs. Meena Kuruvilla - Project Director, has undertaken safe measures and engaged in various activities providing assistance to the needy and struggling community with the timely assistance from sponsors, well-wishers, individuals, staff, students and alumni.

In response to COVID-19 pandemic, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) had distributed 2679 Food and Health Provision Kits in 1 Corporation, 5 Municipalities, and 15 Panchayats of Ernakulam District. These kits were distributed with the support of Local Self Governments, District Administration, Labour Department, Tribal, Revenueand Health Department. The Food items include Rice, Whole wheat Atta, Biscuit, Chilly Powder, Coriander Powder, Liberty Sunflower Oil, Salt, Dal, Tea Powder, Sugar, Big Onions, Potatoes and Health Provision, COVID-19 Relief Kits (including Sanitizer, Soaps, Masks, Hindi Pamphlet on prevention of COVID-19). The food and Health Provision Kits were distributed to 2000 Guest Workers residing in Ernakulam District and Lactogen & Cerelac were distributed to the children of **121 families** of Guest Workers with the support of ITC Rural Development Trust, Kolkata. Food and Health Provision Kits also distributed to 65 students' families (from poor socio economic background) of Girls High School, Ernakulam, 100 tribal families of Kuttampuzha Tribal Development Project, 110 needy Staff of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, 45 HIV Affected & Infected Families, 133 Auto rickshaw drivers from the neighbourhood of Rajagiri College, 6 families from poor background at Vallarpadam, Ernakulam District and 220 Fishermen families of Chellanam (requested by the District Collector of Ernakulam District).

100000 masks were purchased and distributed by the college with the support of Rajagiri outREACH and other live labs, to the public during lockdown for the prevention of COVID-19 infection. The distribution took place among neighbourhood residents, neighbourhood ration shop, migrants, fishermen, students' from poor socio economic families, tribal families, auto rickshaw drivers, The needy Staff of the college, HIV infected and affected families, Elderly citizens. In association with Malayala Manorama daily, 92000 masks were distributed on July 05, 2020 through newspaper agents to Perumbavoor, Kolencherry, Kothamangalam, Muvattupuzha, Pothanikad, Kuttampuzha, Njarackal, Vypin, etc. The masks and provision kits were also distributed as part of **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan implementing projects at Vazhakulam and Keezhamadu** Panchayats.

1000 books, 800 pens and 9 TVs were distributed to the Kuttampuzha Panchayat tribal students referred by Tribal Development Department, Ernakulam. Study materials like Note Books and Furniture (Cot, Table & Chairs) were distributed to 12 children under Child Sponsorship Scheme. 150 Saplings were distributed to the sponsorship students and Kalamassery community people as part of observation of Environment Day and encouraged the students to develop the skills on agriculture during COVID-19 period. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Rajagiri outREACH with the support of Rotary Club, Kalamassery had shortlisted 90 needy women of Ernakulam District and distributed sewing machines during the COVID-19 lockdown period to overcome their financial crisis. The distribution took place in neighbourhood residences of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences ,neighbourhood ration shop, migrants, fishermen, students' from poor socio economic families, tribal families, auto rickshaw drivers, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences needy Staff, HIV infected and affected families, Elderly citizens.

Rajagiri outREACH staff distributed 1000 masks through the nearest ration shop on 11.05.2020.

In association with Malayala Manorama daily, 92000 masks were distributed on July 05, 2020 through newspaper agents to Perumbavoor, Kolencherry, Kothamangalam, Muvattupuzha, Pothanikad, Kuttampuzha, Njarackal, Vypin, etc. The masks were also distributed as part of the college] Unnat Bharat Abhiyan implementing projects at Vazhakulam and Keezhamadu Panchayats.

Institutional Infrastructure / facility provided by Rajagiri College of Social Sciences to combat COVID-19

COVID WARRIORS

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), stepped forward in this moment of crisis, joining hands with the government bodies to serve the societal cause.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences Boy's Hostel (Assumption Hostel) was converted to COVID-19 Care Centre Short Stay Home and Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI, Assistant Director of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, was appointed as the Management Coordinator, vide order No.A1-20/20 Dated 29.04.2020 issued by Mr. Snehil Kumar Singh IAS, Incident Commander and Sub Divisional Magistrate. Later the COVID Short Stay Home was converted into First Line Treatment Centre (FLTC). A total of 70 single rooms with attached bathrooms available at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences were given as COVID-19 First Line Treatment Centre. Apart from infrastructure facilities, electricity, water and free security were provided. The boys' hostel block of the college was thus set aside for 8 months free of cost for COVID-19 relief activities.

Initially, it began functioning as the COVID-19 Care Centre Short Stay Home and later on converted to First Line Treatment Centre (FLTC) in Ernakulam district, nursing about 1200 people who were quarantined and 1907 COVID-19 positive cases were treated at the FLTC at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences with the support of Health Department, Kalamassery Municipality and District Administration, Ernakulam. The objective of the short stay home is to keep the people in quarantine and also to provide facilities to ensure that the chance of spread can be contained. Rajagiri outREACH Staff had supported in the arrangement of infrastructure facilities at the FLTC.

