Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) is one among the few colleges in the state of Kerala which has been granted autonomous status by University Grants Commission, with effect from June 1, 2014. The autonomous status provided to the college will help the college prescribe its own relevant courses of study and syllabi, design student focused wide choices of courses, periodically update syllabus and conduct examinations and notify results in a timely manner. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (RCSS) was given the status of "College with Potential for Excellence" by University Grants Commission.

The motto of the College is "Relentlessly towards Excellence" and this is achieved by strict measures of quality management in pedagogy, learning resources, training and infrastructural support.

The college is located in two sprawling campuses in Kochi- the Hill Campus at Kalamassery and the Valley Campus at Kakkanad. The School of Business Administration offers Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA). Rajagiri Centre for Behavioural Science and Research offers Bachelor of Psychology (B.Sc. Psy.) and Master of Psychology (MSc. Psy).

The Valley Campus houses the School of Management. The School of Management offers Ph.D in Management, the two year full time Master of Business Administration (MBA) and Master of Human Resource Management (MHRM) programmes.

#### ii. Psychological Testing Centre/Lab

The Rajagiri Centre for Behavioural Sciences and Research has two Psychology labs- one for the UG students and one for the PG students. The practicals held at these labs are a core component of the teaching and learning of Psychology. The lab has about 130 tests. The UG lab has a seating capacity of 40 (experimenter+ subject) and the PG lab has 25.

The undergraduate lab has experiments involving apparatus as well as paper-pencil psychological tests are conducted in these labs to test memory, intelligence, personality, perception, sensation and other related psychological topics. The postgraduate lab has a special focus on Psychodiagnostics and has 60 tests. These tests measure personality, intelligence as well as clinical tests such as Beck's Depression Inventory, NIMHANS Neuropsychological test, Cognitive Distortion Scale, TAT, etc

Apart from these tests, computer based practicals are also conducted here using PEBL (Psychology Experiment Building Language) software. This allows the students to understand the concepts taught through games like experiments using a medium most familiar to them

Summer Internship is a life changing experience for students of Rajagiri School of Management. ### > Assessment Reforms

The MBA/ MHRM programmes have implemented Learning Outcome (LO) based evaluation which is linked with the internal assessment marks and forms a part of the total marks. The institute adopts the ACBSP standards.

### **Assessment Procedure**

There are 6 core competencies (Graduate Attributes- GA) which every management student should attain when he/she completes the respective programmes (MBA or MHRM), which is derived from the Vision of School of Management- RCSS. Based on the graduate attributes each programme (MBA/MHRM) has its separate Vision, Mission, Programme Learning Outcomes (PLO) and Domain Learning Outcomes (DLO).


The programme has a detailed assessment system for the assessment and improvement of Graduate Attributes through external and internal measures.


Based on the inputs from the ACBSP mentor, the focus of the assessment was shifted from Graduate attributes to Programme Learning outcomes from the year 2016-17. Program Learning Outcomes (PLO) became the cornerstone of the assessment. Each Programme – MBA/MHRM - created 5 Learning Outcomes each. Along with the Program Learning Outcomes (PLO), each domain – finance, marketing, HR, systems- created domain specific learning outcomes (DLO).


#### **Internal Assessment Procedure**

A curriculum map was created to ensure that the PLOs are aligned to courses or curricula. A new course plan template was introduced in the year 2016-17, whereby the course learning objectives were linked to programme Learning outcomes and Domain learning outcomes. The faculty handling the courses takes a minimum of 3 Learning Outcomes from PLO or DLO.

The measurement of the Learning Outcome was based on outcome based rubric. A sample of two cycles of the learning outcome measures of MBA programme have been given below along with its analysis. MHRM programme also follows the similar pattern.

### **External Assessment Procedure**

There are a number of external measures by which Graduate Attributes are assessed. The following are some of them.

### 1. Assessment and Development Centre (ADC)

The Assessment and Development Centre undertakes the first level assessment of each student enrolled in the management programmes of Rajagiri at the beginning of their programme. Senior HR Professionals from across India come to carry out multiple interventions on the students. Each student meets at least two assessors in the course of undergoing a battery of exercises and is scored on each Graduate Attribute. This pre-assessment score helps to benchmark the progress and development of the students on the different Graduate Attributes through the course.

This year the competency development programme and individual evaluation of each student was conducted in the month of July & August for all junior batches of MBA, MHRM.

• July 23-24, 2016 and Aug 7, 2016

The ADC facilitates the holistic development of students by providing a clear understanding of each student's strengths or developmental needs and focusing on their further professional development through a structured process of consistent, rigorous evaluation of their competency profile.

### 2. Summer Internship G A Assessment

The next external assessment is when students go for their 2-month summer internship. The guide in the organization they are attached gives the assessment reports for each student.

#### **Assessment Committee**

An assessment committee was formed to plan, measure, analyse and report the different processes related to the assessment of LOs. The Rubric Scores of Program Learning Outcomes are discussed by Assessment Committee and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for further action. The Domain Level Outcome scores would be discussed in the Doman Meetings for further actions.

The subject wise scores between the internal (Faculty) and external evaluators (ADC) are compared for consistency/deviation/patterns. This data helps to assimilate the progression of the student scientifically.

Remedial measures are also recommended based on the LO/GA trends.

Year over year improvements in the programme are implemented using the LO/GA trends.

#### **LE-COCON- The Incubation Centre**

With the aim of inculcating entrepreneurial skills in the minds of students and young innovators, Rajagiri has set up a unit for Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC) in the campus called LE COCON. Rajagiri aims at Cultivating innovation and entrepreneurship attitude in the minds of students, supply them with adequate resources for the development of an enterprise and fuelling them with wisdom to face the corporate business world. The Centre envisages a smooth transition of students from idea generation to commercialization of idea.

Year 2016-17 was an active and energetic year for LE COCON, the Bootcamp/Innovation and Entrepreneurship Cell (IEDC) of Rajagiri.

IEDC was established at Rajagiri Valley Campus on February 2015 supported by Kerala Startup Mission (KSUM) (formerly Techno Park-Technology Business Incubator (T-TBI), the designated nodal agency for implementing Kerala government's entrepreneurship and innovation-related projects) and Kerala State Industrial Development Corporation (KSIDC) The main objective of the Rajagiri Bootcamps includes:

**Alumni Survey**: - As for every educational institutes their alumni plays an important role for developing the overall connect with industry. #### TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION

# EMPANELLED TRAINING INSTITUTION (ETI) FOR NSS

(Empanelled by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India)

The Empanelled Training Institution for NSS, (formerly NSS TOC) has been functioning in Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery since 1970. The ETI at Rajagiri College is one of the 24 Training Centres empanelled by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India. The prime focus of the ETI is to give focused orientation to the NSS Programme Officers who are drawn from various disciplines and motivate them to organize various activities in tune with the philosophy and overall objective of the Scheme.

