- Awareness Programmes to enhance the knowledge about CHILDLINE and also deals subjects like POCSO ACT, Child Rights and Responsibilities, Child Abuse etc.
- Child Participation Workshop

The activities were mainly concentrated at Ponnani, Malappuram. The project covered schools, Anganawadi and residential areas to identify issues faced by children and find remedy for them. The major programmes conducted by the support organsation during this year are;

#### **Child Labour Day**

On June 12, 2015, Anti Child Labour Day, CHILDLINE Malappuram support organized an awareness programme on the topic Affective Parenting and Child Parent Relationship at Achutha Warrier Higher Secondary School Ponnani (AVHSS). The rally was officially inaugurated by the Ponnani Muncif Chief Magistrate Sri. T. A. Ramachandran as he flagged off to commence the rally and the Awareness Session was inaugurated by Mr. Ravi Santhosh, Ponnani Sub Inspector. Two hundred students took part in the rally in which the students of Student Police Cadet (SPC), Red Cross, NSS and Scout also actively participated.

#### **COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAMMES**

Our Community Health Programs helps us serve our community by offering access to quality health screenings and educational programs in order to help individuals make positive wellness decisions. We offer a wide range of preventative health services, wellness education, screenings for acute and chronic illness and provision of linkages with service providers for the beneficiaries as well as their family. The programme has a special slot reserved for children and elderly. The major activities of the



division were Health clinics, Health Insurance Scheme, Medical Assistance, Medical Camp, Suraksha Project – Targeted Intervention among Migrants etc.

#### **Geriatric Care**

Day Care Centre for the Elderly named "Pakalveedu" functioning in support from various Corporates, LSG"s, clubs, organizations etc. is the major intervention area directly or indirectly coordinated by outREACH. The Day Care Centre is a non-institutional scheme namely Pakalveedu for the elderly mainly functioning in Ernakulam District. The emphasis is on non -institutional and Community Based Services (CBS) with the intention of integrating the elderly with the community. The purpose and basic principle of the approach is to help the elderly who experience isolation, unwantedness and suffer from insecurity, anxiety and depression. The programme supports 200 elderly people through different centers.

The activities of the day care includes News Paper reading, Discussion on local reports, Personal Sharing, Feature films shown on elders issues, Games and Yoga, Counseling and Awareness classes on health, relationships etc., Celebration of members" Birthdays, Nutritious lunch, Celebrations of occasions like elders day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Onam, Christmas are part of programmes /activities organized there. The service of a doctor once a week is provided at certain centers. As part of the awareness programme provided by the Organization to nearby Colleges and Schools on Day care of Elderly, the students of these Institutions started visiting the Organization as a full day programme which includes the distribution of sweets, cultural presentations, games etc. The social workers from the organization pay visit on a regular basis as handholding support

#### Vayovandanam

Observance of the "International day of Elderly" is regularly organized by RAJAGIRI outREACH on 1st October every year. The program conducted in 2015 was named "Vayovandanam" which was held in 15 centers at different areas of Ernakulam, Thrissur, Kozhikode and Palakkad districts for elderly and 1281 persons had been a part of the program supported by Corporate"s and LSGs. Various cultural programmes of senior citizens and games were conducted on this day and winners were awarded. This program also has support from various mainstream hospitals like Rajagiri, Little Flower, Aster Medcity etc.

#### World Heart Day

outREACH observed World Heart Day and conducted free medical checkup in association with ASTER Medcity on September 29, 2015. The doctors of Cardiology Department examined 67 senior citizens from Kadamakudy Panchayath.

#### outREACH Clinics

Two clinics are rendering primary health care services functioning at Rotary Karmakendra with the support of Rotary Club of Kalamassery and TOG Colony of Kalamassery with the support of Medical Trust, Ernakulam reaching out to 200 patients a month.

#### **IDENTIFYING ADOPTABLE CHILDREN IN UNAUTHORIZED AGENCIES**

SARA Kerala sought the support and cooperation of all SAA's in identifying adoptable children in unauthorized agencies. It is also aimed at bringing those agencies to the right track of adoption, foster care and sponsorship.