It is the collective effort of 32 health workers that has helped to treat and cure so many COVID-19 victims ranging from 7 days to 95 years age group. It is the heroic intervention of the medical staff under the leadership of Dr. Cyril G. Cherian, Medical Officer in charge, Dr. Shaheer Backer, Asst. Nodal Officer, Dr. Nithin R., Dr. Ashley Joseph (Medical Officers) that made this a historic landmark. We, at Rajagiri, salute all our COVID warriors for their selfless service toward the wellbeing of our society.

OFFICE OF EXAMINATION

Office of Examinations (RCSS) was established in the year 2014 as a statutory body constituted in accordance with the UGC guidelines for autonomous colleges. The department is headed by the Controller of Examinations (CoE), reporting to the Principal and is assisted by various officials in the department. The prime responsibility of the Office of Examinations is to plan and conduct all examinations in a fair, transparent and systematic manner as per the Examinations Calendar prepared at the beginning of each academic year.

The examination procedures are in accordance with the guidelines given in the approved Examination Manual and also confirming to the guidelines provided by M G University and UGC from time to time. The office has a fully automated facility with necessary infrastructure for generating hall tickets question papers, conducting evaluation work, consolidation of results and printing of mark lists and other relevant confidential documents.

The office gives the highest priority to the efficient and effective execution of examination policy for the benefit of the entire student community. All genuine requests of students with regard to examinations are promptly attended to and resolved on a continuous basis. The Office of Examinations functions in both Valley campus and Hill campus.

Introduction

The academic year 2020-21 presented unprecedented challenges for RCSS while conducting End semester examinations of UG and PG programmes due to the continuing disturbances from Covid 19 related restrictions. The examinations were abruptly discontinued from 19.04.2021 based on Government orders. Soon after the first round of lock down was called off, high priority was given for completing the examinations of final semester PG and UG programmes. This was to help students to apply for higher studies and also for joining companies where they are placed through campus recruitment.

Through the second cycle, the pending examinations of final semester PG and UG programmes were completed on 27 July 2021. A total of 1749 students across 15 programmes had written the year end examinations from both PG and UG programmes. 1105 question papers were generated through the automated question paper generation software, ensuring highest level of confidentiality and accuracy in the process. All departments were able to successfully conduct centralized valuation camps and in certain cases home valuation to mitigate the challenges of Covid related travel restrictions for answer script valuation under the able leadership of respective Chairmen of Board of Studies. The average number of days taken to declare the result after the last date of examination was 38 days.

Average pass percentage of final year students of all Programmes is 89.2%.







Examination Monitoring Task Force comprising of senior faculty members of the College ensured all possible preventive mechanisms to deal with examination related malpractices are in place. Well established healthy practices are implemented to deal with examination related malpractices by the team. Various sessions for teachers and students were conducted to sensitise the need for fairness in Examinations. Only one case of exam related malpractice was reported in the current academic year. Proper enquiry was conducted in the reported case and appropriate decision was taken and communicated to the student. The process strictly followed all procedures laid down in Examination manual ensuring principles of natural justice are strictly adhered.

Concessions for Divyangjan Students

Divyangjan (Differently Abled) candidates, who appear for examination are allowed certain concessions such as services of scribes at the examination, extra time to complete the examination, grace marks etc. depending on the degree and nature of disability of the candidates subject to such norms as prescribed by the Mahatma Gandhi University from time to time. Candidates eligible for such concession under any one of the categories shall apply to the CoE in the prescribed format for claiming the concessions for which they are eligible according to the prescribed rules. The applications should be submitted to the Controller of Examinations, one month before the commencement of the Examinations duly recommended by the HOD. OFFICE OF PLACEMENT

RCSS recognizes the placement of its graduates as one of the major objectives of its programmes and proactively creates greater placement opportunities. The Rajagiri Placement Cell, an integral part of the Office of Corporate Relations (OCR), coordinates final placements, summer internships, industry interactions, association with professional bodies and career support services for the students. Rajagiri placement cell functions in both campuses.

OCR conducts its activities through the Director and other Executives, who are assisted by a placement committee chosen from the students. The primary responsibilities of the committee include supporting programmes such as career counseling and pre-placement training for students, long term activities such as promoting relations with the recruiters, working on a positioning strategy for short term activities such as interfacing with relevant faculty to frame placement related policies, planning and executing the summer and final placements.

Through our associates, students are given the unique opportunity to take part in all their regular activities viz; Management Conventions, Lecture Meetings & Panel Discussions, Award ceremonies, Women's /Management Students Forum etc. These activities have been given the much needed impetus through a variety of activities such as Business Quizzes, Business Plans Contests, Industry training programs and HR training & management development programs. These associations help our students to Network with HR professionals, foster entrepreneurship skills, and build potential business relationships and partnerships.

Campus Placement process for the graduating batch of 2020 has concluded by August 2020. While 'Placement' was the major focus for students from MBA, MHRM, MSW, M.Li.Sc and MCA programmes, 'Higher Studies' continued to be the immediate pursuance for UG students and other PG programmes. Due to Covid-19 pandemic and its adverse impact on business, many potential employers have either refrained from hiring or revoked offers they have already made to students.