ETI imparts training to the NSS Programme Officers from all the Universities (14) and the Directorates (5) in the State of Kerala and the Union Territory of Lakshadweep.

Around 10,000 Programme Officers have been trained by this ETI from its inception. During the current year (2016-17) Kerala State could bag the prestigious Indira Gandhi National NSS Award for the best Directorate, best Programme Officer and best Volunteer. Hearty congratulations to the award winners and the State level NSS Officials whose co-ordinate efforts and guidance helped the State to reach this laurel.

#### **Health Survey & Awareness Campaign**

In order to give 'Hands on training' to the Programme Officers on the Methodology of Social Survey and organizing people for various activities at community level, one day field work Programme was included in the training module. #### **DDU-GKY**

Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) is the skilling and placement

initiative of the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), under the Government of India, focuses on catering to the occupational aspirations of rural youth and enhancing their skills for waged employment.

The Implementation of DDU-GKY involves multiple stakeholders such as state governments and technical support agencies including the National Institute of Rural Development, Panchayati Raj (NIRD & PR), and Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs).



Focusing on inclusive growth via skill development and fostering capacity amongst marginalised rural youths, the programme provides benefits such as 3 months training at no cost, alongside promises of guaranteed placement, career progression and retention. The students are also

entitled to a stipend of Rs.125 per day of attendance, in addition to free textbooks and uniforms. The cohort undergoes two months of classroom academic training, followed by on the job training and placement/employment. The assessment for domain sectors are conducted by Sector Skill Council, Government of India.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences has procured affiliation for various sector skills-

NAASCOM, THSC, RASCI, NCVT, ASCI etc.



#### NULM (Deen dayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission)

The project aims to reduce poverty and vulnerability of poor urban households by enabling them to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage opportunities, resulting in a marked and sustainable improvement in their quality of live. This is achieved through the construction of strong grass root level institutions for those who are economically disadvantaged. The mission aims to provide shelter and essential services to the urban homeless in a phased manner. In addition, the mission also seeks to address livelihood concerns of urban street vendors by facilitating access to suitable spaces, institutional credit, social security and skills for accessing emerging market opportunities.

#### **Salient Features-**

Eligibility Criteria-ForMale/Female individuals the 18-35years old demographic is targeted. However, there are exceptions that are granted for several marginalised populations who are permitted to join until the age of 45. These groups includes persons with disabilities (PwDs), those who hail from tribal groups, are HIV positive, or who are transgender persons. In addition, those who are victims of trafficking, manual scavengers, or who are being rehabilitated from bonded labour are also permitted to apply until the age of 45 years.

- Urban BPL Household member.
- Spacious Classrooms, fully equipped lab, IT facilities. Separate space for each course domain offering a maximum of 10 square feet per trainee.
- CCTV recording in classrooms, labs and common areas.
- Individual mentoring provided for weak students.
- Industrial counselling provided beforeOJT/ Placement.
- Placement /Post placement tracking.

#### **Rural Masonry at DDU-GKY**

As part of its mission to ensure women get higher stakes in employment, the Kudumbashree Mission of Kerala launched the Rural Masonry program in co-ordination with the various Panchayaths. The Government's planning fund is the source of funding. Masonry as a source of employment yields high income and is predominantly a male-dominated field. The prevailing socio-economic conditions alongside other extraneous issues work in cohesion to create a climate in which males are not able to provide adequately for their families, a large driver that has led to the implementation of this course.

#### Course Profile-

Minimum Educational Qualifications-Preferably 5th standard, normal literacy of reading, writing and understanding and basic numeracy. Minimum Job Entry Age -18 years

#### **Brief Job Description:**

This job involves routine rural construction work such as earth work for foundation, layout marking and construction of



marking and construction of foundations, walls, brick/block masonry work, random rubble masonry works, IPS flooring, reinforcement and shuttering works. Manual concreting




works, fixing of door and window frames and shutters and installation of sanitary fittings and fixtures in toilets are also

duties undertaken.

#### **Training for Transgender (Kudumbashree Project)**

The training of Transgeders is an initiative of Kudumbashree, with the goal of facilitating their entry into the mainstream job market, the details of which were held on the 15<sup>th</sup> of July, 2016. The meeting comprised of the Police Commissioner, Kudumbashree Mission, Rajagiri and importantly, transgender themselves. Kudumbashree was assigned the responsibility of facilitating the programme, Rajagiri was appointed as the training agency, and the police vetted the trainees before training commencement. Kochi metro provided confirmation of reserved employment opportunities for the trainees. The group consisted of transgenders from Ernakulam.

#### MOBILIZATION OF CANDIDATES

The candidates are mobilized by the mobilisation team of the PIA in coordination with the respective project functionaries. Aptitude test, developed by John Holland is administered to prospective students during the course of mobilisation. On-field registration and short interviews are held.

The details, comprising of name, qualification, presence and level of job experience, family details, interests, contact details etc. are noted in the register and if selected by the PIA are asked to come for a general orientation which would involve of all the selected trainees assembling together

Personality Development and confidence building activities are mixed within in the primary skillset curriculum by means of individual and group exercises. Individual exercises comprise of presentations, skill-based individual thematic presentations, role plays, and self-introductory exercises. Team building exercises, group games, debates, skits and group presentations are all a part of group exercises.

Industrial visits to different organisations also assists in personal and professional grooming.

#### **EVALUATION AND FEEDBACK/MONITORING**

The feedback form is administered during the end of the course process. A general overview and review of the feedback given by the candidates is carried out by the Centre In charge with staff. Following this process, improvements and remedial measures are made wherever necessary.

The students are also asked to give individual evaluations and feedback about training to ensure that feedback reflects their honest opinions and perceptions.



An operational review is done through staff meetings internally and meetings with the CEO are chaired by Centre in Charge.

The process review is conducted based on Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). Regular inspections from National Institute for Rural Development (NIRD), Hyderabad and State Rural Livelihood Mission (SRLM) are carried out with adherence to the DDU-GKY SOP Guidelines, the evaluation yardstick of the PIA.

#### **Placement & Tracking Process**

The placement cell is in charge of scheduling the on-the-job training, followed by employment. Usually the on-the-job training extends as source of employment for majority of the trainees.

The placement cell co-ordinates with various agencies, the preferred sources of employment. Before the OJT/placement, the students are subjected to industrial counselling wherein they list their preferred areas and availabilities for employment. They are then provided employment in accordance with these desires as much as possible. Some prospective employers visit the college and conduct personal interviews to recruit trainees. In instances where such visits are not possible, the trainees are also asked to visit employers.