#### FOSTER CARE PROGRAMME

Foster Care means placement of a child, by the Child Welfare Committee for the purpose of alternate care in the domestic environment of a family, other than the child's biological family, that has been selected, qualified, approved and supervised for providing such care; Such an arrangement ensures that the birth parents do not lose any of their parental rights or responsibilities. This arrangement shall cater to children who are not legally free for adoption, and whose parents are unable to care for them due to illness, death, desertion by one parent or any other crisis. The aim is to eventually re-unite the child with his/her own family when the family circumstances improve, and thus prevent institutionalization of children in difficult circumstances. During the reporting period 24 children were placed in foster care.

#### SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME

Sponsorship is the provision of supplementary support to families to meet medical, nutritional, educational and other needs of their children with a view to improving the quality of the life. It is a conditional assistance to enable children who were at risk from being removed from school and send for work, to continue their education. .111 Children in various districts are supported through sponsorship scheme.

#### **INTERVENTIONS**

#### To avoid delay in Court Case

To avoid delay in adoption court case Govt. of Kerala has notified (vide G.O. (P)No.55/2015/SJD dated 3 rd September 2015) that all the twenty eight Family Courts in the fourteen districts of the State as Specialized Adoption Courts. At present there is not much delay in court cases.

#### FORMING PANEL OF SOCIAL WORKERS

SARA Kerala sent a letter to all DCPUs informing them to select a panel of professionally qualified Social workers in each district to assist in conducting home studies and adoption.

#### **CURTAILING ILLEGAL ADOPTION**

SARA Kerala interfered in a case in Alappuzha where the biological mother sold her twin babies to two childless couple. The couple approached the family court Alappuzha and got the court order in favour. The case is under investigation.

Programme Manager SARA-Kerala attended consultation meeting with Director of Social Justice, Law officer & DCPO Alappuzha on 18-03-2016 regarding illegal transaction of the twin babies in Alappuzha

## SURRENDERING CHILD WITH RECOMMENDATION TO GIVE TO A PARTICULAR FAMILY

A mother with the support of PAPs took her infant back from a SAA where she was relinquished and then re - surrendered in another SAA with a promise to give the child in adoption to that Pap. SARA Kerala interfered in the case and prevented the placement of the child citing that it is a clear violation of JJAct and CARA Guidelines.

#### SETTING UP OF NEW SPECIALIZED ADOPTION AGENCIES

There are no Specialised Adoption Agencies in 5 of the districts in Kerala. SARA Kerala took efforts to set up new SAAs in these districts by identifying interested child care institutions willing to work for the rehabilitation of orphan abandoned and surrendered children.

Programme Manager SARA-Kerala and DCPU Alappuzha jointly visited Vimala Nikethan near Women & Child Hospital, Alappuzha for the purpose of identifying a new SAA in Alappuzha district on 28<sup>th</sup> April 2015.

Programme Manager SARA-Kerala visited Claris Convent, Kollam on to meet the Director for starting a new SAA in Kollam District.

Applications received from Child Care Institutions in Alapuzha, Kollam and Malapuram districts are forwarded to Social Justice Department for license/approval.

#### SHIFTING OF CHILDREN

Nirmala Sisubhavan, Missionaries of Charity Ernakulam stopped all their adoption activities. The Adoptable children in the institution were transferred through C.WC to other nearby SAAs on a rotation basis. The Special need children who failed to get suitable parents even after repeated online matching are transferred to the specialised service delivery homes for better care and development.

#### **GUIDING THE PAPs TO CHANGE AGENCY**

All the PAPs registered with Nirmala Sisubhavan are directed to transfer their applications to the other nearby SAAs for processing.

#### **STAFF ORIENTATION**

The Specialised Adoption Agency-Kerala State Council for child welfare Thycadu failed to keep the time lines stipulated in CARA Guidelines. An urgent orientation class on CARA Guidelines and online CARINGS was conducted in the SAA by Joint Director CARA on 14/09/2016.

#### PENDING CWC CASES

To avoid delay in adoption of children SARA Kerala intervened in pending CWC cases with various agencies.

#### ENSURING ADOPTION FINALIZATION IN ALL CASES

To protect the rights of children, SARA-Kerala directed the SAAs to ensure that adoption finalization is done under the JJ Act in all the guardianship cases.