Stipendiary internship offers during academic year 2019-20 have increased for UG and PG programmes and for the first time, two B.Com students have received full-time job offer through internship which also fetched stipend during the course of internship.

Students who needs special care such as Physically Challenged and SC/ST students were given additional career coaching by faculty from the respective departments. Major focus of those students was to join for higher studies as well as job-oriented coaching to join in the government service and nationalized banks.

2. The Research Institute

The College has established a **Research Institute** in 1972, to spearhead activities related to research and training in the field of social welfare, community development and women empowerment. The roots of the Institute have journeyed across the states of India. Over the decades, the Institute has carried out 146 Research Studies, 4 Action Research Projects, 2 International Consultancy Assignments, 550 Training Programmes, 15 Research Methodology Courses, 8 Tribal Development Projects and 4 Water Supply and Sanitation Projects.

Vision

To be a centre par excellence in Research, Training and Consultancy

Mission

To be a catalyst for Social Change and Development by promoting and pursuing Research, Training and Advocacy.

Research Studies

The Research Institute has undertaken 146 research studies on different socially relevant areas like Women & Children, Health & Nutrition, Senior Citizens, Youth, HIV/AIDS, Evaluation of Projects/Programmes, Need Assessment Surveys, Consumer Satisfaction Surveys, etc. The studies were mainly sponsored by international agencies viz. World Bank, ADB, UNICEF, ILO and Ministries/Departments of the Central and State Governments.

During the year 2020-21, the Institute has been sanctioned two research studies viz. 'Impact of Covid-19 on Persons with Disabilities in Kerala', and 'Evaluation of IRCAs for Addicts in Kerala', by Social Justice Department, Govt. of Kerala.

Impact of Covid-19 on Persons with Disabilities in Kerala

With the outbreak of Covid-19, the persons with disabilities have been facing tougher challenges than in regular times. They are exposed in many ways to the crisis such as struggles in accessing support services, education, income support and economic empowerment, rehabilitation and assistive devices. There are very legitimate COVID related health concerns specific to persons with disabilities – particularly those with physical disabilities that affect the immune system, lung function or other related factors that can put them at higher risk for serious complications. It is in this context, the Social Justice Department; Govt. of Kerala has decided to conduct a research study titled "Impact of COVID – 19 on the Persons with Disabilities in Kerala" in association with the Research Institute, RCSS. As per the memorandum of understanding (MoU) signed between the Director, Social

Justice Department, Govt. of Kerala and the Project Director, Research Institute, the study commenced on 4th March, 2021.

Evaluation of Integrated Rehabilitation Centres for Addicts in Kerala

There are a number of Integrated Rehabilitation Centres for Addicts (IRCAs) being run by the State Government and Voluntary Organizations, functioning in the state of Kerala for identification, treatment, education, after-care, rehabilitation, and social reintegration of addicts. The Social Justice Department, Govt. of Kerala is intended to evaluate the functioning of IRCAs in the state in order to develop a quality model of IRCAs which could deliver services at a minimum standard. Accordingly, the Research Institute, RCSS was being entrusted by the Social Justice Department with the task of conducting performance assessment of the selected IRCAs in the state. As per the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the Director, Social Justice Department, Govt. of Kerala and the Project Director, Research Institute, the study commenced on 27th March 2021.

Action Research Projects

With a vision that research should lead to action, the Institute augmented its spectrum of activities to action research. So far, the Institute has successfully completed 5 Action Research Projects - Income Generation Projects for Tribal Women and Water Supply and Sanitation projects (Jalanidhi) for the Rural Communities.

Water Supply and Sanitation Projects (Jalanidhi)

Jalanidhi- a World Bank assisted rural water supply and sanitation project of Govt. of Kerala, is not just a water supply project, rather it is a tool for community development, akin to the ripples that increasingly reach outwards when the still and calm surface of pond is touched. This project is intended to trigger off far reaching changes not merely in water supply but in the very way of life of the rural community. The project has been implemented in the state by Kerala Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (KRWSA).

So far, the Institute has undertaken 4 Jalanidhi projects at (1) Moothedam Grama Panchayat, Malappuram district, (2) Chendamangalam Grama Panchayat, Ernakulam district (3) Vannappuram Grama Panchayat, Idukki district and (4) Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam district.

During the period, the Institute has completed all the activities and GP exit procedures at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat.

Road Safety Advocacy Programmes

The Research Institute has been actively involved in the activities related to education and promotion of road safety in the state of Kerala for nearly two decades. The Institute has associated with a number of agencies including; the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH), Govt. of India, and prominent Corporate bodies in the state like IOCL, HPCL, BPCL, and CIAL in organizing road safety advocacy programmes. The Institute

initiated its association with the Ministry of Shipping, Road Transport and Highways, Govt. of India in 2002 and jointly organized road safety programmes. More than 200 programmes viz. awareness camps, seminars/workshops, eye camps, refresher trainings, training to traffic police, competitions in schools/colleges, mobile exhibitions, street plays, rallies, puppet shows and printing and distribution of IEC materials were carried out in this regard. More than 30,000 participants including students, heavy motor vehicle drivers and other road users actively participated in these awareness programmes.