Placement for the trainees is always ensured by giving them employment that suits their convenience and eligibility. Compensation terms are always on par with the prevailing market rates. In instances where trainees are not being paid industry-accepted wages the PIA will also investigate and advocate on their behalf.

The tracking process involves trainees being called by the Placement Tracking Officer in the first week of every month to ascertain their status of employment. They are also called on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of every month to receive an update on their salary payment, and during the end of the month to confirm their status of employment. The trainees are entitled to submit their salary slip or copy of the bank statement. During the process of tracking their concerns are also addressed with the organisation intervening and contacting the employer if need be. Naturally, considering the sometimes chaotic lives the trainees can live there is always the possibility of them discontinuing their employment. In order to combat this and decrease such instances, the organisation engages in active monitoring and checking in for the aforementioned 12 month period. Respective employers are contacted and their concerns and opinions in relation to the candidate are recorded and utilized as a baseline for midcourse correction. Such issues are quickly acted upon to ensure that they do not lose their employment.

Realizing the magnitude of its research contributions to the general society over the years the Institute has been entrusted with a number of assignments from various International, National and State Agencies/Departments. Further, the Research Institute is an Accredited/Empanelled agency with the Govt. of India and Govt. of Kerala.

#### **Activities 2016- 17**

The activities of the Research Institute for the year 2016-17 are scripted under the following heads; I. Research Studies, II. Action Research Projects, III. Workshops/Training Programmes, IV. Documentation and V. Representation in National/International Conferences/Seminars

#### I. Research Studies

The Research Institute fosters research activities that blend with its vision statement "to be a centre par excellence in Research". Since its inception in 1973, the Institute has undertaken 142 research studies on various socially relevant areas like Women & children, Health & Nutrition, Senior citizens, Youth,HIV/AIDS,Evaluation of Projects/Programmes,Need assessment of various communities/localities, Consumer demands etc. The studies were mainly sponsored by World Bank, ADB, UNICEF, ILO and Ministries/Departments of the Central and State Governments.

During the period 2016-17, the Institute has undertaken 2 major research studies viz. 1. 'Nutrition Management and Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices among Tribal Women in Kerala' sponsored by Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India and 2. 'Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private Spheres of Life in Kerala, sponsored by the Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi.

# 'Nutrition Management and Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices among Tribal Women in Kerala'

This study was intended to bring to light the nutritional status of mothers and children in the tribal hamlets of Kerala along with the Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices prevailing in these backward communities. Accordingly, the data were collected from 750 tribal mothers and 113 Key personnel; including Doctors, Junior Public Health Nurses (JPHN), Junior/Health Inspectors, officials of Integrated Tribal Development Project (ITDP), Janamaithri Police Officers, Elected Representatives, and Anganwadi Workers, from the 5 districts of Kerala viz. Wayanad, Idukki, Kasaragod, Palakkad and Kannur, where almost 80% of the tribal population in the state is aggregated.

The analysis of the data revealed that the situation has been much improved after the recent incidences of infant deaths in the tribal settlements of Attappadi and subsequent measures taken by the Govt. of Kerala. The feeding practices are reported to be good in majority of the tribal hamlets under study. The Health Dept., ICDS, ITDP, etc. are found to be taking much effort in this regard. However, it is surprising to see that in some of the tribal hamlets especially in Kannur district, the presence of underweight and sick mothers and children is comparatively high. Some of these hamlets are in remote locations where the performance of mother and child health care institutions is not up to the expected standards.



The study suggested that as maternal health is very crucial in the delivery of a healthy baby and the subsequent growth; more care should be given to the nutritional status of mothers. To upgrade the maternal health, the regular assessment of nutritional status of adolescent girls as well as the mothers in the hamlets could be beneficial. It also recommended for community level awareness programmes on their local language for improving the infant and young child feeding practices among the tribal mothers.

# Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private (family) spheres of life in Kerala

The statistics shows an increasing trend in the incidence of violence against women in the state of Kerala. As per the records of Kerala Police, in 2010 the number of reported cases in the state was 10,781 which increased to 14,061 in 2016. The situation emphasizes the need for unearthing the pathetic situation of women victims of violence and to formulate appropriate policies/programmes for preventing such incidences in the future and for improving the life situations of women victims.

The present study on Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private (family) spheres has been undertaken for period of two years and has completed its first year of activities. The data were collected from 1400 women victims of gender violence in the 14 districts of Kerala. In addition, 70 key personnel viz; Officials from Police Dept./Women Cell (2), Social

Workers/Activists/Nirbhaya Committee members (1), Family Counselors (1) and Jagratha Samithi (1) were contacted from each of the district for further information related to the study. Analysis of the study is progressing now.

#### II. Action Research Projects

Action Research is one of the areas where the Institute has been actively involving for the past few years. So far, the Institute has successfully completed four projects - two of them were income generating projects for the tribal women and the rest were water supply and sanitation projects (Jalanidhi). During the period 2016-17, the Institute has handled 2 Jalanidhi Projects – in Idukki and Kottayam districts.

#### Jalanidhi Projects......

Jalanidhi is a drinking water and health & sanitation project which has been implemented by the Govt. of Kerala through the Kerala Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (KRWSA). This world Bank assisted project is not just a water supply project rather this is a tool for community development, akin to the ripples that increasingly reach outwards when the still and calm surface of pond is touched, this project is intended to trigger off far reaching changes not merely in water supply but in the very way of life of the rural community. The overall Development Objective of the Jalanidhi Project is to assist the Government of Kerala in improving the quality of rural water supply and environmental sanitation service delivery to achieve sustainability of investments.

The two Jalanidhi projects, the institute have been running are; (1) Jalanidhi Phase-2 Batch-II project at Vannappuram Grama Panchayat, Idukki district and (2) Batch-III project at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam district.

#### • Project at Vannappuram Grama Panchayat, Idukki

This project has commissioned all the 21 water supply schemes. As it is a demand driven project, more than 1600 households demanded for drinking water facility, have been benefited from the water supply schemes constructed and run by the 24 Beneficiary Groups formed in the Panchayat in this regard. In the area of sanitation, in addition to a number of awareness programmes, more than 300 latrines were constructed in the houses with no latrines.



#### • Project at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam

The ongoing Project at Nedumkunnam formed 26 beneficiary groups (BGs) to implement the water supply schemes. The planning phase has finished and now the project is at the implementation stage. The civil works started for all the schemes, of which works of a scheme for a BG – Parakkuzhi, has almost been completed. Around 1700 households are expected to benefit from the 23 schemes to be implemented in the Panchayat. Further, 250 latrines were constructed in the Panchayat as part of the sanitation component of the project.

