Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) is one among the few colleges in the state of Kerala which has been granted autonomous status by University Grants Commission, with effect from June 1, 2014. The autonomous status provided to the college will help the college prescribe its own relevant courses of study and syllabi, design student focused wide choices of courses, periodically update syllabus and conduct examinations and notify results in a timely manner. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (RCSS) was given the status of "College with Potential for Excellence" by University Grants Commission.

The motto of the College is "Relentlessly towards Excellence" and this is achieved by strict measures of quality management in pedagogy, learning resources, training and infrastructural support.

The college is located in two sprawling campuses in Kochi- the Hill Campus at Kalamassery and the Valley Campus at Kakkanad. The Hill Campus houses the School of Social Work, School of Computer Science, School of Library and Information Science, School of Commerce, School of Business Administration and Rajagiri Centre for Behavioural Science and Research. The School of Business Administration offers Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA). Rajagiri Centre for Behavioural Science and Research offers Bachelor of Business Administration offers Bachelor of Psychology (B.Sc. Psy.) and Master of Psychology (MSc. Psy).

The Valley Campus houses the School of Management. The School of Management offers Ph.D in Management, the two year full time Master of Business Administration (MBA) and Master of Human Resource Management (MHRM) programmes.

The study aims to unearth the present situation of elderly women in the state especially related to the issues they are facing in availing and utilising the existing services. The data to be collected from 540 elderly women, 180 care takers of elderly women and 30 Key personnel from the selected six districts of Kerala.

#### Workshop for Women on Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

The National Commission for Women, Govt. India has decided to conduct a state level Awareness Generation Workshop for Women in Kerala on 'Water, Sanitation and Hygiene' in association with the Research Institute, RCSS. The aim of the workshop is to disseminate the relevant information on the importance of women's role in the effective utilization of water, sanitation and hygiene facilities. Rural and Urban women comprising housewives, functionaries of non-governmental organizations, house maids, women in the unorganized sector, Kudumbashree members, self employed women, animators, etc. will participate in the programme. The workshop will also act as a forum for the women coming from the different locations of the state to share their views on the subject and the prevailing problems they are facing and to put forward suggestions for enhancing a healthy life style.

#### Gender Violence in Kerala, a study to expose the pattern and incidence

The Research Institute has conducted a research study on 'Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Kerala under the sponsorship of Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR). The study covered 1400 women victims of gender violence in public sphere (514).and private sphere (886) from 14 districts of Kerala. The findings of the study highlight the need for more legal literacy campaigns among the women.

# PLACEMENT

• Pre-Placement Trainings

MSW Programme in Rajagiri is having two aided batches where in 50 students graduate every year specialising in Medical and Psychiatric Social Work, Family and Child Welfare, and Community Development. During the two years of their study spanning across four semesters, a student undergo more than 1000 hours of field practicum under the guidance of faculty supervisor. Students are placed in different settings according to their specialisations such as Rural and Urban Communities, Schools, Hospitals, NGOs, Companies, Govt Projects and schemes, Social action and advocacy groups etc. As a part of the studies more than 50% students from the Programme complete International Exposure Programme every year with different Universities in USA, Australia, Belgium, France, Switzerland, Hong Kong, Israel, Malaysia, Nepal, Middle East Countries etc.

Rajagiri College is having the presence of 'Live Labs', which are the extension projects of the School of Social Work in which students get exposure to do field practicum as well as volunteering opportunities to various live projects such as Govt sponsored Projects as well as CSR Projects.

The School of Social Work continuously maintain a placement percentage average of 95% for a long span of time which is spread through different settings and sectors.

Placement Process:

1. Placement Pooling

The prospective agencies are pooled into a data base by the placement committee selected for each year which contains student representatives under the guidance of placement cell. The placement brochure is also prepared which contains the details of the candidates

2. Pre placement preparations

The candidates are given pre placement preparatory sessions by eminent resource persons on communication skill, CV Preparation, GD and interview specific skills, self-grooming, subject specific inputs etc 3. Application process

Applications are invited from the students regarding their interests in the sectors as well as settings along with their specific experiences. The detailed CV is collected from the students or they can express third interest on specific placements to placement cell 4. Job offer announcements

The job details/opportunities with details (including the campus interviews) will be publicized to the prospective candidates so that they may apply directly with the concurrence as well as attend the campus interview process.

# 5. Confirmations

The placement cell will be the link between the employers well as the candidates to facilitate the process which aid in placement of the selected candidates

6. Follow ups

The placement cell also collect the feedback from the employers and document the timely suggestions received so that the suggestions are incorporated in curriculum design and delivery. The placement cell also get in contact with the candidates who need further placement support in their career.

# Placement Training(2017-18):

1. Language training was given to the whole batch of students on speaking and writing skills with special thrust on Group discussions and presentation in Interviews. The sessions were given by the faculty members from the School of Languages, RCSS

2.Grooming session done by Ms Molly Zara Mathew in the month of February 2018 to equip the candidates on basic grooming for the job interviews and GDs

3. Session on Study abroad/work abroad was given by Dr Josy (Australia) for the whole batch and the session focussed on the process and challenges for studying and working abroad.

4.Session on CV/Biodata preparation was given by Dr Rajeev S P(School of Social Work) with hands on training for the batch

# **INNOVATIONS AND BEST PRACTICES**

# Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the school.

# • U3A- University of 3<sup>rd</sup> Age

A unique and novel initiative was the project called – "University of the  $3^{rd}$  Age" where the students taught the basics of windows and android technology to the senior citizens of Kalamassery Municipality.

Uni versity of 3<sup>rd</sup> Age programme was aimed at enhancing new age technical skills start new ventures and find post retirement employment among the elderly people. This is organised in association with the NGO, MAGICS. The programme was imparted for a period of three months. One student was assigned one senior citizen to teach. This was a mutual exchange of knowledge and experiences. It not only created a one-to-one intimate relationship with the elderly, but also gave the elderly an opportunity to relive their past. This gathered lot of appreciation from the



elderly, the government as well as the community. Course certificates were distributed for the elderly during DYUTI national conference on 7th January 2018.

# • BEST PRACTICES OF THE SCHOOL

#### Participation in the social initiatives in the neighbourhood

The students are involved in the social and community activities and programmes through live lab projects as part of their curriculum and also through additional social extension programmes. To quote a few, Medical Camps, Community Awareness Programmes on HIV/AIDS, Sexuality and Reproduction, Family Life Education, Adolescent Education etc. Also, the NSS wing of the college is active in social sensitization camps, surveys and programmes that promotes social sensitivity among the students. Faculty members are also involved in social development projects through training and capacity building, research, planning, evaluation and consultancy services. Every year, Suchitwa Bodhana Yajnam is organized from 1st January to 15th January.

- Solar energy is the main source of non-conventional energy used by the college through grid-connected system. This is done in association with Kerala State Electricity Board (KSEB). Excess electricity produced is fed back into the grid and supplied when required. This partially supports us in eliminating the expense of electricity storage devices like batteries. The grid connected system has a capacity of 50 KW and the average consumption is 200 units per day.
- The college has a sewage treatment plant with a sewage inflow capacity of 35 cum per day. The waste water is treated and used for watering plants. The institute also has a rainwater harvesting unit which holds and conserves 75,000 litres of water. The college also promotes the installation of rainwater harvesting units in its auxiliary institutions including boys/girls hostels.



• As part of Sustainable Environment Education Programme (SEEP), inside the campus, rainwater is tapped through rain water flow traps (VAZHI OZHUKKU THADA) and collected in groundwater reservoir which is utilized for multiple purposes.

- The college has a waste segregation unit. As part of this, separate waste bins for biodegradable and plastic are placed in all junctions inside the campus. Food waste is used to make vermin compost (organic fertilizer) as well as for pig farming. Plastic and paper wastes are sold to agencies who recycle dry wastes for multiple purposes. An approximate of 100 kg manure is generated out of waste every month.
- Organized Women safety and self-defense class for the Kudumbashree members in Alangad panchayat on 19<sup>th</sup> January 2018. The class was handled by the Vanitha Police Officers from Aluva Vanitha Cell.
- Legal awareness classes conducted for Kudumbashree members in 21 wards at Edathala Panchayat on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2018 in collaboration with Students of Bharath Matha College of legal studies as resource persons. The topic discussed included Protection from domestic violence, special provisions for women in Indian Penal Code 1860 and Criminal Procedure Code 1973.

# CURRICULAR ASPECTS

# > Curriculum Revision (2017-18)

Latest curriculum revision was done in the year 2016-17 and the next revision is proposed to be conducted in the year 2018-19 for the intake of 2019-20.

#### > Innovations in Pedagogy

Rajagiri Immersive Learning Methodology is a pedagogical innovation of Rajagiri School of Management - RCSS. Rajagiri Immersive Learning experience consists of a set of programmes designed to mould competent and socially responsible managers to perform in a dynamic business environment. The methodology consists of carefully drafted activities and events designed to create lasting change in the student's personality. The student engagement activities are aligned with the Rajagiri Immersive Learning Experience which is comprised of four dimensions as follows:

# **Conceptual Learning:**

Through case discussions, lectures and seminars students are introduced to the concepts and theoretical framework of management and business. Students are also introduced into worlds of business through business update sessions and research projects.

#### **Experiment Engagement:**

The experiment engagement activities help students get immersed into the practical realm of management through various activities like Rural Sensitization camp, Vanavasam, field work, field projects and students learn from doing and experience.

#### **Executive Modelling:**

Rajagiri ensures that the students develop the winning abilities and skills to create a great impression at work and advance in their professional life.

#### **Corporate Competency**:

Students are made industry ready through continuous interaction with industry professionals.

#### > Assurance of Learning Reforms

The MBA/ MHRM programmes have adopted Learning Outcome (LO) based evaluation which is linked with the internal assessment marks and forms a part of the total marks. The institute adopts the national and international accreditation standards for Assurance of learning.

A review of the present assessment plan was done in order to streamline the process and put it in line with international accreditation standards. Two outside consultants were called in for the purpose namely Dr Natarajan, Former Director TAPMI and



IRMA, and Dr Bala from NMIMS Bombay. The Assessment Plan is being prepared on this basis.

The revised Assurance of Learning plan was prepared. There are Programme Learning Goals (PLG) which every management student should attain when he/she completes the respective programmes (MBA or MHRM), which is derived from the Mission of School of Management- RCSS. Based on the PLGs of each programme (MBA/MHRM), Programme Learning Outcomes (PLO) are formulated



The programme has a detailed AoL system for the assessment and improvement of PLGs and PLOs through external and internal measures.

The mapping of PLOs to courses (curriculum map) is prepared during the annual planning retreat by the respective areas. The course instructors decide on the assessment method and measures. Faculty has the responsibility for the assessment of PLO mapped to the course and the submission of summary of the results to the concerned officials within timeframe mentioned in the assessment plan.

#### **Internal Assessment Procedure**

A curriculum map is created to ensure that the PLOs are aligned to courses or curricula. In the course plan, course learning objectives were linked to programme Learning outcomes. The measurement of the Learning Outcome is based on outcome based rubric or Embedded question.

#### **External Assessment Procedure**

There are a number of external measures by which Graduate Attributes are assessed. The following are some of them.

# 1. Assessment and Development Centre (ADC)

The Assessment and Development Centre undertakes the first level assessment of each student enrolled in the management programmes of Rajagiri at the beginning of their programme. Senior HR Professionals from across India come to carry out multiple interventions on the students. Each student meets at least two assessors in the course of undergoing a battery of exercises and is scored on each competency. This pre-assessment score helps to benchmark the progress and development of the students on the different Graduate Attributes through the course.

This year the competency development programme and individual evaluation of each student was conducted in the month of July for all junior batches of MBA, MHRM (July 8, 15 & 16, 2017).

The ADC facilitates the holistic development of students by providing a clear understanding of each student's strengths or developmental needs and focusing on their further professional development through a structured process of consistent, rigorous evaluation of their competency profile.

# 2. Summer Internship and AoL

The next external assessment is when students go for their 2-month summer internship. The guide in the organization they are attached gives the assessment reports for each student.

#### Assessment Committee

An assessment committee was formed to plan, measure, analyse and report the different processes related to the assessment of LOs. The Rubric Scores of Program Learning Outcomes are discussed by Assessment Committee and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for further action.

The subject wise scores between the internal (Faculty) and external evaluators (ADC) are compared for consistency/deviation/patterns. This data helps the instructor and the institution for facilitating continuous improvement and closing the loop actions. Year over year improvements in the programme are implemented using the PLO trends.

• FEDENA the online learning management system



## 2. Tutorials

Tutorials are scheduled for two hours every week by the respective teachers. This happens throughout the first semester/ trimester. Faculty members communicate the subject they will be teaching in advance to SSC. The students are informed and those who wish to attend can do so. An afternoon is set aside every week for this exercise.

## 3. Mentoring Process

The mentoring process at Rajagiri is to guide students to chart out their individual development plan on the basis of three types of exercises. Mentor meetings are scheduled and mentors are required to guide the students to identify suitable value added courses to strengthen the Programme Learning Goals. Each mentee has a separate file which tell of the progress of the student from Assessment and Development Centre to the end of his programme in the co-curricular area.



With the aim of inculcating entrepreneurial skills in the minds of students and young innovators, Rajagiri has set up a unit for Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC) in the campus called LE COCON. 