#### IEC MATERIALS, DOCUMENTARIES DEVELOPED DURING THE YEAR

#### **DESIGN & DEVELOP WEBSITE FOR SARA-KERALA**

Social Justice Department, Govt. of Kerala has accepted the proposal to design & develop a website for SARA-Kerala. In connection with this the department also accepted the offer given by C-DIT Thiruvananthapuram to design & develop the website for SARA-Kerala and sanctioned the fund under Awareness generation through IEC and media campaign including printing and dissemination of IEC materials.

#### **DEVELOP & DISSEMINATE IEC MATERIALS**

SARA-Kerala developed and disseminated IEC materials for promotion of adoption, Foster Care.& Sponsorship activities in the State. IEC materials are distributed to all the Specialized Adoption Agencies, CWCs and DCPUs in Kerala. IEC materials are also distributed to all the participants of awareness classes

SARA KERALA is approached by a lot of adoptive parents for counseling services and as a support system. Some of the parents approach SARA with the telling issue, disobedience, and behavior disorders and poor academic performance of the adoptee. SARA Staff provided home visits and individual counseling sessions.

#### ADOPTIVE PARENTS MEET

Mrs.Cicily Baby, Programme Officer, SARA & Mrs.Indira, Programme Assistant, SARA attended the adoptive families meet organized by Infant Jesus Sisubhavan, Rajamattom, Thottekkad, Kottayam on 24-10-2015 at S.H.Parish Hall, Thottekkad. Forty two families attended the progamme. They shared their experiences on adoption. SARA Programme Officer provided individual counseling services to needy adopted children and their parents.

Programme Officer, SARA attended the adoptive families meet organized by Holy Angels Foundling Home, Thrissur on 14-11-2015. Fifty families attended the programme. They shared their experiences on adoption. SARA Programme Officer answered the queries made by adoptive families on matters related with sharing the fact of adoption with the adoptee, disciplining children and on adoption as per the new CARA guidelines.

Programme Officer, SARA attended the adoptive families meet organized by Sai Nikethan, Thrissur on 20-12-2015 at Thekkemadom Lekshmi Mandapom Hall, Pazhaya Nadakkavu, Thrissur. Eighteen families attended the programme. The participants were given awareness on the new in country adoption procedures.

#### CONCLUSION

In Kerala the CWCs are supportive in clearing the pending cases. DCPUs are functional in all the 14 districts. Updating and uploading data including registration of all admitted children and PAPs in CARINGS by the Specialised Adoption Agencies and processing the online adoption applications provide transparency in adoption. It is an effective mechanism for the service providers to report to the government and work for early rehabilitation of orphan, abandoned and surrendered children. Inter- state and in -state linkages also helps to avoid long term institutionalization of children and facilitate early family based rehabilitation. Foster Care and Sponsorship programmes are gaining publicity through the intervention of DCPUs and it helped several children in need of Care and Protection. We hope that the joint efforts by all service providers in ICPS will help to give family based care and protection to all needy children in the state.

We conclude with sincere thanks to all especially to CARA, Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India, Social Justice Department, Govt.of Kerala, Specialized Adoption Agencies, CWCs, DCPUs, KAFO & all adoptive, foster care and sponsorship families for supporting to our efforts in promoting adoption and non-institutional care in Kerala.

## EMPANELLED TRAINING INSTITUTION FOR NSS

(Empanelled by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India)

The Empanelled Training Institution (ETI) for NSS, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences is one of the 24 Training Institutions empanelled by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India across the country. The Rajagiri College has been associating with the Ministry for the purpose of training of NSS Programme Officers since 1970. We are catering to the training needs of NSS functionaries in 14 Universities and 5 Directorates in the State of Kerala and the Union territory of Lakshadweep. More than 9000 Programme Officers have been trained by this Centre so far. We are happy to state that we could strengthen the National Service Scheme activities in the State through intensive training and field exposure to the NSS Programme Officer trainees. The team work of NSS Regional Directorates, Programme Officers and Volunteers in the State yielded good results and our State could bag the prestigious Indira Gandhi National NSS Award for the last three consecutive years (2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15).

A brief account of training achievements of the ETI for the year 2015-2016 is given below;

#### ETI Advisory Committee Meeting

In order to assess the training requirements of each University /Directorate, a meeting of ETI Advisory Committee was convened on 25<sup>th</sup> March 2015. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Joseph. I. Injodey, Director, NSS ETI. All the Key Functionaries of NSS in the State including NSS Regional Director and State NSS Officer attended the meeting. The ETI Advisory Committee decided to organize 20 Orientation Courses during the year 2015-2016 taking to account the total number of untrained Programme Officers in each University / Directorate.