#### III. Trainings/Workshops/Seminars

The other important area of activity of the Research Institute is the organization of Training Programmes/Seminars/Workshops. So far, the Institute has organized more than 425 training programmes in the fields of road safety, health and sanitation, science popularization, women and children, tribal welfare, human resource development, local self government, watershed management, environment, solid waste management, etc. for various International/national/ state agencies and departments. During the year 2016-17, the Institute has organized two road safety awareness programmes, career guidance training and a yearlong science popularization programmes.

#### Tie ups with Corporate bodies for Road Safety

As nearly 78% of all road accidents are caused due to drivers' fault, to impart training to the drivers, especially to the heavy vehicle drivers are much needed. It is in this regard, the Research Institute has been associating with corporate bodies like; HPCL, BPCL, IOCL, etc. for providing quality training to its tank truck crew. For the last few years, the institute has conducted hundreds of training programmes in this area. During the period 2016-17, the Institute has conducted two road safety programmes at



Bharath Petroleum Corporation Ltd. (BPCL) for its tank truck crew.

Shri. M. Somasundaram, Senior Manager, BPCL, inaugurated the first training programme held at

BPCL, Irumpanam on 12<sup>th</sup> August 2016. Shri. Madhusudhanan, Manager, Operations, Shri. Tirumala Srinivas, Safety Officer, and Shri Anoop Joseph Joy, Training Officer, the Research Institute, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences were also spoke on the occasion. Shri. Mohan M, Sub Inspector, City Traffic, Thripunithura handled the technical session on Motor Vehicle Act (Road Safety Rules & Regulations).



The second road safety programme held on 28<sup>th</sup> October, 2016 for the tank truck crew of the BPCL, was inaugurated by Shri. Ravunnikutty, Senior Manager, Operations, BPCL. The resource person for the training programme was Shri. Dileepkumar, Motor Vehicle Inspector, (MVI), Ernakulam.

#### Career Guidance Training......

#### Association with Directorate of Higher Secondary Education

The Directorate of Higher Secondary Education, Career Guidance and Adolescent Counselling Cell, Govt. of Kerala in association with the Research Institute, has organized a refresher training for the Career Guides and Souhrida Co-ordinators of Ernakulam District on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017.

The training was inaugurated by Shri. A.K Narayanankutty, Deputy Excise Commissioner, Kochi, Govt. of Kerala wherein Dr. Fr. M.D Saju, Faculty, Dept. of Social Work, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery delivered the key note address. The sessions on 'Drug Abuse', 'Substance Abuse among Teenagers', and 'Online Applications for Higher Studies' were handled by Shri. Narayanankutty, Dr. Seby Varghese, Secretary, KDA and Shri. Babu Pallippatt M.G University, Kottayam respectively.



#### Science Popularization Programmes 2016-17

The 68th UN general assembly declared 2016 the International Year of Pulses (IYP). The IYP 2016 aims to heighten public awareness of the nutritional benefits of pulses as part of sustainable food production aimed towards food security and nutrition. It is in this context, the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE), in association with the Research institute, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (RCSS), Kalamassery has implemented a number of activities under Science Popularization Programme in the year 2016-17. The objective of the programme titled 'International Year of Pulses - Pulses for Good Health' was to create awareness among the public especially the women and the students, about the importance of pulses in their daily lives. The activities conducted in this regard included: Seminars, Food Fests, District Level Essay and Poster Competitions and Printing and distribution of Publicity Materials (Notices, Pamphlets, Leaflets, Posters, etc.).

#### Seminars on Pulses.....

Seminars were organized with the aim of imparting skills and knowledge to the participants - student and general community especially the women, on 'pulses, its cultivation and its role on the improvement in nutritional status of people, soil fertility and climate change'. Accordingly, 5 seminars were conducted at the five different venues of Ernakulam district viz. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, St.Sebastian



High School, Kanjoor, Kalamassery Municipality, Kanjoor Grama Panchayat and Welfare Service Society, Ernakulam. The topics dealt in these seminars were; Contributions of Science to the Health Sector (Food security) with special reference to Pulses, Pulses – Types, Nutritious contents & its importance in the Diet, Pulses – the protein food for the vulnerable groups, Sprouting of Pulses and its significance in the Diet, Soya bean – the Miracle Bean, Importance of Pulses in our Daily Lives, and Role of Pulses in Promoting Soil Fertility and Climate Change.

Mrs. Asha Zacharia, Nutrition Specialist, Middle Level Training Centre (MLTC), Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (RCSS), Mrs. Mary John, Principal, MLTC, RCSS, Smt. Mekha Thampi, Nutrition Specialist, Morning Star Home Sciences College, Ankamaly, Shri. Boban Paul, Agricultural Officer, Krishi Bhavan, Kanjoor, Mrs. Sreelekha B.R, Agricultural Officer, Krishi Bhavan, Kalady were the resource persons who led the sessions. It was learned from the feedbacks of participants that they were inspired and motivated to include pulses in their daily lives, or to work towards imparting the knowledge they have learned from the seminar to other people.

#### Food Fests.....

Food Fests were implemented to popularize the 'International Year of Pulses 2016'. It was an event that features a variety of foods with pulses. Four Food Fests – one among the students and the other

among the general community, were organized at four different locations of Ernakulam district. The venues were; Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Chavara Cultural Centre, Ernakulam, Sthree Samajam Hall, Kochi, and Rotary Karmakendra, Kalamassery. The Food Fests were remarkable with the competitions held among the participants. The competitions were mainly on 3 categories viz. Dessert, Snacks and curry. Twelve to thirteen teams were contested in each of the competitions.



Some of dishes displayed in the competitions were; Pulses mysoor pavu, Mixed pulses sweet, Chana Masala Ada, Horse gram fry, Black gram vada, Koottukari with pulses, Green gram masala, Moongdal Halwa, Sprouted mixed pulses Salad, Rajma Masala, Chana Dalmasala, Chana Dal Toffee, Navaratna Uhal, Parippu Vada, Bengal gram sweet, Vazhachundu dal, Cutlet Dal, Payasam. The competitions were judged by Ms. Asha Zacharia, Nutrition Specialist, Middle Level Training Centre, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Shri. Anand Kumar, Senior Faculty, Food Production, Chavara Institute of Management and Media Studies (CIMAMS), Kochi, Smt.Saritha Sohan, Asst.HOD, Hotel Management, CIMAMS, Kochi, Ms.Jessy Alexander, Asst..Professor, and Ms.Jaya Vijayan, Asst. Professor, Rajagiri College.

The Food Fests were crowded with a large number of viewers and the items prepared for the competitions were readily sold among them.