Road Safety Advocacy Programmes - 2021

In the year 2021 too, the Research Institute has been entrusted with the task of conducting Road Safety Advocacy Programmes in Ernakulam district, by the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH), Govt. of India. The Research Institute is the only agency which was selected for organizing Road Safety Advocacy Programmes in the state of Kerala, among the seven agencies who applied for it.

Awareness Camp for Students

The advocacy programmes for the year 2021 launched on 23rd March 2021 with an awareness camp for college students. Dr.Binoy Joseph, Principal, RCSS inaugurated the camp held at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, wherein Shri.Shaji Madhavan, RTO, Enforcement, Ernakulam delivered the keynote address. Dr. Sr. Lizy P.J, Dean, Academics, RCSS and Dr. Rajeev S.P, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Social Work, spoke on the occasion. Shri. Joseph Cherian, Motor Vehicle Inspector (Enforcement), Ernakulam handled the technical sessions on *'Road Safety'* and *'Road Rules and Regulations'*. Dr. Sr. Sunirose I P, Project Director, Research Institute, coordinated the programme, wherein more than 100 social work students attended.



Training / Workshops

Conduct of Training programmes /workshops/seminars is yet another area, where the Institute has been very active for more than four decades. So far, the Research Institute has organized *550 training programmes* for the various stakeholders including Students,

SC/ST Medical/Engineering Entrants, Family Counselors, Kudumbasree Members, Functionaries of Voluntary Organizations/Corporate Bodies, Probation Officers, Health Professionals, and Road Users. Webinar on Cyber Crimes against Women

Cyber-crimes against women show an alarming growth rate especially during COVID-19. The trend revels that women are highly vulnerable in the cyber space. It affects the victims badly, with severe impacts on their real lives. Often, unawareness of the women about the threats in cyber space makes them victims of cyber crimes. If proper awareness is created, they could function as the torch bearers of change. Awareness Programmes always have a significant role in creating positive changes in the society. It is in this backdrop, the National Commission for Women (NCW), Govt. of India in association with the Research Institute and Dept. of Social Work, RCSS organized a two-day webinar for women in Kerala on the topic "Cyber Crimes against Women – Precautions and Strategies with special Reference to Covid-19 from 20 to 21 November 2020. The webinar was aimed at creating awareness among the women from different walks of life viz. students, teachers, working women, housewives and NGO functionaries, on different forms of cyber crimes against women and about the various precautionary measures to be taken to prevent such crimes.

K.Sanjay Kumar Gurudin IPS, DIG handled different topics related to cyber crimes. 


year 2019-20 was presented by Dr. Kiran Thampi (Secretary, OYSTER). The highlights were


Session on "Prevention of Drug Abuse" conducted at Aniyal Beach Auditorium, Edavanakkad

CRECHE Programme

During the COVID-19 pandemic period, the two Creches implemented by Rajagiri outREACH catering to 50 children (below 3 years of age), which focuses mainly for working parents who live below the poverty line located at Kunjhattukara in Ernakulam District and Ezhupunna South in Alappuzha, could not function as per the Government restrictions placed during this reporting period. The Project is jointly supported by State Social Welfare Board and the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Kerala.

Distribution of Food and Health Provision Kits to the Tribal Hamlets – Warriam & Therain Kuttampuzha by Rajagiri outREACH

About RFCC:

Rajagiri Family Counselling Centre was established in October 1999 as a live lab of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. Funded by the Central Social Welfare Board, New Delhi, the main objective of the centre is to strengthen the social fabric of the locality by providing free counselling, referral and rehabilitative services to the client population who are victims of atrocities, family maladjustments and social ostracism

Women's day celebration

Rajagiri Service Providing centre conducted women's day celebration by conducting a seminar in association with Swaraj (Social Work Student's Association) as per the direction of Kerala State Social Welfare Board at Rajagiri College.

The seminar was conducted on 4-03-2020 on the topic: "The Challenges faced by women in the present scenario" at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous). The key note speech on the topic was conducted by Mr. Legith T. Kottakkal, Advocate, and High Court of Kerala. He presented various problems faced by women and students in the present situation. 


Orientation Programme

Class on positive parenting and tips to improve parenting

The session was planned especially for mothers. There were 25 participants. The session was lead by Ms Jeno Shruthi Martin, Counsellor, Rajagiri Family Counsellig Centre. Online class had become a major issue among parents. The stressful days are being really hard to cope up with and thus there was an actual need to know how to reduce this stress. during the workshop were basics of law, penal system, crime, punishments, and case studies. The informative workshop was followed by an interactive session which was immensely helpful to know more about the laws regarding the juveniles. He further explained the plausible causes for the delinquency and the derivation of the same in the history of the law.

JJ Stakeholders' Deliberative Meeting in the District

The District level JJ Stakeholders' Coordination Meeting was held on 15th July 2020 through online platform by using Google meet application. The meeting was chaired by Mrs. Adv. Bitty K Joseph, Chairperson of CWC Ernakulam District. The Participants were chairperson and other members of CWC, District Child Protection Officer, Ernaulam, Probation officer and protection officers, DCPU, Superintendent, Children's Home, Ernakulam (CH), Directors and Coordinators CHILDLINE Ernakulam. The Challenges & risk factors in intervention, rehabilitation and prevention programs for children in the district were discussed.