## **Rajagiri Center for Behavioural Science and Research (RCBSR)**

#### INTRODUCTION

The Rajagiri Centre for Behavioural Sciences and Research (RCBSR) started in September 2016, with the vision to "Be a Center for Mental Health Services and Training Mental Health Professionals." It has three wings - Academics, Research and Practice- to execute its mission "to train mental health professionals, to carry out researches relevant for the growth of discipline and to serve mental health needs of the community."

- Academics- RCBSR currently offers two academic programmes M.Sc. Psychology (with a clinical leaning) and B.Sc. Psychology. The department currently follows the 2017 revised MG University syllabus for B.Sc. Apart from the syllabus, the curriculum include research projects every year, additional internships, field trips and new method of teaching theory and test.
- **Research** Special Emphasis is given to developing research skills by ensuring students of every batch of UG and PG programs do a yearly research under the guidance of the faculty. Under-graduate and post graduate students conduct at least two research study during their program duration.
- **Practice** From 2018, RCBSR also runs a Psychiatric clinic with a fulltime psychiatrist and a Psychological Clinic with a fulltime Clinical Psychologist that caters to the psychological requirement of the community around.

**Mission:** Our mission is to train mental health professionals, to carry out researches relevant for growth of discipline and to serve mental health needs of the community.

# **TRAINING DIVISION**

## **EMPANELLED TRAINING INSTITUTION (ETI) FOR NSS**

(Empanelled by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India)

The Empanelled Training Instituion for NSS, Kerala – Lakshadweep region is one of the 24 Training Centres empanelled by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India to impart training to the Programme Officers of National Service Scheme. This Training Centre has been functioning on the Hill Campus of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) Kalamassery since 1970. The Programme Officers from all the Universities and Directorates in the State of Kerala and Union Territory of Lakshadweep attend Training Programmes at this ETI. We have trained more than 10,000 Programme Officers so far. A brief account of Orientation Courses conducted by this ETI for the year 2017-18 is given below;

#### ETI Advisory Committee

The Advisory Committee of the ETI consists of NSS Regional Director, Govt. of India, State NSS Officer, Govt. of Kerala, Programme Co-ordinators of all the Universities and Directorates in the State as members, Director of ETI as chairman and Training Co-ordinator as member secretary. At the beginning of every academic year we convene a meeting of Advisory Committee and disscuss all matters regarding the effective conduct of training programmes and formulate the training calander for the year. The meeting of Advisory Committee for the reporting year was conducted on  $03^{rd}$  May 2017 at the Kakkanad Campus of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. The Committee approved the proposal of 20 Orientation Courses and finalized the Training Calendar for the year 2017-18.

This is the State level training centre in Kerala to train supervisors of 258 ICDS projects in the State. 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## **RAJAGIRI CENTRE FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT (RCSD)**

#### INTRODUCTION

The Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development, an offshoot of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), is an initiative that was created to promote and the encourage skill-development of marginalised demographics. "Skill", the operative word increases and catalyses development and employment. The institution is focused on engaging, involving and evolving as an independent institutional wing to empower the needy masses through skill rendering.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences became the Project Implementing Agency (PIA) for Rural, Urban and other skill related programs. Appropriate projects and skills were identified by the Rajagiri Centre for Skill Development. Strategically chosen target groups' (defined by factors such as socio-economic levels, educational background and presence of social capital) were considered based on adaptability and employability factors. With an appreciation of these circumstances, skills were identified which would be suitable. It is from these beginnings that the institution envisages becoming a leading and primary source for rendering and enabling skill know-how.

The department started on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2015 with short term courses on Data Entry Operator, Hospitality-Housekeeping and Unarmed Security Supervisor

#### **MOBILIZATION OF CANDIDATES**

The target group of DDU-GKY project are poor rural youth in the age group of 18 to 35. Beginning two months prior to the course commencement, candidates are mobilised via co-ordination with Grama Panchayath and Kudumbashree officials (Panchayath President, CDS chairperson and ADS members). Aptitude test, developed by John Holland is administered to prospective students during the course of mobilisation. On-field registration and short interviews are held.



The details, comprising of name, qualification, presence and level of job experience, family details, interests, contact details etc. are noted in the register and if selected by the PIA are asked to come for a general orientation which would involve of all the <u>selected trainees assembling</u> together.



#### TRAINING

This process comprises of two months (60 days) of classroom training, followed by one month (30days) of on-the-job-training totalling 90days. The total training duration is spread over 576 hours, with 416 hours spent on core skill acquisition and 160 hours dedicated to peripheral skillsets.

Academic orientation comprises of classes on the main skill set being acquired, English, Computer Skills, and Soft skills.

Personality Development and confidence building activities are mixed within in the primary skillset curriculum by means of individual and group exercises. Individual exercises comprise of presentations, skillbased individual thematic presentations, role plays, and self-introductory exercises. Team building exercises, group games, debates, skits and group presentations are all a part of group exercises.

Participation of students in day and festival celebrations, state-wide competitions and celebrations also contribute towards self-confidence building. The programmes are organised amongst the students, with particular attention and opportunities afforded to less confident students.





Soft skills training and Personal Counselling sessions were given, a major contributing factor for attitudinal transition amongst students. The PIA places much emphasis on such movements, which in turn assist the ascertainment of basic skills that need to be nurtured to foster self-esteem and confidence.



Industrial visits to different organisations also assists in personal and professional morale boosting.



#### **EVALUATION AND FEEDBACK/MONITORING**

The feedback form is administered twice during the course process. A general overview and review of the feedback given by the candidates is carried out by the Centre In charge with staff. Following this process, improvements and remedial measures are made wherever necessary.

The students are also asked to give individual evaluations and feedback about training to ensure that feedback reflects their honest opinions and perceptions.

An operational review is done through staff meetings internally and meetings with the CEO are chaired by Centre In Charge.

The process review is conducted based on Standard Operating Procedure (SOP).

Regular inspections from National Institute for Rural Development (NIRD), Hyderabad and State Rural Livelihood Mission (SRLM) are carried out with adherence to the DDU-GKY SOP Guidelines, the evaluation yardstick of the PIA.

#### PLACEMENT

The DDU-GKY project has a placement component of with trainees are provided 12 months post-placement support and tracking by the PIA. This is a vital aspect of the project as it assists in ascertaining the success of the project via increased measurability

The placement wing of DDU-GKY Rajagiri comprises of a Placement Head, Tracking Officer and Programme Officer who are adequately supported by the domain trainers. They report and are accountable to the Centre In Charge of the PIA.

The placement cell is in charge of scheduling the on-the-job training, followed by employment. Usually the on-the-job training extends as source of employment for majority of the trainees.

The placement cell co-ordinates with various agencies, the preferred sources of employment. Before the OJT/placement, the students are subjected to industrial counselling wherein they list their preferred areas and availabilities for employment. They are then provided employment in accordance with these desires as much as possible. Some prospective employers visit the college and conduct personal interviews to recruit trainees. In instances where such visits are not possible, the trainees are also asked to visit employers.

Placement for the trainees is always ensured by giving them employment that suits their convenience and eligibility. Compensation terms are always on par with the prevailing market rates. In instances where trainees are not being paid industry-accepted wages the PIA will also investigate and advocate on their behalf.

#### **TRACKING PROCESS-**

The tracking process involves trainees being called by the Placement Tracking Officer in the first week of every month to ascertain their status of employment. They are also called on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of every month to receive an update on their salary payment, and during the end of the month to confirm their status of employment. The trainees are entitled to submit their salary slip or copy of the bank statement. During the process of tracking their concerns are also addressed with the organisation intervening and contacting the employer if need be. Naturally, considering the sometimes chaotic lives the trainees can live there is always the possibility of them discontinuing their employment. In order to combat this and decrease such instances, the organisation engages in active monitoring and checking in for the aforementioned 12 month period. Respective employers are contacted and their concerns and opinions in relation to the candidate are recorded and utilised as a baseline for midcourse correction. Such issues are quickly acted upon to ensure that they do not lose their employment.

#### **INNOVATIONS**

#### **Opening of Satellite Centres**

Initiated Satellite Centres in Cherthala, Kodungalloor and Kothamangalam for extending skill training programmes under DDU-GKY for candidates from rural areas. Each centre is having capacity for training 70 students.

For students from urban areas, new centres are initiated at Angamali, Muvattupuzha, Thrippunithura and Kadavanthara. All training centres are active.



#### **DDU-GKY PwD Project**

MoU has been signed between Rajagiri College of Social Sciences and Government of Kerala (SRLM) for launching of Skill Training Programme for Persons with Disability (PwD) under DDU-GKY PwD Project. It is a special project and is being implemented by a Project Implementing Agency for the first time in India.

#### **CONCLUSION**

The scope for a considerable up-scaling and expansion of programming exists currently, and with the appropriate linkages (public, private and donor-related), technical support and design for the future course of strategic programming, Rajagiri DDU-GKY skill development programme, the potential to become flagship programs in rural areas on how to demonstrate an effective capacity-building program for livelihoods development, and skills training through placement linked training and education.

#### I. Research Studies

The incorporating objective of the Research Institute is to spearhead activities related to research on various relevant areas in the field of social sciences. Since its inception in 1973, the Institute has undertaken 143 research studies on different socially relevant areas like Women & children, Health & Nutrition, Senior citizens, Youth, HIV/AIDS, Evaluation of Projects/Programmes, Need assessment of various communities/localities, Consumer demands etc. The studies were mainly sponsored by World Bank, ADB, UNICEF, ILO and Ministries/Departments of the Central and State Governments.

During the year 2017-18, the Institute has completed a research study titled 'Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private Spheres of Life in Kerala', sponsored by the Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi and initiated the preliminary works of the other research project titled 'Issues related to care of Elderly Women in Kerala', sponsored by National Commission for .Women (NCW), Govt. of India. The details of the studies are as follows;

## Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private (family) spheres of life in Kerala

It is heartening to see that the Gender based violence –the most discussed topic in the state of Kerala recently has been steadily increasing. The situation emphasizes the need for unearthing the pathetic situation of women victims of violence and to formulate appropriate policies/programmes for preventing such incidences in the future and for improving the life situations of women victims.

It is in this regard, the Research Institute in association with ICSSR has carried out a two years study on Concept, Pattern and Incidence of Gender Violence in Public and Private (family) spheres of Kerala. The data were collected from 1400 women victims of gender violence in the 14 districts of Kerala. In addition, 70 key personnel viz; Officials from Police Dept./Women Cell, Social Workers/Activists/Nirbhaya Committee members, Family Counselors and Jagratha Samithi were contacted from each of the districts for further information related to the study.

The findings of the study exposed an encouraging trend in this regard that more women are coming forward to report the incidents of gender violence. It might be attributed to factors viz. the high literacy rate of women, increased enrolment rate of girls in schools and colleges, women in workforce and numerous women empowerment programmes organised by the various state and central Govt. Departments along with the effective involvement of Non-Governmental Organisations (NGO). The results also highlighted the need for more legal literacy campaigns among the women. The lack of awareness regarding the available services meant for the victims was found to be a major hurdle for the victims and calls for frequent awareness generation programmes to avail, access and utilize these services. The study further suggests for more counselling centres at local level and shelter homes at district level for the women and children in distress. It also recommended effective networking and co-ordination of various services for victims, along with strict enforcement of laws.

#### Issues related to care of Elderly Women in Kerala

Care for elderly is becoming a major concern for the policy makers all over the world due to the growing trend of elderly population. Due to economic well-being, better health care system, good medicines, etc. there is substantial reduction in mortality and fertility in the society which together resulted in increasing number of elderly persons in the population. According to Population Census 2011, there are nearly 104 million elderly persons (53 million females and 51 million males) in India. State-wise, Kerala has maximum proportion of elderly population (12.6%). Among the elderly, the care needed for women are different from that of men. They are more physically, emotionally and economically dependent on others compared to men. A good number of elderly women in the state are facing many problems like; absence of assured and sufficient income to support themselves, loss of a social role and recognition, non-availability of opportunities for creative and effective use of free time, etc. Thus, the plight of the elder women in the state is very pathetic. Since the women are already marginalised, the higher life expectancy and the widowhood make them doubly marginalized.

It is in this regard, the National Commission for Women, Govt. of India has decided to conduct a study on 'Issues related to the care of elderly women in Kerala'. The Research Institute was entrusted to carry out the study in the state. The study will be conducted in 6 districts (two from each of the 3 regions) having high concentration of elderly women in Kerala. From each of the district 2 rural and 1 urban localities will be selected. Thus, a total 540 elderly women, 180 caretakers of elderly women and 30 Key personnel will be interviewed from the selected 18 LSGs.

#### **II. Action Research Projects**

With a wide vision that research should lead to action, the institute expanded its spectrum of activities to action research. So far, the Institute has successfully completed five action research projects - two of them were income generating projects for tribal women and the rest were water supply and sanitation projects (Jalanidhi).

#### Jalanidhi Projects......

Jalanidhi is a drinking water and health & sanitation project which has been implemented by the Govt. of Kerala through the Kerala Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (KRWSA). This world Bank assisted project is not just a water supply project rather this is a tool for community development, akin to the ripples that increasingly reach outwards when the still and calm surface of pond is touched, this project is intended to trigger off far reaching changes not merely in water supply but in the very way of life of the rural community. The overall Development Objective of the Jalanidhi Project is to assist the Government of Kerala in improving the quality of rural water supply and environmental sanitation service delivery to achieve sustainability of investments.