#### **Training Programmes**

Though the ETI proposed to conduct 20 Orientation Courses, the first five Courses were cancelled due to the delay in getting sanction from the Ministry. We could successfully organize 15 Orientation Courses from August 2015 to February 2016 and train 513 Programme Officers. The details of Courses and Participation strength of Programme Officers in each Course are furnished in the Table below;

#### **Training Module and details of Resource Persons**

The Training Module that we follow is very similar to the Module sent by the Ministry. In fact the ETI Training Co-ordinator actively participated in the Workshops for the Preparation as well as the Revision of Training Modules organized by the Ministry from time to time. Moreover, the rich experience of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences in working with individuals, groups and communities strengthen the training components and give emulating working models to the Programme Officer trainees. The new areas like Disaster Management, First Aid and CPR Training etc. were also added to the Training Module this year. The one day field programme in each course helped the trainees to enhance their planning and organizing skills especially in working with the people in rural and urban settings. During the one day field work programme the trainees conducted Health Survey and organized Health awareness Campaigns at neighborhood levels in each Ward. Along with the awareness session, the trainees examined the Body Mass Index and Blood Pressure of people who attended the classes. The Programme Officers were given training in data processing and preparation of Survey Report also. The Survey Reports prepared by the trainees were handed over to the Panchayath authorities for further action.

#### **INNOVATIONS IN PEDAGOGY**

Teaching-learning pedagogy at School of Computer Science is emphasized on the use of technology on increasing the skills of the students through clear conceptual understanding of subjects. The methodology includes Classroom Learning, Self-Study, Flipped Classroom, Theatre in Education, Practical Projects, and Assignments using Moodle- Learning Management system.

#### CORPORATE COMPETENCY DEVELOPMENT

The department conducted various programs to improve the employability skills of the students. A four day workshop "Mpower -for Employability and Effective Communication" was held from 18-21 June for Semester I students to build up the employability competencies of the students with respect to effective Soft Skills so that it compliments with the institution's core strength in academic excellence. Emphasis was on spoken English as a corporate medium of expression.

Regular classes were conducted by the Konfidence group for the senior batches to improve their aptitude skills. The training was designed in tune with screening tests of companies by building the verbal, non-verbal and analytical skills of participants. Each Batch was given 72 hours of aptitude training. Practice tests were administered regularly as a follow up of the program.

A six day residential program was conducted from 11-16 June,2015 by Turning Point group for the students Semester III. The program was aimed at identifying capacities of each individual, make each of them to fix a goal according to their capacities and then to programme a plan for reaching the goal. - Rubrics were created for Assignments, Class Participation, Presentations, Group projects etc.
- Assessment centers were created where students would be assessed based on Graduate Competencies.

• Concept of Core Courses were introduced where academic rigor was enhanced using Term Paper, Viva-voce etc.

#### Feedback

• Feedback was taken on institution infrastructure from all stakeholders like Alumni, Prospective Students etc.

#### **INNOVATIONS IN PEDAGOGY**

The **Rajagiri immersive Learning Experience** is a pedagogical innovation. Along with academics, students are exposed to programmes and activities which prepare them to manage and lead in challenging environments. The pedagogy covers the following areas

#### **Conceptual Learning:**

Through case discussions, lectures and seminars students are introduced to the concepts and theoretical framework of management and business. Students are also introduced into worlds of business through business update sessions and research projects.

#### **Experiment Engagement:**

The experiment engagement activities help students get immersed into the practical realm of management through various activities like Rural Sensitization camp, Vanavasam, field work, field projects and students learn from doing and experience.

#### **Executive Modelling:**

Rajagiri ensures that the students develop the winning abilities and skills to create a great impression at work and advance in their professional life.

#### **Corporate Competency**:

Students are made industry ready through continuous interaction with industry professionals.

#### ASSESSMENT REFORMS

The MBA/ MHRM programmes have implemented Learning Outcome (LO) based evaluation which is linked with the internal assessment marks and forms a part of the total marks. The institute adopts the ACBSP standards.