RESOURCE ORGANISATION MEETING "UNARVU" - COVID -19 really affects the mental and emotional wellbeing of children which caused recently 66 child suicide cases around the

government state according to State declaration. Transformation of normal life style into conditional living atmosphere like restricted to households, strict online classes and online game addictions, lack socialization and domestic issues within family as well institutions extremely affect the children. Therefore to understand the issues/ problems faced by children in the institutions, scientific solutions to those problems, the



resource Organization meeting was organized by CHILDLINE Kochi with the support of DCPU and CWC on 30th July 2020 from 2 to 4.30 pm through google meet platform. There were 89 Child Care Institution representatives from the district for the meeting. The programme was chaired by Mrs. Deepa M.S, District Child Protection Officer Ernakulam and Mrs. Bitty K. Joseph, Chairperson, Child Welfare Committee Ernakulam delivered the key

note address and handled the open discussion. There were concerns and doubts from officials of CCIs regarding unexpected changes occurred due to COVID with Children. CWC chairperson assured the joint effort for addressing such issues and copying with it together. The session was handled by Dr. Anish K.R, Assistant Professor from Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous). He explained symptoms of depression in children and tips for handling such issues with children, which gave general understanding to participants.

Capacity Building Programme for Childline Team





Capacity Building Programme for Team Members





KALIKOOTU - Engaging Migrant Children In Recreational Activities

On November 18th, CHILDLINE Ernakulam organised the Kalikottu programme at Al-Mubarak School, Perumbavoor. The Programme was started with an Ice breaking Session. Later, the team conducted varieties of games for the students to reduce their mental stress. And it really helped the students to unveil the barriers for performing their recreational activities which they were facing for several months due to this COVID-19 pandemic condition. In total, 25 Migrant Students took active participation in the programme. Besides, all the CHILDLINE staffs also marked their active participation. After the Session, the team distributed mask for the students. And also the team generated awareness among the Migrant children and their parents regarding the functioning and activities of CHILDLINE. Souhaarddam" Meet the Leaders Event

CHILDLINE Ernakulam and District Legal Services Authority with collaboration of District

Juvenile Justice Committee Ernakulam organised "Souhaarddam" Meet the Leaders Event involving children by creating a novel opportunity to interact with government officials working for the protection and wellbeing of children on issues, concerns, clarifications and details of the District Child Protection System constituted by law. 250 children along with their parents from the district participated in the online interactive session. The expected outcome of this event was that of increase in children trust in the Government child protection machinery, resulting in high self-confidence in children.



CHILDLINE Sticker Campaign

As part of CHILDLINE Se Dosti Campaign, CHILDLINE Ernakulam had conducted Sticker campaign and public pledge campaign at Paravoor taluk on 17th November 2020. association with District Legal Services Authority and Police Department initiated a Motor Bike awareness campaign named as 'Ride for Safe Childhood' to create public awareness about various child protection issues in the district by highlighting the rights and privileges of children and make the society more responsive to the needs and issues faced by children thereby creating a child friendly society. The outcome of the programme was to create awareness among the general public on the problems faced by children at various spheres of life and to make a safe and secure environment in the society for them to live their lives happily.

The campaign was officially flagged off by K.T NizarAhamed, Hon'ble District judge & Member Secretary KeLSA at 10 a.m at High Court of Kerala. CHILDLINE staff and volunteers had participated in the motor bike ride and drove around 80 km distance in the district in creating awareness on child rights. Capacity Building Programme for Team Members

CHILDLINE had conducted a capacity building programme for the CHILDLINE functionaries on POCSO act 2012 on 21st November 2020 at Sahurdaya Welfare Services Ernakulam. Team members from both Collaborative organization and Railway Help Desk participated in the session which was handled Mr. Jithin Xavier, Coordinator CHILDLINE Kochi.



He addressed the importance of the Act enacted in the country to protect children from all kinds of sexual offences by presenting the study undertaken by the Ministry of Women and Child Development on 'Child Abuse' in 2007, which had revealed that 53.22% of children had faced one or more forms of sexual abuse. The increasing incidence of sexual offences against children had to be addressed through a separate legislation, as the Indian Penal Code did not specifically provide for

sexual offences against children, particularly boys. It recognized limited forms of sexual violence against girls, and considered all physical sexual acts other than rape as amounting to "outraging the modest of women" and which was punishable with a maximum term of two years and/or fine. He also clarified the difference between session 3 and session 5 of this Act that Penetrative Sexual Assault and Aggravated Penetrative Sexual Assault and its punishments under this Act very clearly.

Volunteers' Training Programme on Child Protection

CHILDLINE had conducted a capacity building programme for its team members on Juvenile Justice Act 2015 and intervention protocol while handling cases on 19th December 2020 at collaborative organization from 10 am to 2pm. Team members from both Collaborative organization and Railway Help Desk and also CHILDLINE volunteers had participated in the session, which was handled by Mr. Jithin Xavier, Coordinator CHILDLINE Kochi. The



session was officially inaugurated by Mrs. Bitty Joseph, Chairperson, Ernakulam CWC followed by an input session regarding case intervention.