So far, the Instituted has completed 3 Jalanidhi projects; 1.Moothedam Grama Panchayat, Malappuram district, 2.Chendamangalam Grama Panchayat, Ernakulam district and 3. Vannappuram Grama Panchayat, Idukki district. At present, the Institute is implementing its fourth project (Batch-III) at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam district.

#### Project at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat, Kottayam

The project commenced in 2015, has formed 26 beneficiary groups (BGs) in Nedumkunnam GP to implement the water supply and sanitation schemes in the Panchayat. The project is now at its completion stage s the civil works of almost all the schemes are completed. Adv.Mathew T Thomas, Hon'ble Minister for Water Resources inaugurated the first water supply scheme at Nedumkunnam Grama Panchayat. Dr.N.Jayaraj, MLA, Kanjirapilly, presided over the function wherein Shri.Anto Antony, M.P, Pathanamthitta was the Chief Guest.



Later, a few more BGs also inaugurated their water supply schemes. Around 1700 households are expected to benefit from the 23 schemes to be implemented in the Panchayat. Further, 250 latrines were constructed in the Panchayat as part of the sanitation component of the project.



#### III. Trainings/Workshops/Seminars

Training programme is yet another area where the Institute has been very active for more than half a decade. In the past, around **450 training programmes** were organized for the various stakeholders viz; students, SC & ST medical/ engineering entrants, women, family counselors, functionaries of voluntary organizations and corporate bodies, probation officers, NGO representatives, health professionals, drivers etc. The major areas of training/workshops/ seminar were; road safety, health and sanitation, science & technology,

women and children, tribal welfare, human resource development, local self government, watershed management, environment, solid waste management, etc.

During the year 2017-18, the Institute has organized a one day seminar on 'Wetlands for sustainable urban development'.

#### World Wetland Day Celebrations.....

Kerala one of the green states of India and well known for its wetlands has about 217 wetland areas. Wetland systems directly or indirectly support thousands of people providing goods and services to them. However, the degradation and loss of wetlands and their biodiversity imposes major economic and social losses and costs on the ecosystem. It is largely attributed to urban development activities viz. infrastructure provision, waste dumping, effluent discharge into wetlands, etc. A number of programmes have been initiated by the various Govt. agencies including Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) in this regard. The KSCSTE observes World Wetland Day (WWD) on February 2nd of every year. The theme for the year 2018 is "Wetlands for a Sustainable Urban Future".

Accordingly, the Institute in association with KSCSTE has observed World Wetlands Day (WWD 2018) by organizing a one day seminar on the theme followed by an intra college quiz competition for the students and teachers. The objective of the programme was to make the students and teachers aware about the concept of bio-diversity in wetlands, strategies for wetland conservation and the importance of wetlands for urban green space resulting taking up feasible sustainable urban development measures.



The seminar was inaugurated by Dr.U.M Chandrasekharan, Scientist, Kerala Forest Research Institute (KFRI). More than 100 participants including students and faculty members from various colleges in Ernakulam district got wide awareness on the importance of wetlands and the need for conserving it. Further, the quiz programme conducted motivated the students to collect more information on wetland before the seminar. The feedback from the participants showed that their knowledge/Awareness on wetlands was poor and it has now been considerably increased.

#### IV. Documentation

A full-fledged documentation centre is maintained by the Institute for dissemination of knowledge among the scholars and the academia. It has a wide collection of books, journals, CDs, study reports, leaflets, pamphlets, newsletters of development agencies/NGOs, news clippings on women, children, Senior citizens, tribal, eco-tourism, water & sanitation, road safety, pulses and literature on general topics.

The institute has a publication wing that focuses on the dissemination of the findings and conclusions of the various research studies. The reports of all the training programmes organized are also documented for academic reference.

#### CHILD EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME

The objective of the child sponsorship programme is to ensure the holistic development of the child which enables them to become self-reliant through education, timely guidance and motivation, in spite of their poor socio-economic background. Child sponsorship programme is to ensure that the child continues to stay with his/her family of any sort (either with parents or other relatives or in foster care) and is NEVER institutionalized. For a better future, sponsorship programme reaches out to deserving children. Rajagiri outREACH is supporting 2862 children from all over Kerala.

#### 1) **Educational Kit/Sponsorship Aid Distribution**

With the support of the Development Committeesof the concerned area, School kits (bags, books, umbrellas etc) were distributed to 2862 sponsored students at 26 centers. The distribution was carried out

in the months of May & June 2017.MLA's, LSG representatives, Corporate Heads and Various NGO representatives were present in the functions.

Child sponsorship aid was distributed to 70 children belongs to Edavanakkad, Tsunami affected village in Ernakulam district which was supported by T.D.H Denmark .The program was held at Tsunami hall,

Edavanakkad, Ernakulam district on January 2018. K.U Jeevan Mithra, Edavanakkad Panchayath president was the chief guest of the programme.

#### **Innovative Fund Distribution**

As part of child sponsorship program an Innovative Fund distribution was held in 11 centers benefiting 161 sponsorship children. Cycle, table and chair, solar lantern and almirah were distributed to the children according to their need.

#### 2) Children's Meeting

Sponsored children's meetings were conducted on monthly basis in Saturdays/holidays, with an aim to develop their academic as well as extracurricular activities, skills etc. A review of academic performance of the children is undertaken during the meetings. These meetings help to

The Green Certification from the District Administration was awarded by Sri. K.Muhammed Y Zafarulla IAS, District Collector, Ernakulam. Mr.C.K. Mohanan,

These meetings were a place for the parents to express their views, concerns and expectations about the project as well as opportunities to discuss general matters affecting their life. Almost all the parents attended the meetings and stood for the

success of activities. In total, 50 parents meetings were conducted during the reporting period.

## 12) SOUHRUDAM CAMP -2017

A total of 40 camps(three day vacation camp) was conducted at various centers involving 4252 children aged between 5-15 years based on the topic Immini Ballya Njan during April/May months of 2017 belongs to the 8 districts (Kannur, Kozhikode, Thrissur, Palakkad, Ernakulam, Idukki, Alappuzha and Pathanamthitta). The camp pave way to help children to identify their strengths and was a platform for the children to exhibit their talents as well as to learn and understand their rights, responsibilities and to become Immini Balya Oral (little bigger man)in family and society. The camp was conducted in association with

Onam, the traditional festival of Kerala, was celebrated at every center with colorful cultural programmes and competions like floral carpet making (pookalam) and Onapattu. Prizes were distributed and traditional Onam sadhya/ payasam was served for the children.

Ms. Katheleen Mulligan, a sponsor from U.K. visited outREACH office in June 2017 and spent a day with Merlin, the student sponsored by Ms. Katheleen Mulligan.

## **15) Kinder For Kinder**

Kinder For Kinder, a project of KELI Switzerland (an association of Malayalees residing in Switzerland) is being partnered with Rajagiri outREACH in child sponsorship programme since 2007. Handing over ceremony of Kinder for Kinder sponsorship aid was conducted on 27th June 2017. Sri.P.C.Thomas MLA was the Chief Guest of the function. Mr.Babu Kattupalam, Mr.Pius Palathrakadavil and Mr.Mishel Pius, the representatives from Kinder for Kinder were present on the occasion. They handed over the aid for the academic year



2017-2018 to the MLA and the same was received by Mrs. Mary Joseph, Fr.Shinto andMrs.Meena Kuruvilla representing Rajagiri outREACH. Followed by the programme an interaction with the beneficiary representatives, Kinder for Kinder representatives and the respective staff were conducted. This year, Kinder for Kinder is extending support to 325 children for their school education along with scholarship to 25 students for their higher education for which an amount of Rs.11, 70,000/ is allotted to outREACH

## **16) Christmas Celebration**

Christmas and New Year celebrationswere conducted at various centers. In all centers, the cake was cut by children gathered there.Christmas gift were given to children. Children performed skit and other cultural activities.

## **17) Buds School Support**

As part of CSR programme of Sud Chemie Ltd., School bags, umbrella & uniforms were distributed to the children in the buds school (school for mentally challenged children) at Muppathadam on 14<sup>th</sup> September 2017. Kadungallore Grama Panchayath President, ward members and representatives from Sud Chemie and Rajagiri outREACH were present during the function.

## 18) Initiatives for Child Friendly Kerala

RAJAGIRI outREACH took the responsibility of strengthening of Bala Panchayath at 22 Local Self Governments during this year. The involvement of the Initiative for Child Friendly Kerala Project has created an impact in 22 LSGs, besides the youth involvement has given life to all the Balapanchayaths.MSW, BSW and LLB interns from various colleges were given opportunity to experience



the various aspects of Child Protection and Participation. Final phase of the project took place in the month of April and May 2017.Balapanchayath gatherings took place in all the 22 Municipalities and Grama Panchayaths.

Interaction meeting with members of Legislative Committee for Children, Women and the Handicapped was held on 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2017 as a part of the ICFK (Initiatives for Child Friendly Kerala) programmes. The programme conducted at Ernakulam District Collectorate and was attended by District Collector, officials and the Legislative Committee Members. Selected Child participants represented the ICFK groups and expressed their concerns and suggestions.

**Programmes Conducted By Child Line Malappuram** 

Child line Malappuram had conducted many awareness programmes, open house programs and teachers training programmes at various schools, colleges, Panchayath, Municipalities, Health centers and in public places in which the orientation was given on Child Rights, Child line activities, Child labor, JJ Act and POCSOAct.

## HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

The Higher education assistance programme of Rajagiri outREACH supports the students from underprivileged families who are doing professional education. The major sponsors of the program are Kinder for Kinder, Sri Ramunni Paniker Udbodhan Trust, Rajan and Grace Foundation and Sud Chemie India PVT.LTD. During this period Higher Education scholarship were distributed to students those who are studying for B.Tech, (IT, CSE, EC) BSC Nursing, MBBS, MBA, Polytechnic, B.Ed etc. A total of Rupees 13, 80,000(Thirteen LakhEighty Thousand Rupees) were distributed to 161 students.



## 1) Distribution of Rajan and Grace Foundation Scholarship

Since 2008, Rajan and Grace Foundation(RGF) has supported 210 students. This year RGF scholarship programmewas organized on October 28th and February 24th for 60 students. The programme was held at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery. Dr. Binoy Joseph, Principal, Capt. Varghese Kuruvilla, Smt.Grace Kuruvilla, jointly distributed the Scholarships. Rs. 2.60 lakhs distributed for 60 students.

## 2) Kinder For Kinder Scholarship

Kinder for Kinder ,a project of KELI, Switzerland were distributed Higher education Scholarship to 30students from poor socio economic back ground on January 23<sup>rd</sup> at VOSARD ,Kattappna and February 9<sup>th</sup> at Rajagiri college of Social Sciences. Mr. Jose Payyampillil and Fr. Jose Antony were distributed the scholarship at Kattappana and Sri Sebastian Pulickal, President, KELI, Sri. Jacob Maliackal, Smt.Deepa Scaria, Coordinator were distributed the scholarships to the students. A total of rupees 5 Lakh were distributed to 30 students at the function.

Rs. 4 lakhs were distributed to 48students.

## 4) Sud Chemie Scholarship Programme

As part of the CSR programme of Sud Chemie India Pvt LTD Higher Education Scholarships were distributed to 20 students from kadungalloor Panchayath on January 12 at GHS, Muppathadam. Smt. This Foundation established by Mr. George Varghese and Ms.Sushila Varghese, couple retired from Agricultural Department of Mexico supported by World Bank and spending their retirement life meaningfully in Ernakulam and Bison valley, extends scholarships for students from poor socio economic background since 2002. This initiative got acceptance in addressing the needs of meritorious students with poor socio economic background. During this period a total of Rupees 1, 20,000/ (one LakhTwenty Thousand) were distributed to 3 students.

## **KAVAL PROJECT**

Kaval is the project initiated byWomen and Child Development Department of Kerala for the betterment of the children in conflict with the law. The project was launched in 2017, in Trivandrum, Kozhikode and Palakkad districts, and it has now been expanded to Kannur, Malappuram, Thrissur, Ernakulam, Kottayam, and Pathanamthitta. Kaval is being implemented by the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) of Social Justice Department in association with the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS) Bangalore.

## LAUNCHING OF KAVAL PROJECT

KAVAL project is an innovative program for the children in conflict with the law in the state initiated by Women and Child Development Department, Government of Kerala with NIMHANS Bangalore, in order to provide psychosocial care for the children in conflict with the law. Rajagiri OutREACH has been empanelled as an NGO as per the order no ICPS 3/9665/17 (1) dated 05/10/2017 to implement the project in Ernakulam District. The project was officially inaugurated by Mohammad Y. Safirulla IAS the Honorable District Collector Ernakulam on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2018 at Government Observation Home Kakkanad. There were the esteem presence of the Principal Magistrate, and the DCPO Ernakulam.

#### TRAININGS

The staff training programmes were organized for the development of the staff and for the better and clearer output from the team working for the children in conflict with the law. Mr. Jesbin James and Ms. Roshna Jose were appointed as the Program Coordinator and the Social Worker respectivelyfor the project. The Programme Coordinator and the Social worker were attended the first training at Trivandrum from 6<sup>th</sup> February to 9<sup>th</sup> February 2018.

