#### 1. Movie Screening and Insightful Talk as part of Cancer Awareness Week

Marking Cancer Awareness Week, Youth Red Cross hosted an insightful talk session and a movie screening on 15th November 2022 from 2 pm to 5 pm. BSW first years and third-year students attended the session. The program was held in the GLC hall and began with a welcome speech by Dr Giji George, YRC Programme Officer. This was followed by a session by Dr Bindiya M. Varghese, Dean, Computer Science Department, RCSS. She talked about how not all cancer patients want to be told that people are praying for them. There are other ways to support cancer patients instead of telling them that prayers are being said especially for them. She also talked about how important it is not to cry or express pity in front of cancer patients as it does nothing to help them or give them hope. She advised treating cancer patients like normal people and respecting their privacy. After the session, a movie, My Sister's Keeper, was screened. Due to limitations of time, the movie couldn't be completed. But the members later discussed what the movie was about and shared their personal experiences and how they dealt with it. There were also students who could relate to the movie.

by an illuminating talk by Mr. Russell, who narrated the history of the dam and the ongoing struggle for getting the government to take action for the safety of the people. The average expectation from the interns perspectives are family savings, plan, decision making style and budgeting.



The groups presented their expenses break down to all their representatives (one each) and they all satisfied the expectations set by the interns even though it was not revealed to participants until after the activity. The session ended up about 4.30 pm with a vote of thanks by both interns.

Ms. Rose Mariya Devassy, councellor, RFCC took a class on Physical and Mental health among adolescence of Varnakoottam at ICDS Vazhakulam, Aluva. The class began with a question what is health and one child replied that it is strength of a



person. Then, Ms. Rose Mariya Devassy explained what is health according to W. H. O's definition that it is the absence of disease and physical, mental and social well-being.

There are micro and macro nutrients which is needed for the human body like plants need sunlight, water, fertilizers, etc. for their growth. Excess or lacking these nutrients cause underweight or over weight. The junk food has major role to affect the health which has no nutrient values. But these foods are part of our lifestyle. This can cause hormonal imbalance. So, people should take protein rich food like fish, meat, etc. but excess can cause cholesterol. The food which includes carbohydrate is the other need of healthy body. This can be wheat, rice, etc. Fruits should be added in the diet. Calcium food is another need which includes egg, milk, curd, etc. There are three food pattern which are breakfast, lunch and dinner and do not skip them. Then the resource person said about importance of vitamin A, vitamin C, vitamin B12, iron, water and exercise. Based on mental health the speaker, addressed the use of smart phones, social media, cyber-crime, screen addiction and controlled use of these areas.

#### 10. Psycho-Social First Aid Camp at Varappuzha

A catastrophic event occurred on February 28, 2023, in Muttinakam, a location in Varapuzha. A domestic building used to store fireworks caught fire, resulting in a terrible incident that resulted in one person's death and four others' hospitalization. Families in the neighborhood witnessed the occurrence up close and personal, traumatizing many of them. Along with the appropriate authorities, the Varapuzha police department collaborated with the Rajagiri Family Counselling Centre Kalamassery in association with Department of Social Work Rajagiri College of Social Sciences to organize a Psycho-Social First Aid Camp.

The day began with a training session led by the college's Vice Principal, Dr Fr. Saju M D. Seventeen MSW students in their final year and two counsellors from the Rajagiri Family Counselling Centre, Mrs. Venus TV and Ms. Rose Mariya Devassy participated in the training. The training began at about 9 a.m. and ran till 10 a.m. The training included how the trainees should communicate and intervene with clients and the precautions they should take when in the area. A brief introduction to the numerous approaches that can help customers relax and overcome their current situation.

Varapuzha s Panchayat and Police departments greeted the counsellors with open arms. An opening ceremony was held on the Muttinakam St. Mary's Church premises. More than thirty mothers and schoolchildren participated. During the opening ceremony, the groups were divided between working with children, adolescents, and the elderly. Adults participated in individual sessions, while children engaged in group activities. Children were encouraged to interact with the counsellors and other youngsters through games. The counsellors provided seniors with individual counselling sessions. Many clients reported how they and their families were touched by the incident they witnessed during the fruitful session. Many of them discussed their past traumas aroused by the explosion.

The volunteers reflected on their experiences during an interactive session with the Inspector of Varapuzha after lunch following the therapy sessions. The counsellors engaged in a productive session.

By 2:00 p.m. in the afternoon, the counsellors, along with police officers and volunteers, conducted house visits in the vicinity of the incident. Visits were made to the homes that sustained significant damage. The local families complied with the counsellors when they inquired about their well-being and offered assistance. More than thirteen residences were visited and examined for any unease experienced by family members. The day on the field concluded at the Varapuzha Police Station, where the counsellors reported the day's events to the SI and pondered the day's events. Suggestions and responses regarding what may be done



to improve the situation in the area and assist individuals in recovering from the shock were presented. The department of police accommodated the entire camp and the volunteers admirably. After the camp in Muttinakam, Varapuzha, the counsellors met with Dr Fr. Saju at the college to discuss the day. He commended all the volunteers for undertaking the responsibilities and achieving the goals. The counsellors discussed their experiences and provided input on what else may be done to assist the residents of Muttinakam.


The primary objective of the anti-drug awareness campaign was to educate participants about the harmful effects of using drugs and other substances like alcohol.




#### 15. Session on Mental Health and Well-Being






#### **18. Pothichoru Distribution**




#### 21. Donation of Blood Stem Cell