There are 6 core competencies (Graduate Attributes- GA) which every management student should attain when he/she completes the respective programmes (MBA or MHRM), which is derived from the Vision of School of Management- RCSS. Based on the graduate attributes each programme (MBA/MHRM) has its separate Vision, Mission, Programme Learning Outcomes (PLO) and Domain Learning Outcomes (DLO).

The programme has a detailed assessment system for the assessment and improvement of Graduate Attributes through external and internal measures.

The GAs are assessed internally through the internal mark component for each subject. Each subject taught semester-wise (in either MBA or MHRM) has to have three learning objectives/outcomes (LO). Two of the Learning outcomes are compulsorily taken from the PLO and the remaining one is specific to the domain (functional area) (DLO) that relates to the specific subject

The specific learning outcome subject wise (both PLO and DLO) are measured on one specific tool chosen from an umbrella of different tools identified in advance for each programme. The detailed

course outline given to the students before the start of the semester explains how each PLO/DLO is measured (tool and rubrics are specified).

At the end of the course, for each subject taught under MBA/MHRM programme, there is a measured score on the learning outcomes which is added to the internal written examinations marks, making the total internal assessment marks.

The GAs are also assessed externally on a periodic basis.

#### Assessment and Development Centre (ADC)

The Assessment and Development Centre facilitates the holistic development of students by providing a clear understanding of each student's strengths or developmental needs and focusing on their further professional development through a structured process of consistent, rigorous evaluation of their competency profile.

ADC undertakes the first level assessment of each student enrolled in the management programmes of Rajagiri at the



beginning of their programme. Senior HR Professionals from across India come to carry out multiple interventions on the students. Each student meets at least two assessors in the course of undergoing a battery of exercises and is scored on each Graduate Attribute. This pre-assessment score helps to benchmark the progress and development of the students on the different Graduate Attributes through the course.

This year the competency development programme and individual evaluation of each student was conducted in the month of July & August for all junior batches of MBA, MHRM.

#### **Mentoring Meeting**

All assessments of Graduate Attributes and Tools are tabulated for each student by the Analysis Team and this information is sent to the mentor in charge of students. Individual students write their own Individual Development Programme depending on strong and weak Graduate Attributes. Other analysis reports on overall performance in each Graduate Attribute / Tool is presented at IQAC for remedial programmes.

The Assessment and Development Centre (ADC) is a massive external intervention where HR personnel from across India assess the student GAs at the Programme entry level. The next external assessment is when students go for their 2-month summer internship. The personnel in the organization they are attached to give their assessment reports for each student.

The subject wise scores between the internal (Faculty) and external evaluators (ADC) are compared for consistency/deviation/patterns.

This data helps to assimilate the progression of the student scientifically.

Remedial measures are also recommended based on the LO/GA trends.

Year over year improvements in the programme are implemented using the LO/GA trends.

# **THE RESEARCH INSTITUTE**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), Kalamassery - a pioneering institution of Kerala engaged in moulding professional social workers/ social activists to uphold the human and basic rights of the downtrodden communities, has established a Research Institute to spearhead activities related to research and dissemination of knowledge in Social Sciences. The Research Institute was registered in 1973 under the Travancore Cochin Literary and Charitable Societies Act XII of 1955. Over the past 43 years, the Institute has conducted more than 140 Research Studies, 400 Training Programmes, 15 Research Methodology Courses, and 8Tribal and Social Development Projects. Over the years, a number of assignments has been entrusted with the Institute by various International, National and State Agencies/Departments and received many Accreditations/Empanelments related to its multifarious activities.

#### VISION

To be a centre par excellence in Research, Training and Consultancy

#### **MISSION**

To be a catalyst for Social Change & Development by promoting and pursuing Research, Training & Advocacy.

#### Activities 2015-16

During the year 2015-16, the Research Institute has conducted/involved in the following activities; I. Research Studies/ Surveys, II. Action Research Projects, III. Workshops/Training Programmes, IV. Research Methodology Course, V. Documentation, VI. Publications along with Representation in Conferences/Seminars/Workshops. Further, the report presents a list of Accreditations/ Empanelment and the various agencies collaborating with the Research institute.

#### I. Research Studies

Conduct of research studies on various themes is the major activity of the Research Institute. Since its inception in 1973, the Institute has undertaken more than 140 research studies on various socially relevant areas like Women & children, Child labour, Street children, Senior citizens, Youth, HIV/AIDS, Health, Evaluation, Need assessment of Various communities/localities, Consumer demands etc. under the sponsorship of various international and national agencies like, World Bank, ADB, UNICEF, ILO and Ministries of the Central and State Governments. During the year 2015-16, the Institute has successfully completed the following research studies.