#### Essay Competitions...

Essay competitions for the School and college students were the other major activity carried out to

popularize the International Year of Pulses 2016. Two competitions – one for the high school students and another for the college students, were conducted in this regard. The students from the different schools and colleges contested in the competitions held at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery. The selection of the contestants was on the basis of one month prior advertisement in the News paper and a Circular to all the Schools/Colleges in the district.



The topic was 'Role of Science in the Health Sector & the Importance of 'International Year of Pulses 2016'. Smt Nisha Vikraman, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Home Science, St. Theresa's College, Ernakulam and Mrs. Asha Zacharia, Nutrition Specialist, MLTC, RCSS declared the results of the competitions.

#### Poster Competitions

Poster competition was the other highlight of the Science Popularization Programme 2016-17. The institute has organized two competitions in this regard on the topic 'Role of Science in the

Health Sector and the importance of International Year of Pulses'. Selected students from the various schools and colleges contested in the competitions held exclusively for them. The beautiful creations of the students in multicolours were later evaluated by the Judges and the Prizes were distributed among the winners.







#### **Publicity Materials on Pulses**

The printing and distribution of publicity – i.e. Information Education & Communication (IEC) materials among the general public is one of the most useful strategies to create awareness on a particular topic. The Science Popularization Programme 2016-17 also employed this method to bring about awareness among the public on various aspects related to pulses. Leaflets, pamphlets, posters and notices were the materials printed and distributed among the general public and the students of the respective Community/Schools/ Colleges, where the programmes were organised. Further, the Social Work students of the Rajagiri College of social sciences distributed IEC materials among the community as part of their field work. The materials were on the topics; International Year of Pulses 2006, Pulses –types, and its nutritious contents, Sprouting of pulses and its significance in the diet, Soya bean – the Miracle Bean, and Low cost nutritious recipes with pulses.

#### IV. Documentation

A full-fledged documentation centre is maintained by the Institute for dissemination of knowledge among the scholars and the academia. It has a wide collection of books, journals, CDs, study reports, leaflets, pamphlets, newsletters of development agencies/NGOs, news clippings on women, children, Senior citizens, tribal, eco-tourism, water & sanitation, road safety, pulses and literature on general topics.

## Child Centric **Programmes**

#### **Child Sponsorship**

...It's all about giving a needy child the hope for a better future!

Child Sponsorship is a process of support given to a child to enable the child to achieve the maximum of his/her potential despite the lack of advantages. Child Sponsorship can be in terms of social, economic or other obstacles to the development of the child. The process is continued till the child becomes self-sufficient. Which means financially supporting the education, health or security of the sponsored child or in some cases all of these. An important feature of the child sponsorship programme is that it is ensured that the child continues to stay with his/her family of any sort (either with parents or other relatives or in foster care) and is NEVER institutionalized. Sponsorship programme reaches out to deserving children by providing them the means for a better future. The objective of the child sponsorship programme is to ensure the holistic development of the child which enables them to become self reliant through education, timely guidance and motivation, in spite of their poor socio-economic background.

#### **Sponsorship Distribution**

Distribution of School kits (bags, books, umbrellas etc) for sponsored students at 26 centers was completed. The distribution was carried out in the months of May & June and attendees of the programmes were MLA's, Corporate Heads and Various NGO representatives. The Distribution of sponsorship from Kinder for Kinder, Switzerland for 100 Higher Secondary tribal children of Attapadi was held at ASSO, Attappadi on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2016.



#### **Innovative Fund Distribution**

As part of child sponsorship programme, in the month of April & May 2016, Innovative fund distribution in association with the concerned CSR Corporates were held in 5 centers benefitting 199 sponsorship children. Cycle, cupboard, stitching machine etc. were distributed to the Children as part of it.



#### Parents' meeting

Parents' meetings of sponsored children were conducted once in 3 months in all centers. Awareness classes on Effective parenting, Adolescence behavior problems, Child Rights, Family Budgeting, Organic farming etc were taken up in each meeting. These meetings were a place for the parents to express their views, concerns and expectations about the project as well as opportunities to discuss general matters affecting their life. Almost all the parents attended the meetings and they are our real strength for the success of our activities. In total **70 parents meetings** were conducted during the reporting period.

#### Children's Meeting

Sponsored children's meetings were conducted on monthly basis in Saturdays/holidays, with an aim to develop their academic as well as extra curricular activities, skills etc. A review of academic performance of the children is undertaken during the meetings. These meetings help to develop the extra curricular activities, social, leadership skills and personality straits of the children. The Social Worker also facilitated review of books read at the children's meetings. The children are provided with various opportunities to enhance their knowledge and upgrade their potential through regular meetings. Around 340 meetings were held in 33 centers during the period under review.

#### **Sports & Library**

For encouraging and developing children's interest in sports, they are provided with badminton bats, Carom Board, Ludo etc. Books on general knowledge, novels, stories and poems were also made available for the sponsored children from the library functioning at centre.

#### **Awareness Classes**

Sessions on relevant topics like Health & Hygiene, Personality Development, Cyber Awareness, Child Rights and Child Protection etc were given to sponsored children and their parents at every centre by the experts in the respective fields.

#### Festival Celebration & Observation of Important Days

The sponsored children collectively celebrated Onam, Christmas and New Year. Onam, the festival of Kerala, celebrated at every centers with colorful cultural programmes like Floral carpet making (pookalam) competition and traditional Onam sadhya. Cultural programmes of students, sharing of Christmas/New Year message etc were the main events of the celebration. New Year greetings were also sent to the sponsors.

#### **Medical Assistance Programme**

All sponsored children are insured under the Medical Assistance Programme by which they are provided with the expenses incurred for hospitalization if any. During the year 2016-2017 a total of Rs.243795/-was given to 62 children those who are in need of medical assistance.

### Camps

#### Souhrudam Camp - 2016

A three day vacation camp was organized at 38 centers covering 3730 children between the ages of 5-15 years based on the topic 'Sambadyathiloode Souhrudam' in a period between April 18—May 28,2016. The theme was introduced for the first time for Souhrudam camps and was accepted with great hands. The camp was conducted in association with Corporates, Residents Associations, Municipalities, Grama Panchayaths, Clubs and Kudumbasree. It was a platform for the Children to exhibit their talents as well as to learn and understand the need for savings and banking in life.



#### **Career Guidance Camp RYLA @ Thrissur**

RYLA Camp, Career Guidance for SSLC students were held for 29 students in Thrissur region on 24<sup>th</sup> January, 2016. The class covered career guidance, time management and exam tips which was handled by Mr. Deepu, Marketing Manager, HDFC, Palakkad who is also an expertise in social work field and Ms. Lissy Jacob, Project Officer, Entrepreneurship. There was also a face to face interaction session arranged for the students to increase their confidence level despite the barriers they face in life.