The Staff of KAVAL Project obtained training in individual counseling, group work, family and community

visit. The activities include Home visit & Psychosocial assessments, Orientation for parents of children in conflict with law through parent management program, individual counseling for children, group work for children in conflict with law, life skills education for children in conflict with law, etc.

NIMHANS organized a 3 days training programme for the staff in the KAVAL project, from 1<sup>st</sup> March to 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2018 at Marian College Kuttikkanam. Session was led by Dr. Kavitha Manoj the Project Coordinator, NIMHANS Bangalore, and staff were equipped with the tips to deal with the children by certain mediums like Chinese clay, emotion cards, family portrait, thematic cards, dolls, and writing.

## WOMEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAMME

RAJAGIRI*out*REACH has been implementing Women Entrepreneurship programmes in various places with the support of corporates like K. Chittilapilly Foundation, K.P.Paul Foundation, KITCO Ltd. and Sud Chemie Ltd. The women are provided with skill training on tailoring, handicrafts making, catering service, book binding, jewellery making, cow/goat rearing, poultry farm, beauty parlour, flour mill, mobile eatery shop, soap making, organic farming etc. Terre Des Home, Denmark also has been given assistance for 2 Women Self Help Groups at Arattupuzha in Alapuzha district and Edavanakkad in Ernakulam district, the

Tsunami affected villages in Kerala. The programme would enable the women to be economically independent and self reliant. The experience in the field of women entrepreneurship projects proves that the programme is the need of the hour in rural areas as well as in urban areas for the development of women and thus to strengthen the family. In addition to the skill training, the women were provided with training on book keeping and accounts, capacity building, public relation, communication skill and team management. Through the training we could motivate them to bring out their inborn skills and use it in a better way to get an earning for their day to day life. Some of them could accommodate other unemployed women into their enterprise. It is worth mentioning that the programmes boost up the self-confidence of the women beneficiaries which enable them to get more acceptances in the family as well as in the community.

#### 1) CSR PROGRAMME OF KITCO LTD. Tribal Women Entrepreneurship Project at Kuttampuzha, Ernakulam District

KITCO Ltd, one of the premier engineering, management consultancy firms in India joined hands with Rajagiri outREACH in women empowerment programme. A tribal women entrepreneurship project has been launched under the CSR initiative by KITCO Ltd. in 3 Tribal Villages at Kuttampuzha Grama Panchayath in

Ernakulam district for Apiculture and Bamboo Handicraft items. 30 tribal women beneficiaries were selected from 3 hamlets for the implementation of the projects. The project visualizes the sustainability of livelihood activities of tribal women in the target area through marketing and value addition of products. Tribal promoters training also included in the project of KITCO. The project launching was held on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 at Kuttampuzha. The beneficiaries were given hamlet based and class room training on reed craft and apiculture by the experts. The beneficiaries appeared for the Artisans Test by the Central Govt. and 29 of them qualified. They attended different melas and 80%



of

their products were sold through these trade fairs. The beneficiaries had the opportunity to interact with the community residing outside of their hamlet by participating in the melas and exhibitions. The programme certainly did act as a platform to bring them to the main stream of the society which was a significant need of a tribal women community. During this period, monthly review meetings and awareness classes, seasonal management work of apiculture were conducted.

Recognizing the efforts of the tribal women from Kuttampuzha,the beneficiaries of KITCO project were awarded artisan certificate on 27<sup>th</sup> October 2017. The 29 tribal women beneficiaries received artisan certificate issued by Ministry of Textiles, Government of India. The certificate was distributed by Mr.Cyriac Davis, Managing Director, KITCO, secretary KuttampuzhaGramaPanchayath and Project Director, RAJAGIRI outREACH.

## Achievements of Kuttampuzha Tribal Projects during the Period:

- Beneficiaries received Artisans Certificate from the Ministry of Textiles, Government of India for reed craft.
- FSSAI certificate registration received from commissionerate of food safety by Govt. of Kerala as per FSS Act, 2006 (Reg. No. 21317192000240).
- > Three SHGs (10 each) registered in Kothamangalam block.
- Processed sale of 1550Kg of honey.
- Quality of honey tested by Health and Family Welfare Department, Commissionerate of food safety, Regional analytical laboratory, Ernakulam.
- As per food safety and standards regulation 2011 sample conforms to the standard prescribed for Honey falling under regulation 2.8.3:1 of food safety and standards regulation 2011.

- > Distributed fund from honey sale to tribal women.
- > Received orders from Kudumbasree for Bamboo pipe and flower vase.
- > Conducted regular training in apiculture and reed craft by experts in the concerned field.
- > Participated in melas.

## 2) CSR programme of SudChemie India (P) Ltd.

During this period second phase of Women Entrepreneurship Programme of Sud Chemie launched on January 12<sup>th</sup> at Muppathadam Higher Secondary School. The beneficiaries were selected from 16<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> ward of Kaduhgalloor Grama Panchayat and seed money cheques were handed over to the beneficiaries. A total of 30 beneficiaries were given with 4,54,500.SudChemi India Pvt Ltd. General manager – Mr. Saji Mathew, President- Mrs. Rathnama Suresh, 18th Ward Panchayat Member- Mr. Titus TJ, SudChemi India Pvt Ltd. HR Manager – Mr. Anand S, RajagirioutREACH Project officer – Ms. Lissy Jacob, and Senior Development Officer - Mr. Renjith K.U were present in the programme.



## 3) CSR PROGRAMME OF K. CHITTILAPPILLY FOUNDATION

It is a new initiative to start the women empowerment programme at Njarackal and Kunnathunadu Grama Panchayath, Ernakulam district by K. Chittilappilly Foundation. 25 beneficiaries from Njarackal Grama Panchayath and 10 beneficiaries from Kunnathunadu Grama Panchayath were selected through house visits and interviews. Rs 7.5 Lakh were distributed to 25 women beneficiaries in Njarackal Grama Panchayath on 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 and Rs 3 Lakh were distributed to 10 women beneficiaries at Kunnathunadu Grama Panchayath on 5<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 to start income generation activities such as catering, snacks making, coaching centre for children, dry fish, tailoring and goat rearing. A total of 10lakh 50 thousand rupees were distributed to 35 women beneficiaries.

## 4) CSR PROGRAMME OF K.P.PAUL FOUNDATION

Official launch of 8th phase of CSR initiatives for women entrepreneurship programme under K. P. Paul Foundation was held on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2017 at Thrissur.35 new beneficiaries were added to the existing beneficiaries and thus project expanded to 197 beneficiaries.Jewellery making, drums making, goat/cow rearing, DTP, snacks making, flour mill, candle making, flower making etc. were the entrepreneurship activities under this project.The team had celebrated Onam and had a Picnic to Snehatheeram.

## 5) TERRE DES HOMME, DENMARK WOMEN SELF HELP GROUP



Two newwomen entrepreneurship projects had been functioning in Arattupuzha in Alappuzha district and Edavanakkad in Ernakulam district, Tsunami affected places, with the support of TDH Denmark. Each group comprises of 5 members. Two new SHGs groups were added to the existing SHGs and thus project expanded to 6 SHGs groups comprising of 31 beneficiaries. The groups are doing dry fish processing, dry prawn, and pickles and sell it into the market and nearby houses.

The  $2^{nd}$  phase of the Women Entrepreneurship Project, supported by T.D.H. Denmark was also launched at Arattupuzha. The programme was held in Government Higher Secondary School, Valiyazheekkal, Arattupuzha on  $10^{th}$  March 2018. Ms. Meena Kuruvilla, Project Director of Rajagiri outREACH gave away the cheques to the groups and motivated them with an enlightened speech. Ms.Lissy Jacob, Co-coordinator of Women Entrepreneurship Programme gave an orientation regarding the policies on activities and fund utilization to the groups. The beneficiaries



are the mothers of the children sponsored by TDH Denmark and the programme aiming the economic empowerment of the sponsored children's family. The groups are doing dry fish business, garment making and sale, coir spinning and grocery sale.

Women's day was celebrated by the beneficiaries of women entrepreneurship programme of Kochouseph Chittilapilly Foundation and Rajagiri outREACH on March 8<sup>th</sup> 2018 at Njarackal Grama Panchayath .The Programme was inaugurated by Njarackal Panchayath President Mrs. Shilda Riberro. Mr. Deepak G - Asst.Manager, Kochouseph chittilapilly foundation and Rajagiri outREACH staff were present at the programme. The beneficiaries invited the senior citizens of their society for celebrating women's day.



## **PROGRAMMES FOR ELDERLY**

#### Geriatric Care

'Day Care Centre for the Elderly' named "Pakalveedu" is one of the major interventions of Rajagiri outREACH. Pakalveedu functioning with the support of various Corporates, LSG's, clubs, organizations etc.

The Day Care Centre for Elderly is a non-institutional scheme namely Pakalveedu for the elderly mainly functioning in Ernakulam District. The emphasis is on non -institutional and Community Based Services (CBS) with the intention of integrating the elderly with the community. The purpose and basic principle of the approach is to help the elderly who experience isolation, negligence and suffer from insecurity, anxiety and depression. The programme supports 200 elderly people through different centers. The activities of the day care includes News Paper reading, Discussion on local reports, Personal Sharing, Feature films shown on elders issues, Games and Yoga, Counseling and Awareness classes on health, relationships etc., Celebration of members Birthdays, Nutritious lunch, Observation of occasions like Elders Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Onam, Christmas are part of programmes /activities organized there. The service of a doctor once a week is provided at certain centers. As part of the awareness programme provided by the Organization to nearby Colleges and Schools on Day care of Elderly, the students of these Institutions started visiting the Organization as a full day programme which includes the distribution of sweets, cultural programmes, games etc. The social workers from Rajagiri outREACH pay visit to pakalveedu on a regular basis to provide support for the functioning.

Our first Senior Citizen Center (Pakalveedu) was established in Kothad village in the year 1997. Pakalveedu later has been established in 11 different villages spread around Kerala, including one at Red Cross Bhavan of the Indian Red Cross Society, Kakkanad. Currently the centers are functioning at Kothad, Kadamakudy, and Binanipuram.

#### Vayovandhanam Programme at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery

In connection with elders' day observation, a senior citizens get together was held on 7<sup>th</sup> October, 2017 at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. 231 senior citizens from various communities attended the programme. It was jointly organized by Rajagiri outREACH, Department of Social Work of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, MAGICS, and AKM Trust Kalamassery. Dr. Binoy Joseph, Principal, RCSS welcomed the gathering and Fr. Jose Alex CMI, Director, RCSS, delivered the presidential address. Prof. K.V Thomas, Member of Parliament, who honored the gathering with his presence, followed with the inaugural address. Mrs. Jessy Peter, Chairperson, Kalamassery Municipality, Mrs. Shiny Antony, Ward Councilor, Dr. Praveen. G. Pai, and Fr. Jalanidhi is an integrated water supply and sanitation project undertaken by government of Kerala, implemented by Kerala Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (K.R.W.S.A) with the financial assistance of World Bank. The project is being implemented in selected Grama Panchayaths (GPs) with



effective community participation. The key stake holders in the project are Grama Panchayath (GP), Beneficiary Group (BG), Supporting Organization(SO) and the KRWSA with a unique cost sharing system. The supporting organization has a vital role in implementation of the project. Rajagiri is empanelled as a supporting organization of Jalanidhi Project. As an empanelled agency Rajagiri,outREACH Kalamassery has implemented Jalanidhi projects in two Grama Panchayaths

Kunnamthanam Grama i.e. Pathanamthitta district and Panchayath in Idukki District. implementation, in these supporting organization is Development and Technical as well as conducting Grama Programs, Water Dayand

Programs, Women Empowerment Programs, GP Level Ground Water Recharging Programs etc.

## Kunnamthanam Grama Panchayath,Pathanamthitta District

Kunnamthanam Grama Panchayath in Pathanamthitta district, Mallappally block, having an area of 17.57 km2 with a population of 18489.Rajagiri Outreach the Supporting Organization implemented the project through 29 small Water Supply Schemesand 2 dropped schemes.Through 27 commissioned schemes, it was started supplying drinking water to 1553 families across the GP in the peak summer of 2015, i.e. month of March onwards. All the 27 Water Supply Schemes are functioning properly as directed by the KRWSA, and now 29 schemes are exited from KRWSA(,including 2 dropped schemes) and functioning as independent beneficiary groups.During this financial year, 29 BG'S has been exited from Jalanidhi(KRWSA), 27 schemes now exited from GP, and the final procedure i.e. GP Audit, is under process. It is expected to conclude the project by obtaining the final exit order from the GP secretary on 2018 June itself.

## ✓ Arakkulam Grama Panchayath, Idukki District

ArakkulamGrama Panchayath in Idukki district is 16 kms from Thodupuzha, is enriched with Kanjar River, Moolamattom Hydro Electric Project, Elappally Waterfalls, Triveni Sangam etc. the

Panchayath is also classified as Tribal Panchayath according to Jalanidhi. Rajagiri Outreach, the Supporting Organization has implemented 35 small Water Supply Schemes and providing drinking water to 2202 families across the Panchayath including 670 exclusively ST families. As part of the project, many training programmes, awareness meeting were conducted for the upliftment of ST families. Through outstanding 23 schemes, team had completed civil works in the reporting year making all 35 schemes operationaland started the drinking




water supply.Among the total 35 schemes, 10 schemes have been exited from KRWSA, 12 schemes have done the final audit, expecting to conclude the project on June 2018. Support Organization has now successfully completed 6 milestones and received 6th milestone payment of Rs 12, 65, 000/-.