# • Customer Satisfaction Survey – Mothers' satisfaction on the Services of Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS)

The ICDS program is one of the largest child development programs in the world. The customer satisfaction about the quality of services, functioning of Anganwadi workers and quality of food provided has an impact on the acceptance and utilization of the services. It is in this regard, the Social Justice Dept., Govt. of Kerala in association with the Research Institute and Institute of Management in Government (IMG) has carried out a study on the Customer Satisfaction of ICDS in Kerala. The study covered 128



Anganwadis from the 9 blocks of the selected 3 districts of Kerala viz. Thiruvananthapuram, Ernakulam and Palakkad districts. A total sample size of 1664 respondents with a distribution of 128 Anganwadi Workers and 1536 Mothers of different categories, i.e. pregnant, lactating, mothers of 6 moths – 3year child and mothers of pre-school children was covered in the study. The objective of the study was to understand the satisfaction level of the customers – the mothers on the services of Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS) implemented in the state of Kerala.

# • A search into the Nutrition Management and Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices among Tribal Women in Kerala......

Despite Kerala's development indices stand almost on par with those of the developed economies, the reports from Attappadi tribal block of Palakkad district grabbed headlines for the last few years as well. The acute malnutrition has claimed the lives of nearly 100 infants in the tribal settlements of Attappadi during the last two years i.e., more than 18 infants in the year 2014 and 76 in the year 2013. Malnutrition is a national problem and is highly prevalent among the poor communities in our country. The current incidence of infant deaths in the tribal settlements was an eye opener to the concerned authorities. An early understanding on the nutritional status of the expecting mothers and the infant and young child feeding practices among the tribal women in the settlements of Attappadi block could have been helpful in avoiding the present alarming situation in the area. Further, it is a fact that the malnutrition among tribal women and children is not only the problem of Attappadi block but also the concern of other tribal settlements in the state of Kerala too. It is in this regard, the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India in association with the Research Institute has initiated a study on 'Nutrition Management and Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices among Tribal Women in Kerala'.

# • Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence - Research Study to unearth the situation of Women Victims of Violence......

The increasing trend of gender violence in our country, emphasizes the need for unearthing the pathetic situation of women victims of violence and to formulate appropriate policies/programmes for preventing such incidences in the future and for improving the life situations of women victims. With this objective, the Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi decided to conduct a research study on Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private (family) spheres of life in association with the Research Institute.

The preliminary works of the study has been started covering 1400 women victims of gender violence in the 14 districts of Kerala. In addition, 70 key personnel viz; Officials from Police Dept./Women Cell (2), Social Workers/Activists/Nirbhaya Committee members (1), Family Counselors (1) and Jagratha Samithi (1) will be contacted from each of the district for further information related to the study.

#### II. Action Research Projects

Another major activity of the Research Institute includes Action Research Projects. In this area, the Institute has completed 4 projects - 2 income generating projects for the tribal women in Kerala and 2 water supply and sanitation projects – (Jalanidhi Project) at Malappuram and Ernakulam districts. During the year 2015-16 too, the Institute has handled two Jalanidhi projects (1) Batch II project at Vannappuram Grama Panchayat, Idukki district and (2) Batch III project at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat of Kottayam district. The overall Development Objective of the Jalanidhi Project is to assist the Government of Kerala in improving the quality of rural water supply and environmental sanitation service delivery to achieve sustainability of investments.

#### Jalanidhi Project (Batch II) at Vannappuram Grama Panchayat, Idukki

The Jalanidhi project at Vannappuram Grama Panchayat in Idukki district has completed its entire civil works and commissioned all the water supply schemes. Shri.P.J.Joseph, Hon'ble Minister for Water Resources inaugurated the Water Supply Schemes - Tharuthala & Pullikkathotti, on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> August 2015. The project is at its exit stage.