There was a detailed session on Juvenile Justice Act 2015. 112 sections were covered in brief during the session. Mainly focused on the chapter 9 and 10 which covered sections 74 to 112, in which childline is mainly functioning. Some of the case studies were presented for providing more clarity about the act. CHILLDLINE team had performed a role play of an incident about a child is found as a physically abused and sexually abused where CHILDLINE staff meet the child and intervene the case and how it is being provided the intervention. Each group recorded the case very detailed in a chart paper and presented to the group. After the presentation, there was group discussion.it was very effective for the team to develop skill in handling the case.

Child Rights Awareness for Adults

CHILDLINE Ernakulam had taken a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights for the Kudumbashree members who had admitted to DDU GKY project of Ministry of Youth Affairs implemented by Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery on 20th January 2021. The session was handled by Mr. Jithin Xavier, City Coordinator, CHILDLINE. During the session short films displayed related to child issues and messages on how it has to be reported to the



authority. CHILDLINE addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, use of drugs and alcoholism among children.

Sensitisation Programme for CDPO, ICDS Supervisors & Anganwadi Teachers under Angamaly ICDS Additional Project

CHILDLINE Kochi in association with Angamaly ICDS additional Project, organized a sensitization programme for CDPO, ICDS supervisors and Anganwadi teachers of Kanjoor, Kalady, Thuravoor Panchayats and Angamaly Municipality on 29th January 2021 through Google meet on the topic 'Basic child rights, child related programmes and policies. The programme was officially inaugurated by Smr. Sayahna, CDPO of Angamaly ICDS additional

Project by stating that Children and Women are the vulnerable sections of the society, they face many difficult situations in the society, therefore this need special consideration and attention for the welfare and wellbeing of children and women in our society. Though much programmes and policies are established by the government, ICPS and ICDS are the most popular and important programmes of the nation working for development and protection of children.

He stated that parents should be always friendly with children and approachable then only children can open up their issues, problems etc. Children should be taught about safe and unsafe touch in order to prevent children from sexual offences.

The aim of the programme was to create awareness among the general public about the problems faced by children at various spheres of life and to make a safe and secure environment in the society for them to live their lives happily. Firstly concept on human rights and UNCRC was shared with the participants from which various rights, polices and schemes for children

were being amended in the country, was elaborated in detail during the session. Coordinator had introduced various child protection mechanisms and its role in protecting children from exploitation and providing emotional and psychological support for the needy.

Sensitization Programme for CDPO, ICDS Supervisors & Anganwadi Teachers at Kuttampuzha and Nellikuzhi Panchayats



4. RAJAGIRI CENTRE FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT (RCSD)

Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development, an offshoot of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), is a skilling initiative for the marginalized sections of the society on an institutional platform. Skilling being the catch word of the day to promote development and employment, the Center has evolved as an independent institutional wing to empower the Rural, Urban needy and unemployed youth by rendering skilltraining, primarily through the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY).

Contribution of Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development to Kudumbashree's Testimonials

Kerala State Rural Livelihood Mission had plans to prepare testimonials of successful candidates trained under DDU- GKY program. As part of its effort to design interesting testimonials, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development was approached to contribute stories of successful candidates who made noteworthy changes in their life and career through the training programs. Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development was able to provide 10 success stories to the Mission. Regular communication between staff at the centre and the trained candidates helped in collecting the details effortlessly during lockdown.

Mushroom Cultivation Training at Govt. Children's Home, Ernakulam

A mushroom cultivation training program was organized at Government Children's Home Ernakulam on 16th and 17th July 2020. Sessions offered both theoretical and practical knowledge about mushroom cultivation to the participants.





Orientation for BSW students

An orientation about the scope of field work for Second and Final year BSW students of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences was organized by Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development. The orientation program was conducted by Mr.Shaju K.K, State Head, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development. Students were given an introduction about Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development, different projects and courses conducted at the centre. Through this program students were given appropriate guidelines to develop case studies. They were also informed about the significance and role they have to play in the mobilization of candidates for training programs conducted at the centre.

Based on the instructions provided during the orientation program, students during their field work developed case studies as well as helped in the mobilization of eligible rural youth from 7 districts of the state for "YUVEKERALAM" project.

Reopening of Centre after Lockdown

When the nationwide lockdown was reinforced in March 2020, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development had managed to accomplish its assignments with due diligence. Benignant efforts undertaken by the trainers and RCSD staff asserted a smooth and successful completion of 3 batches of Phase5 and their on the Job Training.

Obscurity marked the days that followed the announcement of nationwide lockdown. The state of being indistinct kept climbing in a phased manner across the sectors of the economy. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences stood as a radically distinct PIA(Project Implementing Agency) during COVID-19 pandemic, when it extended a psychological support to its trained candidates through "Telephone Befriending". This helped thousands of candidates to stay positive and offered sublime instance of hope at a time when everything felt obliterate to them.