Aditya –the Solar Shop, Cochin is working as a sales and service outlet for all types of solar equipments since 1999 which is managed by Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery under the sponsorship of Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Govt. of India. Aditya is mainly concentrating on the sale of Non-subsidy items like solar lanterns, Solar Water Heaters, Solar Photo Voltaic Systems etc. The sales turnover in the reporting period from April 2017 to March 2018is Rs 26, 87,823/- and the service turn over from the servicing of various solar products is Rs. 8, 48,730/- Apart from this,Aditya has completed 26KWp Solar off grid systems and 10KWp Solar on grid systems under ANERT scheme in association with M/s KC Kopar

Energy Solutions Pvt. Ltd and received an additional income of Rs. 97,500/-

## **COMMUNITY HEALTH**

## 1) SURAKSHA MIGRANT PROJECT

Rajagiri outREACH is the implementing agency for Suraksha projects functioning at Ernakulam and Perumbavoor sanctioned by Kerala State AIDS Control Society (KSACS) and has been working for migrant laborers since September 2008. Along with HIV/AIDS prevention programme, health camps, health education, high risk group identification, STI screening, counseling, ICTC, mega events, exhibitions, film shows, world AIDS day observation etc. were conducted to prevent problems in health, sanitation and hygiene.

During the rapid assessment, we found that the general migrant population in perumbavoor area is around 50000 to 1, 00,000. This is estimated through a rapid estimate in the area among the local people. Mobility makes the migrants more vulnerable, also lack of sexual awareness and lack of supporting services lead the migrants to infect STI/RTI and HIV/AIDS. The site wise population distribution in Perumbavoor Project area includes PerumbavoorMunicipality (above50,000), Ramamangalam Panchayath(above30,000), Vazhakkulam Panchayath(above 33000), Vengola Panchayath (above 10,000), and Koovappady, Okkal and Kalady Panchayath(35,000). During the reporting period we could identify 17 HIV positive cases and 11 of them registered in the ART.

## **Condom Programming**

As the main objective of TI is condom promotion among migrants, we created 50 outlets in our target area within the accessibility of our population. Outlets include both traditional and nontraditional, wheretraditionalincludes medical shops and nontraditional includes petty shop, theatre, their work place, mobile shop, pan shop etc. In each outlet there will be an in charge like Voluntary peer leader company supervisor shop keepers and so on. ORW provides the condom as per their demand. In the context of fund shortage, TI could conduct sponsored camps, STI clinics and allied services under the sponsorship of various employers, builders and secondary stakeholders. 4680 condoms distributed through the Peer Leaders and through the 50 outlets.

## **Advocacy and Networking**

Advocacy meetings are arranged among the stake holders for the successful running of the project. The meeting includes Panchayath president, Health standing committee chairman, Ward counselors, Saw mill association representatives, contractors and supervisors of companies etc and during the time we had conducted 4 advocacy meetings in our project area

As part of State Literacy Mission Programme among Migrants in Perumbavoor Municipality staff attended two days work shop for preparing hand book. Fifteen migrants from Perumbavoor Municipality were attended state level Youth festival at Kozhikode, Project ORW Ms.Jancy Varghese was appointed as programme assistant of this programme. Conducted Onam Celebration at DIC Palakkattuthazham West Bengal Colony at Perumbavoor and also celebrated among migrant children in association with Aster medicity.Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO) was the chief guest of the programme.

Anti Tobacco Day was observedat Western Ply wood, Vattakkattupady. Exhibition, film show and an awareness session was conducted among them and a pledge has been taken by them against tobacco use.

Corganized Aawaz Insurance Programme in association with Labor Department. Staff got an opportunity to present major issues of migrants in public hearing conducted by Kerala Administrative reformed commission chaired by Ex Chief Minister Shri. V.S Achuthanandan, the Honorable chairman of Kerala Administrative Reform Commission

## 2) ADALATH FOR MIGRANT LABOURS - PARIHARAM -2017

Pariharaam 2017 is an adalath for migrant labours organized by Ernakulam District Administration at perumbavoor on 15<sup>th</sup> October-2017. It was a platform for addressing the problem of migrants and to raise their issues directly to district collector. Hon. DGP Mr. Loknath Behra inaugurated the programme. 1500 migrants attended this programme. Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant project conducted an awareness class about health hygiene, personal hygiene, communicable diseases and HIV AIDS. The project staffs were assisting in medical camps.32 counters were opened in Adalath for taking Aadhar card, PAN card, Bank account and medical relief. 15 students from Rajagiri Valley campus were participated as volunteers. Revenue department, labour department, Medical department and NGOs were associated in Pariharam 2017.

## **3) MEDICAL CAMPS**

## Eye camp at GHSS Edavanakkad on 30th September 2017

Rajagiri Outreach in association with Ahalya Eye hospital Ernakulam conducted a free medical checkup and cataract detection camp at Edavanakkad Government High School on September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The camp was inaugurated by Mr. Ullas, CI of police Njarackal. The meeting was presided over by Jeevan Mithra, Panchayath president, Edavanakkad. Mrs. Linda Sijo, Development Promoter,Rajagiri outREACH felicitated at the meeting.

Other eye camp was conducted at Cooperative bank Hall, Thevakkal with the support of Little Flower Hospital. 135 people attended the Camp

## 4) MEDICAL CAMP BY SURAKSHA MIGRANT PROJECT

Mega medical camp "SEVA SADHY" was conducted for migrant labors in association with District Legal Services Authority at Perumbavoor on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2018. The departments associated with the programe includes Labour department for Awaaz Insurance, Akshaya for taking Adhar & Pan card, Police department, Taluk hospital for Medical camp & Rajagiri out REACH Suraksha Migrant Project for conducting Awareness class ,STI Identification & HIV Testing.

## 5) OBSERVATION OF WORLD AIDS DAY

Congregation events and a medical camp were organized at Karumalloor Grama Panchayath, and Madrassa Hall, Rionpuram by Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project, Kalamassery and Perumbavoor respectively on 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2017. The event at Karumallor was conducted in

association with KSACS and Karumalloor Primary Health Center while the event at Madrassa Hall, Rionpuram was conducted with the support of KSACS, Taluk Hospital and Municipality Perumbavoor.

A medical camp was also organized, at both the centers in which a team of medical professionals had rendered their service at the programme. 230 migrant workers attended the medical camp and ICTC testing was done for 80 High Risk migrants. Out Reach Workers had delivered awareness class about HIV/ AIDS

## 6) HAND WASH DAY CAMPAIGN

Health awareness on Hand Wash Day campaign was conducted on 4<sup>th</sup> August 2017 at Mar Athanasius High School, Kakkanad, in association with M/S.United Way, Chennai.

## **RESEARCH AND CONSULTANCY**

Rajagiri outreach is an empanelled agency for conducting SIAstudies at Ernakulam, Idukki and Thrissur District Level as well as Kerala state wide.As part of SIA study, Rajagiri outREACH had submitted reports to the appropriate Government. Draft report of all the SIA studies were submitted to the District Administration and the Requiring Body. Public hearing was also conducted in each study after intimating the project affected families, concerned officials and LSG members. The final reports are also submitted to the concerned District Collector and other officials after incorporating the comments received from the affected families and the authorities.

Kuttampuzha and Neriamangalam Grama Panchayaths). During this period Rajagiri outREACH completed the study and report submitted to Sarva Shiksha Abhayan Govt. of Kerala.

The major objective of the study was to find out the factors contributing to increased rate of drop out among tribal students. The



study also attempts to analyses the present scenario in educational attainment emphasizing on dropout phenomena and employment attainment of the educated youth, health aspects and also the push and pull factors for the aforesaid factors at the tribal settlements at Edamalakudy, Kuttampuzha and Neriamangalam Grama Panchayaths.

## RAJAGIRI FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE (RFCC)

## Introduction

Rajagiri Family Counselling Centre was established in October 1999 as live lab of Rajagiri College of Social Science. There is also a Service Providing Centre established as per the provisions of Domestic Violence act 2005 for providing legal counselling for victims of Domestic Violence. The fund for Counselling Centre given by Central Social Welfare Board, New Delhi and SPC is funded by State Social welfare Board. The main objective of the centre is to strengthen the social fabric of the locality by preventing families from breaking up and promoting harmony in the family. The centre provides counselling services in the areas of family and marital maladjustment, Scholastic Backwardness, loneliness, depression and anxiety, geriatric counselling, grief and loss counselling and crisis interventions. Also provide referral and rehabilitative services.

Currently the Centre employs two Personnel as Counsellors. There is also a legal counsellor for providing legal Counselling in domestic Violence cases. The area of operation for the centre span across the Ernakulam district

During 2017-18 year FCC deal 172 cases. Most of the cases referred by Kalamassery and Aluva police station, Magistrate Court Kalamaserry, Other referral areas are deferent ICDS, Kudumbasri, Snehitha gender Help Centre, Bhoomika, different schools and colleges. Counseling Centre could light a lamp of hope in 61 cases. Follow ups continuing through phone. In these cases legal counselling given to 63 cases. DIR filed in 9 cases. Among these 6 cases filed from the centre through the legal counsellor. 2 women got shelter in short stay home. 9 cases referred to police assistance. 3 cases referred to child guidance centre and around 8 cases got assistance from psychiatrist. 18 cases referred to court for further steps.

#### Sub Committee Meeting.

The family counselling centre has a effective subcommittee of social activist, social workers, representatives of local administrative, police and other voluntary organization for achieving the objectives of the scheme and give guidance to the centre for its effective implementation. The sub committee meets quarterly to evaluate the funtining and strengthening the activists of centre. The meeting were held on 25-4-2017, 27-7-2017, 27-2-2018.

#### Awareness classes

The Centre provided 15 awareness classes among various sections of society including Kudumbasri Members, ICDS, panchayath and municipality members, disabled persons and children. Senior citizens day, Domestic Violence day, Disabled day, women's Day were celebrated at various places by the centre.

#### FCC as Live Lab for Social Work Students

The students of social work get an opportunity to gain experience in the counselling activities of the centre. They also get an idea regarding the steps in counselling and Counselling skills. They associate with Centre for activities like Public awareness camps, classes for children etc.

The family counselling centre provide Preventive, Curative and rehabilitative services in community to strengthen individuals and families.

Coordinated effort of both the organizations have helped in initiating various activities in the city from the beginning of this project, like providing services to the children in need of care and protection, coordinating with Government Departments, networking with the members of the allied system, organizing various programs, etc. CHILDLINE India Foundation is a Nodal organization providing the necessary support for the smooth functioning of the various activities in the country. This is the report of the activities conducted by Childline Kochi across the district during 2017-2018.

## Activity Report – April 2017- March 2018

## April 2017-

#### 1. POCSO awareness poster release at district level-

CHILDLINE in Collaboration with City and Rural Police, developed POCSO IEC materials for displaying in all the police stations, govt. schools, offices and various departments of the district. The first copy of the awareness material was released by S. Sreejith, Inspector General of Police, Ernakulam Range in the last financial year. Later in this financial year, the IEC material was displayed to 24 police stations in Rural and City area and various Panchayat offices. This activity helped to make childline services popular in the district level and also raise awareness about POCSO act among the public.



#### Ushas (Summer Camp for Children)-

Mamalakandam is a small village/ Hamlet in Kothamangalam Block in Ernakulam District of Kerala State. It comes under Kuttampuzha pachayath. It belongs to central Kerala division, where CHILDLINE had organized 2 days of Summer camp named as Ushas for children, which was held on 27th and 28th April 2017 at Govt. High School, Mamalakandam. The financial support for the camp was given by UST Global Info Park, Kakkanad. The programme was formally inaugurated by Shri. Biju Kumar, Sub- inspector of Police, Kuttanpuzha and the chief guest for the progamme was Mrs. Vijayama Gopi, President, Kuttanpuzha Panchayath and other dignitaries on the stage were Panchayath Ward member, Head Master of the School and CHILDLINE Director. 52 children from the Mamalakandam village took part in the camp. During the 2 days of summer camp, different activities and games were arranged for the children. Also different personality and life success stories were introduced to them. Children were asked to form multiple groups for different group activities such as poster making and street play based on various child issues in the society and displayed some short films related to child rights and also awareness on childline and child rights to those children and their parents. Children had got various opportunities to express their talents, skills etc. during the programme. CHILDLINE had made visits to those children's homes at the end of the camp. Children were given some study materials and other gifts with the support of UST Global Info Park, Kakkanad.



## 2. Operation Mushkan III-

It is a campaign to protect children from exploitations such as beggary, forced labour, child trafficking etc. It is a joint operation of Police department, Railway Police Force, CHILDLINE and DCPU to safeguard children from exploitation. This campaign was held for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time in the district in promoting awareness in running trains, railway premises regarding child rights and child issues. There was one group formed for this campaign among Police department, CHILDLINE, DCPU and Railway Police Force. As part of this activity, a plan of action was prepared to cover the district in building awareness in public places, orphanages, child care institutions and bus stands. CHILDLINE, with the support of selected group of persons from various departments, organized a drive in the running rains from Ernakulam Railway Station towards Alappuzha, Kottayam and Thrissur in creating awareness to public regarding exploitation of child rights on 15<sup>th</sup> July 2017. This campaign was officially inaugurated by Mr. Harikrishnan, Station Director, Ernakulam Division and felicitated by Mr. Gireesh, CI, RPF and Mrs. Zaina K.P, DCPO. There were representations of both Rural and City Anti Human Trafficking department, Railway Protection Force, Ernakulam District Child Protection Unit and social work students from various colleges within the district.