#### **Onam Souhrudam**

Onam Souhrudam was held for the Sponsorship students from different centers of Rajgiri outREACH and Sahrudaya Services and Charities at Rajagiri Higher Secondary School Auditorium on 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2016. Rev. Fr. Jose Cletus Plackal CMI, Provincial, SH Province inaugurated the function by lighting the lamp. The main programmes for the day were Floral Carpet and Paper Craft competition, Fun and General knowledge Quiz, Tongue twisters, Dance and Group song competition, different

outdoor games and a traditional Onasadhya was served. The Chief Guest of the function was Master Gaurav Menon (Best Child Artist, National Film Award, 2015). Viswajyothi centre was judged as the best centre for the year.

#### **Initiative for Child Friendly Kerala (ICFK)**

The Initiative for Child Friendly Kerala (ICFK) project is a new venture initiated in the month of April and in association with UNICEF, Chennai. The main activities were Children's Manifesto Preparation, Press Conference by children and interaction with the political party leaders. The programme concentrated the selected children from 10 LSG's namely Aavoli, Aarakuzha, Kalady, Edavanakkad, Kunnathunad, Nedumbassery, Kadamakkudy, Pothanikkad, Edakattuvayal and Mulavukad in Ernakulam District.



Children's Manifesto was prepared in relation to the legislative elections held and 30 students were participated. Press conference, interactions with political party leaders, Manifesto release at Trivandrum press club were the complete process underwent in the programme initiated by UNICEF. Selected students from neighboring panchayaths of Ernakulam had given training on child rights and budget existing in LSGs for child right initiatives. The training was held at Rajagiri and 90 students were participated. The representatives of Rajagiri outREACH had participated in the consultation for preparing 5 year plan of UNICEF conducted for NGO's and other stakeholders held at Thiruvananthapuram on 15<sup>th</sup> June 2016. Policy discussion with children as a consultation for preparing 5 year plan of UNICEF was held on 18-Jun-16 and 26 children and 30 youths had participated.

Releasing of Children's Charter and distribution of charter to newly elected MLA's was held on 14<sup>th</sup> July, 2016 at Kerala Legislative Assembly Conference Hall, Thiruvananthapuram. The releasing was done by Mr. P. Sreeramakrishnan, Honourable Speaker, Kerala Legislative Assembly. Training for leaders of 10 Bala Panchayaths and formation of Child Protection Committee are other important events of the project supported by UNICEF, Chennai.

#### Formation of Children's Grama Sabha

With the support of UNICEF, a Children's Grama Sabha was organized at Nedumbassery Grama Panchayath. It is for the first time a Panchayath has took initiative for conducting children's Grama Sabha at ward level with a participation of 1670 children of 19 wards. The students of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences and St. Teresa's College, Ernakulam joined hands with Rajagiri outREACH to conduct such a novel venture.

#### Inauguration of Child Friendly Panchayth Initiative at Nedumbassery

The inauguration of Bala Panchayat activities of Nedumbassery Panchayth with support of ICFK-Rajagiri outreach was held on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2016 at Grama Panchayth office hall. Mr. E P Jayarajan Ex. Minster for Sports, Govt. of Kerala inaugurated the function. Anal K Achu, President Bala Panchayat Nedumbasserry Grama panchayat presided over the function. Mr. Anwar Sadath MLA, Nedumbasserry

to all the concerned committees and government departments. 10 children (5 boys and 5 girls) along with officials from Rajagiri outREACH and UNICEF visited Trivandrum and an interaction with Kerala State Commission for Protection of Child Rights was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2016 at their office. Ms. Sobha Koshy- Chairperson, KeSCPCR and the commission members Mr.Nazeer Chaliyam, Mr. Babu N and Fr. Philip Parekkatt interacted with the children.



A meeting with Kerala State Human Rights Commission was also held on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2016 at their office. Children had an interaction with Mr. Mohan Das, the Acting Chairman of Human Rights commission about the charter and needs of children.

#### **Higher Education Scholarship Programme**

The programme supports the students from underprivileged families who are doing professional education. RAJAGIRI outREACH has been implementing Women Entrepreneurship programmes in various places with the support of corporates like Apollo Tyres, K.P.Paul Foundation, KITCO Ltd. and Sud Chemie Ltd. The women are provided with skill training on tailoring, handicrafts making, catering service, book binding, jewellery making, cow/goat rearing, poultry farm, beauty parlour, flour mill, mobile eatery shop, soap making, organic farming etc. Terre Des Home, Denmark also has been given assistance for 2 Women Self Help Groups at Arattupuzha in Alapuzha district and Edavanakkad in Ernakulam district, the Tsunami affected villages in Kerala. The programme would enable the women to be economically independent and self reliant. The experience in the field of women entrepreneurship projects proves that the programme is the need of the hour in rural areas as well as in urban areas for the development of women and thus to strengthen the family. In addition to the skill training the women were provided with training on book keeping and accounts, capacity building, public relation, communication skill and team management. Through the training we could motivate them to bring out their inborn skills and use it in a better way to get an earning for their day to day life. Some of them could accommodate other unemployed women into their enterprise. It is worth mentioning that the programmes boost up the self confidence of the women beneficiaries which enable them to get more acceptance in the family as well as in the community.

The project visualizes the sustainability of livelihood activities of Tribals in the target area through the marketing and value addition of products. Tribal promoters training also included in the project of KITCO. The project launching was held on 17th March, 2016 at Kuttampuzha. The beneficiaries were given hamlet based training on reed craft and apiculture by the experts. The beneficiaries appeared for the Artisans Test by the Central Govt. and 29 of them qualified. They attended different melas and 80% of their products were sold by thus. The beneficiaries got an opportunity to interact with the community resides outside of their hamlet by participating in the Melas and exhibitions. The programme certainly did act as a platform to bring them to the main stream of the society which was a significant need of a tribal women community.

Kerala State Aids Control Society (KSACS) working for migrant laborers has entered into its 10th and 8th year in the Ernakulam district spread over 2 project areas respectively based at Ernakulam and Perumbavoor. Rajagiri outREACH is the implementing agency for Suraksha projects functioning at Ernakulam and Perumbavoor sanctioned by Kerala State AIDS Control Society (KSACS) working for migrant laborers. The main objective of the project is to reduce HIV/AIDS prevalence in Kerala targeting migrants in Ernakulam district. Along with HIV/AIDS prevention programme health camps, health education, high risk group identification, STI screening, counseling, ICTC, mega events, exhibitions., film shows, world AIDS day observation were conducted to reduce problems in health, sanitation and hygiene.