The centre closed on 13th March, 2020 in order to prevent and avoid the spread of COVID-19 as per directives issued by Kudumbashree Mission. After lockdown, the Director (Skills), MoRD, directed all the DDU-GKY PIAs to open the centre after 21st September, 2020. Accordingly, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development necessitated concerted efforts to resume trainings at the centre. It delves into the possibilities of online platforms for reaching out to the potential candidates. To deflect panic about attending classes during the pandemic situations, both candidates and parents were ensured strict adherence to COVID-19 protocols at the training centre.

Before reopening the centre, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development ensured strict compliance to the guidelines of the State and Standard Operating Procedures issued by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt.of India and Ministry of Home & Family Affairs, Govt.of India. During inspection of the centre by Kudumbashree Mission, the arrangements were highly appreciated as the protective measures met the COVID-19 protocol demands. As a result, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences was granted permission to resume its operations from October 14, 2020.

Staff Development Programs

MORD - PACE Programme

Mr.Rajeev S.R, Operations Head of RCSD was titled Advanced Master Trainer for MoRD-PACE Programme for DDU GKY Projects certified by NIRD, Hyderabad. He has facilitated Workshop on Capacity Building of the Trainers from North East. 24 Master Trainers participated in the programme, which was held from 6th to 17th December 2020.

BRIDGE Training by BOSCH

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences with the support of Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development explored the possibilities to associate and work with BOSCH India through a program by the name Bosch's Response to India's Development and Growth through Employability Enhancement (BRIDGE). BRIDGE (Bosch's Response to India's Development and Growth through Employability Enhancement) is a pioneering Bosch CSR program that helps fulfilling the growing need for skilled manpower across sectors in India. The objective of this joboriented program is to utilise Bosch's already established skills development competence to deliver a unique vocational training model for making underprivileged children employable, thereby providing a pool of high quality skilled manpower, mainly to the services industry.

One of the biggest challenges in scaling up vocational training initiatives in India is the shortage of trained trainers. To address this gap, Bosch has designed an exclusive 'Train the Trainer (TTT)' program, which covers Student Mobilsation, BRIDGE Modules Delivery, Counselling Skills, Placement Process, Bosch Qualification for Trainers. Mr.Vishnu Sajimon was chosen to attend the BOSCH's training program. He successfully completed the program with highest score and received certification for the same. Unfortunately, we were not able to commence the training programs under the BRIDGE program last year.

Value-Added Courses Imparting Transferable & Life Skills Offered During 2020-21

Commencement of DDU-GKY Project at Xth Pius Campus, N.Kalamassery

Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development (RCSD) resumed its normal flow of skill training activities from the month of October 2020. Based on the order from NIRDPR (National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj), the training centre of RCSD at Xth Pius

campus, North Kalamassery, was opened for trainees adhering to COVID – 19 protocols defined by the Government of India and Department of Health. Inspection of the training centre was conducted by the Internal Quality Team and Kudumbashree State Mission team, to evaluate the protective measures and COVID-19 guidelines are ensured at the centre. The training centre was sanctioned to operate its activities after the inspection.



Immediately after reopening the centre, RCSD was able to commence training of two courses namely, Front Office Executive and Retail Store Manager. The whole credit for a quick revival of training activities should be attributed to the Mobilization team of RCSD who successfully reached out to the target population since March, 2020. Using online platforms for mobilization yielded great results and this was reflected in the number of applications received from different districts across the state.

An Online Orientation program was held during September, in a phased manner to educate applicants about the skill training programs and its scope. After orientation, interested students were called for interview on October 14, 2020. After a critical evaluation of the candidates, trainings for the respective batches of Front Office Executive and Retail Store Manager commenced on October 19,2020.

Commencement of YUVAKERALAM Project at Rajagiri Campus

A project similar to DDU-GKY skill training program was introduced by Kudumbashree Mission by the name Yuvakeralam. Among other existing training centres, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development was sanctioned approval to roll out the project after examining the

COVID-19 guidelines adherence. Quality team of RCSD had conducted its inspection a week before Kudumbashree Mission inspection, to check for any deviation from COVID-19 protocols. Timely intervention by the mobilization team helped for quick commencement of training. As a result, within a short span, RCSD rapidly mobilized applicants



for its Accounts Executive and Housekeeping batches. With the help of online platform; orientation for Accounts Executive applicants were conducted on November 13, 2020. This was followed by an interview of candidates. Classes for Accounts Executive batch

commenced on November 17, 2020 whereas for House keeping batch, the classes commenced on November 23, 2020.

Christmas-New Year Celebration

Christmas Celebration for the trainees of DDU-GKY and Yuvakeralam was conducted on December 23, 2020. With the active participation of trainees and messages from College Principal, Centre Head and teachers, the program offered a piece of relief from COVID – 19 anxieties.

Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development supported the Department of Social Work, Rajagiri College by taking an active role of a facilitator for drafting a



proposal submitted to Jal Jeevan Mission Project under Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti and Rajagiri College has been empanelled as Implementation Support Agency (ISA) for Jal Jeevan Mission Project Implementation.