#### 3. Child Rights Awareness for Children

CL, with the support from Social work trainees from the Rajagiri College of Social sciences, had arranged a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights at Kalamassery on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2018 from 10.30 am to 1 pm. There were around 40 students from the community. The awareness class was handled by CL team member and she also addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, use of drugs and alcohols. During the session, short films were displayed on the screen related to child issues and about how to report such issues to the authority. CL had arranged ice breaking session and games for the students. During the awareness class, CL released CHILDLINE awareness posters to the group..

**4.** One day training programme on Child & Adolescent Labour (prohibition & regulation) act 1986-amendment 2016 and the rules 2017 for officials working for children-

CHILDLINE had conducted a one day training programme on CHILD & ADOLESCENT LABOUR (PROHIBITION & REGULATION) ACT 1986-AMENDMENT 2016 AND THE RULES 2017 on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2017 from 10.30 am to 4.30 pm at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery. The dignitaries who were there for the inauguration were Mr. T.R Rajesh, Asst. Commissioner, DCRB Kochi City; Mr. Muhammed Siyad, District Labour Officer, Ernakulam (Dist.); Mrs. Zaina K.B, District Child Protection Officer, Ernakulam; Binoy Joseph, Ph.D, principal, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences; Fr.Tomy, Director, CHILDINE Kochi- Collaborative Organization; Mr. Jithin Xavier, Nodal coordinator and Mr. Nirish Antony, Centre Coordinator.

The program was scheduled into two sessions, in which Session I- Genesis of Child Labour legislations & features of Child & Adolescent (Prohibition & Regulation) Act 1986 & Amendment 2016; Session II- Overcoming practical hindrances to Child Labour prohibition and regulation and understanding model rules 2017 handled by Shri. P.J. Joy, Rtd- Additional Labour Commissioner, Ernakulam. He addressed that even

though child labour act came into power, there is no complete prohibition on Child labour in the country. According to studies conducted regarding Child Labours, the states like Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Bihar are having more number of issues regarding Child labour while states like Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Tamil Nadu and Kerala have less number. Usually in many cases, the children take up jobs after dropping schools, to supplement family income or to carry out traditional jobs or due to poverty. In Kerala scenario, migrants are found of doing child labour and not the children from Kerala.

The Child Labour Prohibition and Regulation Act 1986 includes 4 divisions of vulnerable children such as working children, children need of care and protection, children in conflict with law and exploited children. Labour Act specifies a person who is below 14 years of age is considered as child & the Act says that the child can help the family in case of Family Enterprises. If anyone violates the law, he or she can be sentenced to three months to one year of imprisonment and fine of 10,000 rupees to 20,000 rupees to be paid as punishment. Any one working in Police department, CHILDLINE and Labour department can file a case when found of Child labours in the city.

He gave a clear cut picture on difference in the cases of JJ Act & this act in general. He mentioned about the different ways in which the act is applicable. He quoted some instances to explain the scenario which is existing in reality. The factory inspector has the responsibility to file case if a child is found working in factories (Hazardous situation). Only the government doctor who is not below the position of Asst. surgeon, can give certification about the age of the child. The identity of the child should never be disclosed in any circumstance, if violated Rs.25000 would be fined. The members who participated in the programme were 21 Child Welfare Police Officers from Kochi city and 5 representatives from SJPU (both Rural and City Police, DCRB) and 2 Social Workers from DCPU, 12 CHILDLINE team members & 22 social work trainees from different colleges.



## September 2017-

5. "Kottukarkkoru Kalipattam" (An Anganwadi Support Programme)

CHILDLINE had named a program as "Koottukarkkoru Kalippattam" which aims at helping the anganwadi kids with necessary toys/ playing materials in mobilizing some usable (even new) toys from the community and looking forward to distribute those useful toys among the children in the Anganwadi across the district. As part of first initiative of "Koottukarkkoru Kalippattam" programme, CHILDLINE had collected usable play material and toys from various educational institutions of the district. CL, with the support from Edathala Grama Panchayat and Edathala Residence Association, arranged a programme at Colonypaddi on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2017. The programme was officially inaugurated by Shri. Abdul Kareem, Ward Member, Edathala Grama Panchayat.

CL had conducted a session for parents and adolescents on Importance of 'Parenting and Child Rights and Child Issues' in the district. The session was handled by CHILDLINE Centre Coordinator and Team member. There were about 18 parents, 39 adolescents and children. At the end of the programme, CHILDLINE had distributed some usable (even new) toys to the Anganwadi, Mrs. Letha, Anganwadi Teacher and children received those play materials and expressed their thanks from the bottom of their hearts.



#### 6. Capacity Building Programme on Person With Disability for CHILDLINE Team Members

One day capacity building programme for CHILDLINE team members was held on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2017 at Social Service Ernakulam. Topic for the session was Person with disability (Various disabilities and their Provisions). The Capacity building programme was inaugurated by Fr. Paul, Director, Welfare Service Ernakulam and Felicitated by Mr. Mathew, Programme Director, Social Service Ernakulam and Mr. Jithin Xavier, City Coordinator, CHILDLINE Mrs. Celin, Programme Manager, Social Service Ernakulam was handling the session on Persons with Disabilities for half day. She also handled various lawas, polices and provisions for Persons with Disabilities and different disabilities and difficulties in handling with those persons. The main purpose of this capacity Building programe was to give more information regarding this topic and importance to notice while handling with issues of person with disabilities.



#### October 2017-

7. Kottukarkkoru Kalipattam" (An Anganwadi Support Programme)

CHILDLINE had named a program as "Koottukarkkoru Kalippattam" which aims at helping the anganwadi kids with necessary toys/ playing materials in mobilizing some usable (even new) toys from the community and looking forward to distribute those useful toys among the children in the Anganwadi across the district.

As part of CHILDLINE initiatives, CHILDLINE had arranged "Koottukarkkoru Kalippattam" programme at Ashabhavan Buds School, Kombanad on 5<sup>th</sup> October 2017 with the support of the Kombanad Panchayath. CL team members had organized a session for parents on PWD act and different schemes for the welfare of persons with disabilities in the country and also handled different games for specially abled children in the school. CL had gifted them some new play materials and toys for specially abled children as part of the programme.

The programme was inaugurated by Shri. M.A. Shaji, Panchayat President and felicitated by Mrs. Preethi Biju, Vice President, Shri. Sudheesh and Shri. Sabu K. Varghese, Ward Members, Kombanad Grama Panchayath and Mr. Jithin Xavier, City Coordinator, CHILDLINE. There were 23 parents and 37 differently abled children. At the end of the programme, Cl Centre Coordinator had delivered vote of thanks to the Panchayath members and teachers of Buds school for their support and cooperation.



#### FIFA participation and CHILDLINE 1098 volunteer group formation

As part of community level initiative, CHILDLINE Kochi formed a CHILDLINE 1098 Volunteer group with members of 13 children from Udaya Colony, near South KSRTC bus stand. The main purpose of this initiative was to easily address the issues faced by children and also reach childline services to every nook and corner of the society and to ensure their rights are not violated and also being protected with the help from similar volunteer groups in the society. CHILDLINE hopes to form similar volunteer groups in every society and strengthen the society to work for better nation. CHILDLINE 1098 Volunteer group was officially formed on Wednesday, 18<sup>th</sup> October 2017 at childline office and Fr. Tomy V.J., Director, Collaborative Organization handed over the volunteership t-shirts to the 13 children in the group and pledged together to work for protection of child rights in the city.

Moreover, in order to encourage children to be physically active and healthy with the broader picture in mind to reduce non communicable diseases among children and also for their inner development, CHILDLINE Kochi had taken Childline volunteers for FIFA under 17 World Cup India, Pre-quarter match between Brazil and Honduras at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Kochi.

FIFA U-17 World Cup was such a prestigious event that Kochi had witnessed and also planned about representing children under seventeen years of age which is under the purview of 'child definition' by CHILDLINE. In order to make the children happy, CHILDLINE Kochi had taken 13 of CL volunteers for a Metro ride from Kaloor to Maharaja's Stadium. It was their first metro ride for majority of the children and they were all overjoyed.

A group of 29 students along with 2 Associate Professors from Colorado State University, USA had visited CHILDLINE Nodal organization in search of knowing about Child related programmes and services within the Country. CHILDLINE SE DOSTI campaign involves various activities and programmes addressing child rights in the city. The main purpose of the campaign is to generate a millions ' Dosts'' ( friends) for CHILDLINE and acquaint people with Child Rights and protection'. Likewise, this year CHILDLINE Kochi celebrated children's week from 4<sup>th</sup> November 2017 onwards and initiated various activities throughout the month in the city with the only purpose of reaching out CHILDLINE service to the vulnerable children and initiate action towards change.

As part of Children's week observation, CHILDLINE Kochi organized the first programme that was Interschool Poster Making Competition under the Ernakulam Educational District on 4th of November 2017 at Children's park, Ernakulam. The programme was officially inaugurated by Fr. Tomy VJ, Director, CHILDLINE Collaborative Organization by painting a poster followed by one representative each from student participants and parents.





The topic for the Interschool Poster Making Competition was based on United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child 1989 and the entry for the competition was free for student studying in Lower Primary, upper primary and high school level.

There were 51 student participants representing 32 schools from Ernakulam Educational District for the Poster Making Competition. Students attractively prepared their posters addressing their rights and also the roles of parents, teachers and govt. in wellbeing of children. Children were accompanied by their parents and school authorities for attending the competition. As part of Children's day celebration, CHILDLINE had arranged Palm Print Campaign for the protection of Child rights for which all children had jointed the campaign. #### 11. Capacity building programme for childline staffs

A one day capacity building programme for CHILDLINE team members was held on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2017 at Njarakkal, Govt. Malstya fed. Topic for the session was on "Practice Based Research and Research Based Practice". Practice-based Research is a form of research that aims to advance knowledge partly by means of practice. The type of research is an original investigation undertaken in order to gain knowledge and understanding. Evidence-based practice is a process in which the practitioner combines well-researched interventions with clinical experience and ethics, client preferences and culture to guide and inform the delivery of treatments and services.

The programme was officially inaugurated by Fr. Tomy V.J, Director, Collaborative Organization. The sessions were handled by Dr. Mary Venus Joseph, Director, Nodal Organization. Sessions were for the capacity building programme, firstly Practice Based Research & Research based practice-Research Process in a nutshell and secondly to identify the areas for further research from practice. She had much experience in the field of social work research which was really conducive for the team members to imbibe more about theory part and practicality. After the session which dealt with the theory part, team members had experience sharing session from the part of childline. Each one pointed out the difficulty of handling child substance abuse and also the absence of de- addiction centers for children in the city, from which childline team had finally selected a topic for a research – "Substance Abuse among School Children within the District". Research findings and recommendations will be disseminated among the district administration and officials working for children in the district to take final step to eradicate substance abuses among school children. The main purpose of this capacity Building Programme was to update the knowledge level of team members in research and make them more conscious and realize the need of doing research in this area. The directors from both the organizations; 2 coordinators; 8 team members, 2 Childline volunteers and M. Phil Research

#### 12. Mass awareness at Puthuvype Beach tourism fest

The origin is traced to Portuguese New Year revelry here during the colonial days. The highlight of the carnival is the massive procession on the New Year's Day. There are the sounds of Panchavadyam and music throughout the city. Embellished elephants lead the procession. Not just that, the entire Fort Kochi is decked in white festooned like a bride.

There are many art forms along the carnival route which starts from the Veli Ground and concludes at the Parade Ground. Musicians, folk dancers and various artists gather here from across the country for the music, dance concerts and plays. Various contests such as cycling, swimming, tug of war, etc are also conducted during the days of the carnival. Cochin Carnival is a visual delight. This time CHILDLINE had participated in the carnival celebration with visibility vehicle. Childline team had decorated a vehicle with childline information for the public which was formally inaugurated by Shri K. Sunumon, Sub Inspector of Police, Cheranalloor. As part of Standard Operation procedure with ministry of railways, Child help desks are sectioned in 4 railway station in kerala as first phase that Ernakulam South railway station is one among them. Non-Governmental organizations working for children in the district were invited for the meeting regarding the implementing this child help desk project. There were 20 participants from 13 reputed organization for the meeting which was held on 17<sup>th</sup> January 2018 at Civil Station, Kakkanad and senior programme coordinator presented the

project and among the 13 organization, 5 organization agreed to look forward implementing this project. Later childline had visited the organization and prepared the report and sent to Ministry for proceedings.