Jalanidhi Project (Batch III) at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam •

The Panchayat level launching ceremony of the Jalanidhi project (Batch-III) at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam was inaugurated by Shri. P.J Joseph, Hon'ble Minister for Water Resources, Govt. of Kerala on 15th September 2015

The other dignitaries present on the occasion were; Dr.Jayaraj, MLA, Kanjirapilly, and Dr.Sabu Vargheese, Regional Director, Jalanidhi along with the representatives of

the LSGs, the general public and the Supporting Organisation's team. Dr.Binoy Joseph, Principal, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, was the guest of honor for the programme. The project formed and registered 27 Beneficiary Groups in the Panchayat and initiated source development works of the water supply schemes.

#### III. Workshops/ Trainings/ Other Programmes


The other area of activity of the Research Institute is the organization of Training Programmes/Workshops. So far the Institute has organized more than 400 training programmes for the various International/national/state agencies and departments. During the year 2015-16, the Institute has organized 35 awareness/training programmes including road safety programmes; (21 for TT Crew of IOCL, 1 for TT Crew of BPCL), and 13 empowerment programmes for women labour.

• Road Safety Awareness Programmes Series '2015-16'

Shri.Tomin J Thachankary IPS, ADGP & the State Transport Commissioner inaugurated the launching of a series of 'Road Safety Awareness Programmes 2015-16' of Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. (IOCL) on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2015.

The Research Institute, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences organized all the 21 awareness programmes for the Tank Truck (TT) Crew of IOCL at its Terminal plant at Irumpanam, Kochi. A total of 1263 TT Crew benefited with

the programme that was started on 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2015 and concluded on 5<sup>th</sup> February, 2016. The eminent resource persons like; Shri. Adharshkumar, Joint RTO, Muvattupuzha, Shri.Sadiq Ali, Joint RTO, Kasaragod, Shri. Dileepkumar, Motor Vehicle Inspector, Ernakulam, Shri. Mohan.M, Sub Inspector of Police, Thripunithura, Dr.Abraham Varghese, Vice president, Indian Medical Association (IMA), Kerala, Dr. K.G Radhakrishnan, Govt. Medical College, Thrissur, and Dr. Asha Vijayan, PHC, Vadavukodu handled the sessions on 'Road Safety' and 'First Aid'.





#### • A Remarkable Initiative towards Addressing the Problem of Road Accidents

The Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. (BPCL), a socially responsible agency, has been continuing its efforts in the promotion of road safety and allied matters. In this regard, the BPCL in association with the Research Institute, has organized a training programme on 'Motor Vehicle Act and Defensive Driving' for the crew of BPCL on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2015. The programme was inaugurated by Shri.K.Kumaran, Senior Manager, Operations, BPCL wherein Shri. Mohan. M, Sub Inspector, City Traffic, Thripunithura led the sessions.



#### • Empowering Women Labours in the Unorganized sector......

With the objective of empowering women labours in unorganized sector, the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India, in association with the Research Institute has organized 20 one day awareness camps at different locations of Ernakulam district. In addition to the 7 camps conducted in the year 2014-15, in the current year 13 camps were also conducted at Nedumbassery Grama Panchayat, Sanjopuram, Vypin, Chendamangalam Grama Panchayat, Maradu Municipality, Thrippunithura Municipality, Manikkamangalam, Kalady Gramapanchayat, Kalady Gramapanchayat, Angamali Municipality, Keezmadu Gramapanchayath, Njarakal Gramapanchayath, Chengamanad Gramapanchayath, Vazhakulam Gramapanchayath, and Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery.

More than 2000 women workers including; bamboo workers, sales girls, domestic workers, NGO workers, tailoring workers, self employed, MNREG workers/ agricultural labourers., etc. were benefited from the 20 camps. The awareness camps helped the women workers to increase their confidence level and to enhance their knowledge especially on legal matters.

Dr.Eugene Gomez, Asst. Labour Commissioner, Shri.P.J Joy, Chairman, Bamboo Corporation, Ankamaly and other prominent personalities from the political and social welfare fields formed the array of dignitaries who addressed the women labourers on the occasion. The eminent resource persons like; Adv.Teena Cherian, High Court of Kerala, Shri.Joshy Vargheese, Project officer, Rajagiri Out-Reach, Shri. Rajeev S.R, Training Co-ordinator, Rajagiri Out-Reach, and Shri. Bently Thadikkaran, Director, Life Winners, Ernakulam led the sessions. The major topics they dealt were; Education and Empowerment of Women Labour, Laws applicable to Workers in the Unorganised Sectors: An Overview, Child Labour: Causes and Consequences, HIV/AIDS and its Implication in the World of Work Health and Labour, Strategies for Elimination of Child Labour, Child Rights, Women and Basic Human Rights.