#### SURAKSHA MIGRANT PROJECT AT KALAMASSERY

The target population of the TI is 10,000 high risk migrants belonging to Kochi Corporation and neighboring Panchayaths and Municipalities of Ernakulam District. The project covers 5 sites(target areas) and 62 hot spots belonging to Kochi Corporation, Kalamassery, Thripunithura, Aluva, Thrikkakkara, Paravur and Eloor Muncipalities and Varapuzha, Edathala, Alangad, Karumalloor and Kadungallur Grama Panchayaths. The site wise population distribution of our Project area includes Ernakulam (above 50,000), Kakkanad (above30,000), Aluva (above 20000), Kalamassery (above 30,000), and Paravoor(above 20,000).

#### SITE MAP OF THE AREA

The project has registered 9878 migrants through the contacts in the STI clinics and the group meetings in the labour camps for the period of 2016-2017. The project has identified 37906 general migrants. The project has identified 10 doctors. Of them 3 are currently active in providing service in the medical camps organized for the migrants. The doctors are aware of the sydromic treatment protocol. Identified STI cases are followed up. The migrants are taken as a group to the ICTCs.



Ernakulam

As the main objective of TI is condom promotion among migrants, the project created 50 outlets in the target area within the accessibility of the population. Outlets include both

traditional and non traditional, where traditional includes medical shops and nontraditional includes petty shop, theatre, their work place, mobile shop, pan shop etc. In each outlet there will be an in-charge like voluntary peer leader company supervisor shop keepers and so on.. ORW provides the condom as per their demand. In the context of fund shortage, TI could conduct sponsored camps, STI clinics and allied services under the sponsorship of various employers, builders and secondary stakeholders. The Project has distributed 8460 condoms distributed through the Peer Leaders and through the 50 outlets. TI could

provide maximum services for high risk migrants through programmes in cooperation with Metro Rail Project Partners and sub contractors such as L&T , SOMA, Alstom, Menally etc. In the context of fund shortage, TI could conduct sponsored programmes, mega events, STI Clinics and allied services under the sponsorship of various employers, builders and secondary stakeholders. TI could ensure maximum services for HR Migrants through programmes in co-operation with health department , Govt. Of Kerala and its sub-agencies such as PHC, Leporacy division, Malaria division and so on.TI could conduct seven Mega events under the sponsorship of L&T Metro, Leighton LULU, Sobha LULU, Soma Metro and L&T CIAL Nedumbassery.





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# RAJAGIRI FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE (RFCC)

Rajagiri Family Counselling Centre was established in October 1999 as live lab of Rajagiri College of Social Science. There is also a Service Providing Centre established as per the provisions of Domestic Violence act 2005 for providing legal counselling for victims of Domestic Violence. The fund for Counselling Centre given by Central Social Welfare Board, New Delhi and SPC is funded by State Social welfare Board. The main objective of the centre is to strengthen the social fabric of the locality by preventing families from breaking up and promoting harmony in the family. The centre provides counselling services in the areas of family and marital maladjustment, Scholastic Backwardness, loneliness, depression and anxiety, geriatric counselling, grief and loss counselling and crisis interventions. Also provide referral and rehabilitative services.

Currently the Centre employs two Personnel as Counsellors. There is also a legal counsellor for providing legal Counselling in domestic Violence cases. The area of operation for the centre span across the Ernakulum district.

During 2016-17 year FCC deal 144 cases. Most of the cases referred by Kalamassery and Aluva police station, Magistrate Court Kalamaserry, Other referral areas are deferent ICDS, Kudumbasri, Snehitha gender Help Centre, Bhoomika, different schools and colleges. Counseling Centre could light a lamp of hope in 52 cases. Follow ups continuing through phone. Among these cases legal counselling was given for 71 cases. DIR filed in 10 cases. Among these 6 cases filed from the centre through the legal counsellor. 3 women got shelter in short stay home. 7 cases referred to police assistance. 4 cases referred to child guidance centre and around 10 cases got assistance from psychiatrist. 15 cases referred to court for further steps.

**Awareness classes-** The Centre provided 13 awareness classes among various sections of society including Kudumbasri Members, ICDS, Panchayath and municipality members, disabled persons and children. Senior citizens day, Domestic Violence day, Disabled day, women's Day were celebrated at various places by the centre.

**Sub Committee Meeting-** The family counselling centre has a effective subcommittee of social activist, social workers, representatives of local administrative, police and other voluntary organization for achieving the objectives of the scheme and give guidance to the centre for its effective implementation. The sub committee meets quarterly to evaluate the functioning and strengthening the activists of centre. The meeting were held on 17/5/2016, 20-9-2016, 19-2-2017,

**FCC as Live Lab for Social Work Students-** The students of social work get an opportunity to gain experience in the counselling activities of the centre. They also get an idea regarding the steps in counselling and Counselling skills. They associate with Centre for activities like Public awareness camps, classes for children etc.

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# STATE ADOPTION RESOURCE AGENCY (SARA) -KERALA

The State Adoption Resource Agency (SARA) Kerala functions as the executive arm of the State Government for promotion, facilitation, monitoring and regulation of the adoption programme in the State.

It monitored and supervised whether the multi stakeholders of adoption are functioning in adherence to the JJ Act 2015 and Adoption Regulations 2017 and brought to the attention of authorities whenever any deviation occurred.

# **Identifying Adoptable Children in Unauthorized Agencies**

SARA Kerala sought the support and cooperation of all SAA's in identifying adoptable children in unauthorized agencies. It is also aimed at bringing those agencies to the right track of adoption.

# **Foster Care Programme**

Foster Care means placement of a child, by the Child Welfare Committee for the purpose of alternate care in the domestic environment of a family, other than the child's biological family, that has been selected, qualified, approved and supervised for providing such care; Such an arrangement ensures that the birth parents do not lose any of their parental rights or responsibilities. This arrangement shall cater to children who are not legally free for adoption, and whose parents are unable to care for them due to illness, death, desertion by one parent or any other crisis. The aim is to eventually reunite the child with his/her own family when the family circumstances improve, and thus prevent institutionalization of children in difficult circumstances. During the reporting period 24 children were placed in foster care.

# **Sponsorship Programme**

Sponsorship is the provision of supplementary support to families to meet medical, nutritional, educational and other needs of their children with a view to improving the quality of the life. It is a conditional assistance to enable children who were at risk from being removed from school and send for work, to continue their education. .111 Children in various districts are supported through sponsorship scheme.