#### 17. Tribal Camp 2018

CHILDLINE with the support of UNI-Y, Ernakulam university students wing of YMCA conducted a Tribal camp at Pongan Chuvadu, Edamalayar on 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2018. A group of 29 persons consisting of 4 CHILDLINE staffs, 22 Student members and 3 staffs from YMCA had been to this most memorable trekking camp. The main purpose of the camp was to create awareness among tribes about childline and its services through 1098 toll free number. The Edamalayar dam and the catchment area are in the forest and to get a clear view we have to take permission and go inside the forest. The dam is constructed across Edamalayar (river between mountains) a tributary of Periyar and is a multipurpose dam. The water is used both for irrigation and hydroelectric power generation. After covering Bhoothankettu dam we have to travel about 11 kms through forest and small tribal settlements and the journey is just awesome. Our stay is arranged at the community hall and anganavadi at ponganchuvadu.



There are 104 families live in the tribal village belonging to Kuttanpuzha Panchayath. With the support of students visited village homes and made mass awareness and distributed childline calendar and notices to them. School drops is as usual for them, they enjoy doing wild agriculture in the forest so that they have not gone over qualified up to 10 std. especially for males. CHILDLINE had explained about the importance of education and hygiene to them. In the evening of the first day that we stayed, we had arranged awareness session for the villages regarding child rights and also alcoholism which is most commonly issue among the villagers. We had arranged a film show to generate awareness followed by camp fire.



#### 18. Awareness classes at district level

a) CL with the support from SOS Village, Choody, had arranged a workshop on CHILDLINE services and child rights at Aluva on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2018 from 2.30 to 4.30 pm. There were around 25 women from SOS community Women Group from the locality. Mrs. Daisy, Programme Coordinator, SOS Village had given the introduction to the class

The session on CHILDLINE and Child rights was handled by CL City Coordinator and also addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, drugs and alcohols. CL City Coordinator shared various life incidents reported against the child rights. During the session there were some short films displayed on the screen related to child issues and how it has to be reported to the authority too. CL City Coordinator had also shared various child rights and also child rights protecting authorities in the city for the best of their knowledge. The main purpose of this awareness class is to educate parents to know more about the present problems faced by children in the locality and also proper parenting is required for the protection of children from abuses and report to CHILDLINE when a child is found of distress.



b) CL with the support from Social work Trainees from the Rajagiri college of Social sciences had arranged a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights at Standard Pottery Work high School, Companypadi, Aluva on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2018 from 2.30 to 4pm.

There were around 30 students from school and 2 teachers for the session. The awareness class was handled by CL team member and she also addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, drugs and alcohols. During the session there were some short films displayed on the screen related to child issues and how it has to be reported to the authority.

Social work Student had given the introduction to the class and Principal had felicitated the CL team member during the program. The main purpose of this awareness class is to release CHILDLINE Calendar 2018 and awareness posters to the school. CL team Member had handed over those materials to Principal and released the calendar and posters in the school before students and teachers. They pledged to report to CHILDLINE or relevant authorities regarding any children in need of care and protection in the school and also the community. Finally Team member thanked by all the trainees and the children.



c) CL with the support from Social work Trainees from the Rajagiri college of Social sciences had arranged a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights at Hidayathul Islam High School on 19<sup>th</sup> January 2018 from 2.30 to 4pm.

There were around 85 students from High school level and 5 teachers for the session. The awareness class was handled by CL team member and she also addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, drugs and alcohols. During the session there were some short films displayed on the screen related to child issues and how it has to be reported to the authority.

Social work Student had given the introduction to the class and Mr. Majeeth, Head master, had felicitated the CL team member during the program. The main purpose of this awareness class is to release CHILDLINE Calendar 2018 and awareness posters to the school. CL team Member had handed over those materials to Head Master and released the calendar and posters in the school before students and teachers. They pledged to report to CHILDLINE or relevant authorities regarding any children in need of care and protection in the school and also the community.



#### d) Awareness Class at Kizhmadu Govt. UP school

CL with the support from Social work Trainees from the Rajagiri college of Social sciences had arranged a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights at Kizhmadu UP school on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2018 from 10 to 12.30pm. There were around 55 students from school and 3 teachers for the session. During the awareness class, CL addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, drugs and alcohols. The main purpose of this awareness class is to release CHILDLINE Calendar 2018 and awareness posters to the school. CL coordinator handed over those materials to Principal and released the calendar and posters in the school before students and teachers. They pledged to report to CHILDLINE or relevant authorities regarding any children in need of care and protection in the school and also the community.



#### e) Awareness Class at Chirakkom UP School, Varapuzha

CL with the support from Social work Trainees from the Rajagiri college of Social sciences had arranged a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights at Chirakkom UP School, Varapuzha on 09<sup>th</sup> February 2018 from 10.00 to 12.30pm.

There were around 60 students and 4 teachers for the session. The awareness class was handled by CL Coordinator and also addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, drugs and alcohols. During the session there were some short films displayed on the screen related to child issues and how it has to be reported to the authority.

Social work Student had given the introduction to the class and Head master had felicitated the CL Coordinator during the program. The main purpose of this awareness class is to release CHILDLINE Calendar 2018 and awareness posters to the school. CL Coordinator had handed over those materials to Head Master and released the calendar and posters in the school before students and teachers. They pledged to report to CHILDLINE or relevant authorities regarding any children in need of care and protection in the school and also the community.



#### f) Awareness class at FMCT School, Kaduhalloor

CL with the support from Social work Trainees from the Rajagiri college of Social sciences had arranged a session on CHILDLINE services and child rights at FMCT School, Kaduhalloor on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2018 from 2 to 4pm. There were around 64 students from school and 3 teachers for the session. During the awareness class, CL addressed various issues faced by children nowadays in the community like child labour, child abuse, drugs and ALCOHOLS. The main purpose of this awareness class is to release CHILDLINE Calendar 2018 and awareness posters to the school. CL coordinator handed over those materials to Principal and released the calendar and posters in the school before students and teachers. They pledged to report to CHILDLINE or relevant authorities regarding any children in need of care and protection in the school and also the community.



#### February 2018

#### 19. Anti- Child Labour Campaign- Sop to shop awareness

#### a) Mass awareness at Nelikuzhi, Perumbavoor

Childline has received large number of public concerns, through the Child Helpline Number 1098, on the increased incidence of child labour in the district even though the employment of children in certain prohibited employments have been prohibited by The Child and Adolescent (prohibition and Regulation) act 1986. Child labour is a serious issue, we should not have a blind eye on this occurrence rather we must act on it to eradicate from the society and save the lives of children. Therefore childline with the support from District labour Dept. planned to create awareness among public. Childline staffs had done shop to shop awareness on child labour act at Nelikuzhi, generated awareness on the act aroung 250 shops (including plywood and wood shops) on 8<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> February 2018. During the awareness programme, childline had explained about the regulations and prohibition of child and adolescent act and also requested the shop owners to stick the campaign poster on their shop as they are supporting this campaign not to appoint any children below 14 years for labour activities.



#### b) Mass Awareness at Ernakulam City

Childline with the support of volunteers could handle shop to shop awareness programme at Kochi city for 5 days, as part of making Kochi city as child labour free city by the year 2019, This is the movement of District Administration, Childline and labour Dept. the programme was held at Ernakulam central on 8<sup>th</sup>, followed by differen areas in the city like at Kadavanthara is on 9<sup>th</sup>, Panampilly Nagar is on 10<sup>th</sup>, Thevara is on 12<sup>th</sup> and Pallimukku is on 14<sup>th</sup> .programme reach upto 430 shops in those areas and also generated awareness on child and adolescent labour act and childline. Shop owners were requested to stick the campaign poster on their shop as they are supporting this campaign not to appoint any children below 14 years for labour activities



#### 20. Joint Campaign to Eradicate Child Beggary and child labour in Malayattoor

Childline has received large number of public concerns, through the Child Helpline Number 1098, on the increased incidence of child beggary and adult beggary around the pilgrim region in Malayatoor last year, so that we had organized special drive with the support of Police Dept. and DCPU Ernakulam in order to eradicate child beggary and also child labour. It was effective in a way that we could reduce the presence of adult and child beggars and eliminate child labour thoroughly last year. This time with the support of DCPU and Police Dept. a special force of 12 team members was formed to eradicate child beggary and child labour for one month at Malayattoor Pilgrim Centre. As part of special drive, we had organized observance of child labour and child beggary at the Pilgrim Centre on 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> March 2018 and visited all the shops in the pilgrim center and created awareness regarding the child beggary and child labour as social issue. The programme was officially inaugurated by Sub- Inspector of Police, Kalady Police station and felicitation by Mr. Ashraf and Mr. Baby, police officer, SJPU, Ernakulam Rural Police and Miss. Shiny, Social Worker, DCPU, Aluva. The programme reached upto 55 shops in the pilgrim center during the first day. Childline visibility poster against child beggary and child labour were displayed in various places for awareness creation of anti-child labour and beggary prone area.

Childline had organized shop to shop awareness in Malayattoor as part of anti-child beggary and child labour campaign for the 2nd day that was on 16th March 2018. Programme reached upto 83 shops in the area and also generated awareness on child and adolescent labour act and childline. Shop owners were requested to stick the campaign poster on their shops in order to show their support for this campaign and not to appoint any children below 14 years of age for labour activities. It was assigned as their responsibility to report to police or childline, if any child was found begging for ensuring the wellbeing of the child. Childline displayed awareness poster/ banners in nearby areas to create awareness for the public.

As part of this campaign, childline had gone for follow up of this special drive, which was held on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2018 with the support of police department. Childline could find no child beggary and child labour cases from the Malayattoor Pilgrim Center, which clearly shows the impact of the campaign. But Childline had received some information during the campaign that a child was engaged in child labour in household. Childline with the support of Labour Dept. and police had taken necessary action against it and the child was rescued from the child rights violations.



### 21. Capacity building programme for staff on legal support for Protection of Children from Sexual Offences cases

As part of Childline capacity building programme for staffs, Childline had arranged a staff strengthening programme on consultation of POCSO cases and legal procedures on child related cases. The capacity building programme was held on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. Adv. Sandhya Rajan was the resource person who had handled a session of 2 hours on 'Legal Procedures in Connection with Child Related Cases'. 2<sup>nd</sup> session was on 'Consultation on POCSO Cases' for capacity building of Childline team members which was handled by the Centre Coordinator.

The Chair read out the extracts from the UGC Handbook- Saksham (250 pages) on the Measures for Ensuring the Safety of Women and Programmes for Gender Sensitization on Campuses

The Task Force set up by UGC was chaired by *Meenakashi Gopinath*, Principal, Lady Shri Ram College, New Delhi to Review the Measures for Ensuring the Safety of Women on Campuses and Programmes for Gender Sensitization.

The Task Force had engaged in a broad process of consultation discussion and dialogue with policy makers, senior education administration, faculty, staff and students in Open Forums. It has also drawn on feedback on questionnaires sent out from the UGC as a basis for its recommendation.

The Open Forums allowed for a range of voices to be brought on board from the Higher Education space that is becoming increasingly heterogeneous. The Task Force has been mindful of the 'normative' and educative role that colleges and Universities need to play to transform consciousness (without relying excessively or exclusively on 'punitive' processes) to combat gender based discrimination on campuses.

As required by the TOR laid down to the Task Force by the UGC, this Report concluded with a number of strong recommendations for further action.

Setting up a Gender Sensitization Unit within the UGC. This will act as a nodal division to give effect to the policy of zero tolerance of gender based violence on campuses of colleges and Universities.
 The Problem of Protectionism: Campus safety policies should not result in securitization, such as over monitoring or policing or curtailing the freedom of movement, specially for women.

3. **Gender Sensitization:** ALL members of higher educational institutions must undergo processes of gender sensitization, whether students, faculty, administration or support staff. All students must undergo some course or workshop during their period of study. Promotions for staff and faculty should be contingent on participation in gender sensitization programmes.

4. **Sexual Harassment:** All HEIs must formulate guidelines for dealing with sexual harassment in their respective institutions, whether they be autonomous, affiliating, co-educational or women's colleges. The proposed UGC unit on gender sensitization will provide a template to help institutions in this regard and allay fears of non-compliance.HEIs must become sensitized to those whose social or structural location renders them especially vulnerable to sexual harassment, whether among students or staff.

5. **Preparation of a UGC Booklet:** A handbook on sexual harassment and gender sensitization to be prepared for all faculties.

6. Preparation of Courses and Workshop Modules: A model Gender sensitization course has been prepared and a series of workshops on gender, masculinity, sexual harassment, rights and the law have

been suggested. All Refresher courses must have a gender component including issues relating to sexual harassment.

7. University Services and Infrastructure: Counselling services must be professional and provided on a full time basis. The provision of sufficient lighting in and around campuses, reliable public transport, toilet facilities and health (including sexual health) are necessary requirements for women's security and freedom from harassment. Hostel accommodation must be enhanced for women students. A requisite number of female security personnel are required and all security staff must be gender sensitized.

#### 8. Women's Studies Centres/ Women's Development Cells

Women's studies centres in universities and women's development cells in colleges must be strengthened and provided the means to function autonomously. At the same time they should be enabled to work together with gender sensitization cells and committees on campuses on educational and preventive work.

#### 9. Recommended Projects/ Research

Collation of existing materials and mapping exercises can be undertaken including prioritizing research proposals concerning sexual harassment and violence in universities and colleges.

10. **Regulatory Aspects:** The NAAC in its assessment and accreditation procedures must build in an essential gender audit component as part of the evaluation process. Promotions of faculty and staff to be contingent upon participation in gender sensitization programmes.