Batch Completion and Placement of DDU-GKY students of Xth Pius campus

Amid the first wave of COVID 19 pandemic, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development took the courage for conducting the skill training programs under DDU-GKY project and set an example for many other Project Implementing Agencies within Kerala. After ensuring all the security measures for students at the training centre, batches for Retail Store Manager and Front Office Executive commenced on October 14, 2020.



After successfully completing five months of classroom training, both batches were sent for On the Job Training (OJT) on March 8, 2021. OJT for Retail Store Manager batch came to an end on April 20, 2021 whereas, for Front Office Executive it ended on April 22, 2021.

Relaxations after the first wave of COVID 19 pandemic opened doors for conducting training in Retail Store Manager and Front Office Executive courses under DDU- GKY. Within several limitations, 12 candidates were trained in Front Office Executives course and 16 candidates under Retail.

Batch Completion & Placement of first batch of Yuvakeralam Project

Yuvakeralam is a skilling initiative of Kudumbashree, that aims to impart placement linked skill training to 10,000 youth in Kerala and make them into an economically independent and globally relevant workforce. The State Government has accorded administrative sanction to Kudumbashree for implementing Yuvakeralam Project taking into consideration its expertise in implementing a similar skill training programme, namely, the DDU GKY (Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana).

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences after getting empanelled as the Project Implementation Agency of Yuvakeralam Project, conducted trainings in Accounts Executive and Housekeeping Supervisor courses for the first batch. After successful completion of the training, 36 out of the 39 trained candidates are appointed at different organizations.

Commencement of three new batches of Yuvakeralam Project at Rajagiri Campus

Training started for three new batches of students under Yuvakeralam Project of Kerala Kudumbashree Mission. The training was offered in three different courses namely Accounts Executive, Housekeeping Supervisor and Retail Sales Associate. Training for Accounts Executive batch started on 2nd February, 2021 and for Retail Sales Associate batch started on 8th February, 2021. Training for Housekeeping batch commenced on March 1, 2021.



Several steps were involved before final selection of candidates. Firstly, it is the relentless efforts of the mobilization team of Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development that helped to choose the best candidates for the respective courses mentioned above.

Using the help of online platform, we were able to share the idea about the program and its purpose to the mobilized candidates. The final list of candidates were selected after following all the guidelines of the Yuvakeralam Project and a personal interview. An orientation program was conducted for each batch separately. Welcome kit consisting of uniforms and training materials were distributed to the candidates in a separate function.

Women's Day Celebration for Trainees of Yuvakeralam Project

In connection with International Women's Day 2021, a program was organised for the trainees of Yuvakeralam Project on 8th March, 2021. The program was inaugurated by Ms.Meena Kuruvila, Director, Rajagiri outREACH. Rev, Fr. Shinto Joseph, Assistant Director, Rajagiri College and Coordinator, Rajagiri Live Labs passed his message to the trainees. This was followed by different programs organised by students of Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development.



Mushroom Cultivation Training for Women Entrepreneurs

Believing that mushroom cultivation as an entrepreneurship development among women could prove a suitable approach for economic development, Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development(RCSD) and Rajagiri Centre for Sustainable Livelihood (Department of Biosciences, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences) in association with Kudumbashree District Mission, Ernakulam had conducted the mushroom



Cultivation training program from March15, 2021 to March 19, 2021. 100 women participants from 20 CDS of Ernakulam District had been provided training for mushroom cultivation in 5 different batches. The participant women were trained to cultivate and harvest mushrooms, throughout the year, by using scientific methods of cultivation, processing and marketing. Mushroom cultivation also ensures a number of value added products useful to humans and livestock by ensuring fair return on a regular basis for sustainable livelihood activities. Training was conducted for one batch, a day. Thus, separate training was conducted for 5 different batches from March 15 to March 19, 2021.

Training in Tailoring & Fashion Designing for Women

A 32 days training program on tailoring was commenced on 5th march, 2021 at Kanjoor by Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development in partnership with Kerala Kudumbashree Mission. The training was started with a mission to train 27 women in tailoring job and promote them as entrepreneurs. Materials required for training like sewing machines, cloth, scissors etc were provided to the participant trainees free of cost. An expert trainer is hired to conduct classes for the participants. The training will be completed on April 27th, 2021. On successful completion of the training, a participation certificate will be awarded to the participants.



Extension Activities/ Programs

Session on Self-Defence Practices for female trainees of Yuvakeralam Project

To give the students better understanding about the surroundings and train how to defend themselves against attackers, a self-defence class was conducted on 12th January, 2021 for RCSD students under the leadership of PGDCSW students (Anju Benoy, Anju V.K, Anjali, Sreelakshmi B) as per the field work practicum. The programme was organised in



collaboration with Vanitha Cell, Kochi and RCSD staff. Presidential speech was delivered by Dr. Anish K.R (PGDCSW Batch Coordinator), inaugural address was proposed by Mrs. Sumita Mam (SI Kalamassery police station), the vote of thanks was proposed by Mr. Rajeev.

The training program was extended to the students by NIRBHAYA team members. In addition to several self-defence practices, the training also offered information about many other measures of protection to be adopted at the occurrence of any attacks towards them. Feedbacks from students were collected after the training program.


Cyber Cell Awareness Programme