#### Conclusion

In Kerala the Hon'ble Courts are cooperative in keeping the timelines fixed by CARA. CWCs are supportive in clearing the pending cases. DCPUs are functional in all the 14 districts. Updating and uploading data including registration of all admitted children and PAPs in CARINGS by the Specialised Adoption Agencies and processing the online adoption applications provide transparency in adoption. The SAA- CCI Linkage facilitates the early rehabilitation of orphan, abandoned and surrendered children. Interventions by DCPUs helps to avoid long term institutionalization of children and facilitate family based rehabilitation. Foster Care and Sponsorship programmes are gaining publicity through the intervention of DCPUs and it helped several children in need of Care and Protection. We hope that the joint efforts by all service providers in ICPS will help to give family based care and protection to all the children in need of care and protection.

#### STUDENT WELFARE SERVICES

The Government of kerala has introduced various scholarships awarded to meritorious students of outstanding performance in the education sector as well as to the students of socially and economically backward communities. All information is available at the National Scholarship Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in).

Following are some of the Scholarship Programmes availed by our students

- Kerala State Merit Scholarship is awarded to meritorious students for the first year of the
  Under Graduate and Post Graduate Programmes in Government/ Aided Arts and Science
  Colleges and University Departments. The scholarship is funded by Higher Education
  Department, ie. Directorate of Collegiate Education (DCE) of the Government of Kerala.
- Post Matric Scholarship for Minority Students by the Directorate of Minority Welfare -Scholarship for Minority Students
   Scholarship is awarded to the students who have secured not less than 50% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final examination and Annual income should be below Rs.2 lakh. It is for all courses degree, PG, Ph.D etc. students from recognized unaided institutions will also be considered.

- Central sector scholarships for UG, Professional courses are offered by the Ministry of I Human Resource Department .Students studying in degree courses are eligible to apply. Plus two marks is the criteria. Annual family income should not exceed Rs. 6 lakh. 50% of the scholarship is reserved for girls. It is Rs.12.000/- for degree (each year) and Rs.24,000/- for PG (each year).
- Suvarna Jubilee Scholarship for BPL category only based on their merit. It is sponsored by the Directorate of Collegiate Education. The students would get Rs.10,000/- every year.
- C.H.Muhammed Koya Scholarship- Students from Latin converted Christian, Muslim communities studying degree / PG course, whose annual family income does not exceed Rs.6 lakh, for a girl student studying for the first year of Graduation or Higher courses in Govt./ Aided Institution. During the course of study, scholarship amount would be Rs.5000/- every year whereas, those staying in hostels would get Rs. 12,000/- towards stipend.
- Indira Gandhi single Girl Child Scholarship under the UGC-

Information regarding above scholarships are informed to the students through Notices circulated from the college Office. The students register with the National Online portal and the hard copies of the same are submitted to the office for verification and approval by the Principal.

# Scholarship schemes for the SC/ST & OEC

The College Office disseminate the information related to schemes and programmes for the welfare of the socially weaker section as well as notifications/memoranda, office orders of the Government, or other related agencies/organizations issued from time to time. There is a dedicated Administrative staff who looks into the disbursement of stipends to the Students belonging to the SC,ST & OEC communities. 



Paul Thomas, Centre Incharge (Rajagiri Center for Skill Development) welcomed the gathering, Presidential address was rendered by Dr. Joseph I. Injodey, Executive Director Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Introductory talk by Dr. Binoy Joseph and Key note address by Dr. Augustine A.J HR Head KMRL. Training completion certificate was awarded to all the participants by Ms. Tannie Thomas, District Mission Coordinator, Ernakulam. Vote of thanks was given by Ms. Sheethal Shyam, Transgender Trainee and Activist.

The College imparts an orientation to newly Faculty members on the vision and mission of the college and inturn to help the group of students belonging to the disadvantaged section of society to contain the problems related to discrimination.

# Curbing the menace of Ragging in Rajagiri college of Social Sciences

(as per the "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (third amendment), Regulations, 2016."

RCSS strictly observes the provisions of the Act of the Central Government and the State Governments considering ragging as a cognizable offence. Thus Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, etc) .RCSS takes strict action against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging.

# Measures taken for prevention of ragging at the institution level

**Student Guidelines of the Campus** incorporates all directions of the Supreme Court and /or the Central or State Governments as applicable, so that the candidates and their parents/ guardians are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging.

The application form for admission/enrolment has a printed undertaking, both in English/ and in Malayalam to be **filled up and signed by the candidate** to the effect that he/she is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments, and that he/she, if found guilty of the offence of ragging and/or abetting ragging, is liable to be punished appropriately.

The application form also contain printed undertaking, both in English and in Malayalam to be **signed by the parent/ guardian of the applicant** to the effect that he/ she is also aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/ her ward in case the latter is found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging.

The application for admission is accompanied by a document in respect of the **School Leaving Certificate**/ **Character Certificate** which includes a report on the behavioral pattern of the applicant..

**A student seeking admission to the hostel** have to submit another undertaking along with his/her application for hostel accommodation.

At the commencement of the academic session the Head of the Institution **convene and address** a meeting of various functionaries/agencies, like Wardens, representatives of students, parents/guardians, faculty, district administration including police, to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging in the Institution and steps to be taken to identify the offenders and punish them suitably.

To make the community at large and the students in particular aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging, and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging, **big posters** are prominently displayed on all Notice Boards of all departments, hostels and other buildings as well as at vulnerable places.

The institution has identified, properly illuminated and manned all vulnerable locations.

The institution has tightened security in its premises, especially at the vulnerable places.

#### On admission:-

The institution organizes joint sensitization programmes of 'freshers' and seniors. Freshers are encouraged to report incidents of ragging, either as victims, or even as witnesses.

**The Anti-Ragging Squad** nominated by the Head of the institution consist of members belonging to the various sections of the campus community. The Squad has vigil, oversight and patrolling functions. It is empowered to inspect places of potential ragging and make surprise raids on hostels and other hot spots.

The Anti-Ragging Committee on campus consist of the Head of the institution representatives of faculty members, parents, students belonging to the freshers' category as well as seniors and non-teaching staff. It considers the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad and take appropriate decisions, including spelling out suitable punishments to those found guilty.

#### **Hostels**

Wardens are accessible at all hours and are provided with mobile phones. The security personnel posted in hostels are under the direct control of the Wardens and assessed by them. Access to mobile phones and public phones are unrestricted in hostels and campuses, except in classrooms, seminar halls, and library etc. where jammers shall be installed to restrict the use of mobile phones.

The College Union under the guidance of a Faculty member actively monitors, promotes and regulates healthy interaction between the freshers and senior students.

Freshers' welcome parties is organized in each department by the senior students and the faculty together soon after admissions, in the presence of the faculty.

The institution enhances the student-faculty interaction by involving the students in all matters of the institution, except those relating to the actual processes of evaluation and of faculty appointments.