**Annual Report of the ICC**- Every educational institution must mandatorily submit to the UGC an Annual Report in compliance with Sections 20 and 22 of the Act. This report must contain, at the minimum, the following information:

- a. Number of complaints of sexual harassment received in the preceding year
- b. Nature of the act of sexual harassment (physical, verbal, through electronic communication, etc.)
- c. Position on the hierarchy of the aggrieved woman vis-a-vis the respondent
- d. Number of cases in which the aggrieved woman was SC/ST/OBC/minority.
- e. Number of complaints disposed during that year
- f. Number of complaints disposed within the required time frame.
- g. Number of cases in which conciliation was sought, and an agreement reached.
- h. Nature of other relief sought.
- i. Number of cases where the accusation was upheld.
- j. Nature of penalty imposed
- k. Time gap between the submission of the Complaints Committee report and disciplinary action.
- 1. Number of cases involving repeat offences.

m. Number of cases where penalty was imposed for attempting to harass or intimidate the aggrieved woman/ witnesses.

n. Number of complaints proved to be false/malicious

o. Number of trainings/awareness campaigns/workshops against sexual harassment carried out

within the organization.

p. Any method used to educate employees about sexual harassment, the Act and the Rules.

- q. Number of complaints where conciliation was successfully carried out
- r. Nature of action taken by the employer/district officer.

s. Number of cases where appeals were filed, as well as number of cases where appeals were upheld.

Such compliance could be tied to the pre-requisites for allocation of grants from the UGC.

**2.** The University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal **of** sexual harassment **of women** employees and students in higher educational institutions) Regulations, 2015 was presented followed by detailed discussion

## 3. Following are the measures to be undertaken by the College Management

a) Publicly notify the provisions against sexual harassment and ensure their wide dissemination.

b) Publicly commit itself to a zero tolerance policy towards Sexual harassment.

c) The college to provide a safe working environment at the campus which shall include safety from all the persons coming into contact at the campus;

d) Ensure prohibition of retaliation or adverse action against a covered individual because the employee or student is engaged in protected activity

e )Protect the safety of the complainant by not divulging the person's identity, and provide the mandatory relief by way of sanctioned leave or relaxation of attendance requirement or transfer to another department or supervisor as required during the pendency of the complaint, or also provide for the transfer of the offender;

(f) Ensure that victims or witnesses are not victimised or discriminated against while dealing with complaints of sexual harassment; and

Orientation to be given to all the members of the Internal Committee

h)Any sexual harassment has to be treated as a misconduct under the service rules and initiate action for such misconduct;

Provide all necessary facilities to the ICC to conduct the inquiry expeditiously and with required privacy

4.Following are the responsibilities of the ICC

a) Provide assistance to an employee or a student if chooses to file a complaint with

the police;

(b) Provide mechanisms of dispute redressal and dialogue to anticipate and address issues through a fair conciliation without undermining complainant's rights, and minimize the need for purely punitive approaches that lead to further resentment, alienation or violence;

(c) Ensure prohibition of retaliation or adverse action against a covered individual because the employee or the student is engaged in protected activity.

d) The ICC shall comply with the procedure prescribed in the Regulations and the

Act for making a complaint and inquiring into the complaint in a time bound manner.

e) The annual reports has to be timely submitted by the Internal Committee by the end of every academic year to the College Management and the District Officer.

f) Any complaints of sexual harassment of girls and women may be addressed in writing to the

Chairperson of the Committee. All complaints received from time to time will be considered by the Committee without delay

The IC committee reviewed whether any complaints have been received from any student or staff of any department in both the campuses and found that no such complaints were received.

IV. Adequate lighting facility within the Hill campus has to be ascertained as girl students are seen within the campus even after 7.00 p.m

Report of the sessions First session held on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2018 at Alex Hall at 3.00 pm

#### **Participants**:

**Faculty members** from Social work, Computer Science, library & Information Science, Behavioral science, Commerce & Languages.

As part of the IQAC, an Orientation on Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions was organized on women's Day. The session was handled by Dr. Mary Venus Joseph, Chairperson of the Internal Complaints Committee of Rajagiri College. A presentation was made on the University Grants Commission Regulations, 2015 (Prevetion, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in Higher Educational Institutions).She made it clear that the regulations covers men, women & transgender. There were a total of 39 teaching staff members from various departments attended the above orientation programme.



An introduction was given on our Constitutional doctrine *of equality and personal liberty as* contained in Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Indian Constitution. These articles ensure a person's right to equal protection under the law, to live a life free from discrimination on any ground and to protection of life and personal liberty.

India is a signatory to the UN Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), 1979. The public Interest litigation (PIL) filed by Vishaka and other women groups

against the State of Rajasthan and Union of India before the Supreme Court of India geared up the cause of women thereby ending in a supreme court directive to form Complaints Committee in all the Organisations to protect women from Sexual harassment of women at workplace. This was followed by the passing of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013



Definitions of the terms-sexual harassment, women employees ,students, campus, workplace, third party harassment, etc were detailed out.

Care was taken to explain the varied responsibilities of the Higher Educational Institution, the supportive measures to be adopted, constitution of Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), responsibilities of an ICC, process of making complaint, process of conducting Inquiry, Executive Authority act as per the recommendations of the ICC, conciliation, interim redressal, punishment and compensation, Action against frivolous complaint etc,.

As per the guidelines, any behaviour within the Higher education institutions and its related institutional facilities like libraries, laboratories, lecture halls, residences, halls, toilets, student centres, hostels, dining halls, stadiums, parking areas, parks-like settings, which has explicit or implicit sexual undertones can be considered under sexual harassment.

A student admitted and pursuing a programme of study either through regular mode or distance mode or a candidate who is in the process of taking admission in the campus or a student who is a participant in any of the activities within the campus can be the complainant.

The act covers not only girl students or women staff members, but also is applicable for male staff members and even transgenders. If any complaint occurs it has to be given in writing to the ICC. The inquiry has to be completed within a period of ninety days from the receipt of the complaint.

In case of employee, shall be punished in accordance with the service rules of the HEI. In case of students, withhold privileges of the student such as access to the library, halls of residence, transportation, scholarships, allowances and identity card and restrict entry within the campus

There was an active discussion and clarity was brought by the ICC members Dr.Celine, Dr.Giji George & Dr.Suni Rose on the responsibility of the HEI in the above contexts.

The orientation programme ended at 3.30 p.m.

### • Second session held on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2018 At Alex Hall at 3.30 pm for Non-teaching and live labs staff

As part of the IQAC, an Orientation on Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions was organized on women's Day. Around 15 non-teaching staff members attended the programme.

An introduction was given on our Constitutional doctrine *of equality and personal liberty as* contained in Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Indian Constitution. These articles ensure a person's right to equal protection under the law, to live a life free from discrimination on any ground and to protection of life and personal liberty.

- If the HEI is organising a training programme outside the campus and if any of the female participant is facing any harassment, will it be the responsibility of the college management?
- If any harassment occurs in public transportation while a student or staff is travelling to and from the campus, will the college be responsible for such harassment?

There was an active discussion based on the above queries and clarity was brought by the ICC members Dr.Celine, Dr.Giji George & Dr.Suni Rose on the responsibility of the HEI in the above contexts.

The orientation programme ended at 4.00 p.m.

# "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Rajagiri college of Social Sciences

# (as per the "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (third amendment), Regulations, 2016."

RCSS strictly observes the provisions of the Act of the Central Government and the State Governments considering ragging as a cognizable offence. Thus Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, etc). RCSS takes strict action against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging.

#### Measures taken for prevention of ragging at the institution level

**Student Guidelines of the Campus** incorporates all directions of the Supreme Court and /or the Central or State Governments as applicable, so that the candidates and their parents/ guardians are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging.

The application form for admission/ enrolment has a printed undertaking, both in English/ and in Malayalam to be **filled up and signed by the candidate** to the effect that he/she is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments, and that he/she, if found guilty of the offence of ragging and/or abetting ragging, is liable to be punished appropriately.

The application form also contain printed undertaking, both in English and in Malayalam to be **signed by the parent/ guardian of the applicant** to the effect that he/ she is also aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/ her ward in case the latter is found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging.

The application for admission is accompanied by a document in respect of the **School Leaving Certificate**/ **Character Certificate** which includes a report on the behavioral pattern of the applicant.

A student seeking admission to the hostel have to submit another undertaking along with his/ her application for hostel accommodation.

At the commencement of the academic session the Head of the Institution **convene and address a meeting of various functionaries/agencies,** like Wardens, representatives of students, parents/ guardians, faculty, district administration including police, to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging in the Institution and steps to be taken to identify the offenders and punish them suitably.

To make the community at large and the students in particular aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging, and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging, **big posters are prominently displayed on all Notice Boards of all departments, hostels and other buildings as well as at vulnerable places.** 

The institution has identified, properly illuminated and manned all vulnerable locations.

The institution has tightened security in its premises, especially at the vulnerable places.

#### On admission:-

The institution organizes joint sensitization programmes of 'freshers' and seniors. Freshers are encouraged to report incidents of ragging, either as victims, or even as witnesses.

**The Anti-Ragging Squad** nominated by the Head of the institution consist of members belonging to the various sections of the campus community. The Squad has vigil, oversight and patrolling functions. It is empowered to inspect places of potential ragging and make surprise raids on hostels and other hot spots.

**The Anti-Ragging Committee on campus consist of the** Head of the institution representatives of faculty members, parents, students belonging to the freshers' category as well as seniors and non-teaching staff. It considers the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad and take appropriate decisions, including spelling out suitable punishments to those found guilty.

#### Hostels

Wardens are accessible at all hours and are provided with mobile phones. The security personnel posted in hostels are under the direct control of the Wardens and assessed by them. Access to mobile phones and public phones are unrestricted in hostels and campuses, except in class-rooms, seminar halls, and library etc. where jammers shall be installed to restrict the use of mobile phones.

The College Union under the guidance of a Faculty member actively monitors, promotes and regulates healthy interaction between the freshers and senior students.

Freshers' welcome parties is organized in each department by the senior students and the faculty together soon after admissions, in the presence of the faculty.

The institution enhances the student-faculty interaction by involving the students in all matters of the institution, except those relating to the actual processes of evaluation and of faculty appointments.

Mentoring Programme is encouraged by all the Faculty members

ii. Also a printed undertaking, preferably in English and in the regional language to be signed by the parent/guardian of the applicant to the effect that he/ she is also aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/ her ward in case the latter is found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging.

iii. A student seeking admission to the hostel shall have to submit another undertaking along with his/ her application for hostel accommodation.

iv. Student Guidelines Hand book of the Campus incorporates all guidelines so that the students and their parents/ guardians are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging.

v.The Parents of the Freshers are addressed on the Opening day by the Head of the Institution that Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution and RCSS shall take strict action against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging. Freshers are encouraged to report incidents of ragging, either as victims, or even as witnesses

vi. At the commencement of the academic session the Head of the Institution would convene and address a meeting of various functionaries, like Wardens, representatives of students, faculty, to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging in the Institution and steps to be taken to identify the offenders and punish them suitably.

vii. The whole student Community would be addressed at various intervals to make them aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging, and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging,

viii. Notices are prominently displayed on all Notice Boards of all departments, hostels and other buildings detailing when and to whom he/she has to turn to for help and guidance for various purposes (including Wardens, Head of the institution, members of the anti-ragging committees, relevant district and police authorities), addresses and telephone numbers of such persons/authorities, etc.,

ix. Freshers' welcome parties are organized in each department by the senior students and the faculty together soon after admissions, preferably within the first two weeks of the beginning of the academic session, for proper introduction to one another in the presence of the faculty,

x. The various academic Departments of the College have induction arrangements in place well in advance of the beginning of the academic year with a clear sense of the main aims and objectives of the induction process

xii .The institution has set up appropriate System including the Faculty Batch- in charge, College Union , Warden etc., to actively monitor, promote and regulate healthy interaction between the freshers and senior students.

xiv. The Anti-Ragging Squad:-

The Anti-Ragging Squad shall be nominated by the Head of the institution which consist of members belonging to the various sections of the campus community as follows.

- Wardens of Mens Hostel and Ladies Hostel
- Librarian
- Computer Assistant
- College Canteen Supervisor

The Principal concluded the meeting by affirming that Rajagiri College of Social sciences (RCSS), strictly observes the provisions of the above Regulations Considering ragging as a cognizable offence under the law and prohibiting ragging in all its forms in all institutions. Thus Ragging in all its forms shall be totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, etc).

Currently serving as the Commissioner of the Excise Department, Shri. Rishiraj Singh has till now presented excellent and effective performance into the increasing Drug abuse crimes and cases. Mr. Singh



is very much concerned regarding the increasing drug abuse among school children and he says, "Drug menace among school children in the State are no more a secret. Studies show that almost 70% of the students in the State are vulnerable to narcotic drugs."

Mr. Singh informed the current scenario of increasing drug abuse in Kochi as the second position in the Country after Amritsar in the increasing drug usage among youngsters. Studies reveal that the level of the drugs has gone high, and that the youngsters now depend upon drugs like Cocaine, Heroine, Hashish, LSD and Ganja for a greater effect. The children of the age group 14 - 18 are the most vulnerable group, and fall easily into using these drugs and that almost 70% of the school going children of the age group would have used these drugs at least once in their life time. He urged the students to stay away from these dangerous weapons themselves and also volunteer to spread the message in schools.