#### • Discovering Yourself (DIYO) - A Personality Enhancement Saga of Federal Bank Ltd.

Being a major player in the banking sector, The Federal Bank Ltd. heavily relies on its employees, especially the officers to accomplish this vision. For building up the Officers with impressive personality, capacity building programmes focusing more on personality development are very essential. With this motto, the Federal Bank Ltd. in association with the Research Institute has

#### • Pulses for Good Health.....

The students from the selected public and private schools and the general public, especially the women will be the participants of the programme. The Institute has started its initial works viz. preparation of publicity materials like; notices, pamphlets and leaflets to distribute among the beneficiaries.

#### IV. Research Methodology Course

The Research Institute in association with the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) organized a 10 days Research Methodology Course for PhD Scholars in Social Sciences. The Course held at the Rajagiri College of Social Sciences was designed to impart education on the foundational methods and techniques of academic research in social sciences context. Dr.Dileepkumar, Vice Chancellor, Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit, Kalady inaugurated the course on 25<sup>th</sup> February, 2016 in the



presence of Dr.Binoy Joseph, Principal, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (RCSS), Dr.Mary Venus Joseph, Dean and Administrator, RCSS, and Dr.Karen Coelho, Professor, Madras Institute of Development Studies. During his inaugural address, the Vice Chancellor reminded the scholars to uphold values throughout their research work.

The 20 eminent resource persons from within and outside the state of Kerala, including the ICSSR panel of experts, led the sessions on the topics related to qualitative and quantitative research for the 30 participants who are pursuing their doctoral degree in the various universities of the country. The participants were practically exposed to the main components of a research framework i.e., problem definition, research design, data collection, ethical issues in research, report writing, and presentation.

A special address by Professor Johannes Schneider, Catholic University of Eichstaett-Ingolstadt, Germany, on 29<sup>th</sup> February 2016 motivated the participants very much. The influential speeches of Dr.Joseph I.Injodey, Executive Director, RCSS, and Dr. Vineetha Menon, ICSSR Observer, on the occasion had also enriched the programme.



The 10 days course was concluded on 5<sup>th</sup> March with a valedictory address by Dr.Binoy Joseph, Principal during which he reiterated the significance of publications by the research scholars. Dr.Sr.Suni Rose, Dept. of Social Work and Dr.Celine Sunny, Course Director, also spoke on the occasion. Overall, the 10 days research methodology course was expected to optimize the scholars'

research career and also would be instrumental in making more quality researches especially in the field of social sciences.

ICSW Kerala State Branch scrutinized twenty six in-country adoption cases referred by the honorable Family Court of Trivandrum, during this period April 2016 to March 2016.

# **REQUEST FOR RENEWAL OF RECOGNISION OF ICSW AS THE SCRUTINISING AGENCY FOR ADOPTION**

ICSW Kerala State Branch submitted a request to the honorable High Court of Kerala for the renewal of recognition of ICSW as the scrutinizing agency of In-country and Inter-country adoption. Along with this request, the State office submitted the copies of favorable judgments provided by the Central Office to support the appeal. As a result of this appeal, the honorable High Court accepted the request of ICSW Kerala State Branch to act as the Scrutinizing Agency for In-country and Inter-country Adoption before the Family Courts, District Courts and the Juvenile Justice Boards under Juvenile Justice Act in the State.

#### PETITION TO THE CHAIRMAN OF KERALA STATE LEGAL SERVICE AUTHORITY

ICSW Kerala filed a petition to the Chairman of Kerala State Legal Service Authority on October 05, 2015 for appointment of social workers while constituting benches of Lok Adalat. As per

Kerala Legal Service Authority Rules 1998, rule no-29, the social worker is a part of the benches of Lok Adalat. Most of the benches of Lok Adalat are not comprised of social workers, though there is a provision for a social worker to be a part of the Lok Adalat Bench. ICSW Kerala requested to the Chairman Kerala State Legal Service Authority to issue necessary orders to all the concerned judicial authorities or Legal Service Committees to appoint social workers in the benches of Lok Adalat. 
#### **Blood Donation Camp**

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
